Social media is supposed to connect people. When an online feud erupted between Jenelle Potter and a newly engaged couple, Billie Payne and Billie Jean Hayworth, the young couple ended up dead. Potter, a 30-year-old inhabited a twisted, social media-riddled world of her own creation. There she created a different persona for herself, befriending complete strangers, engaging in many online relationships. She also fueled hate, feuding with many online, the most bitter of these feuds with Billie Payne and Billie Jean Hayworth. Prosecutors say Potter had a crush on Billy Payne and openly agitated against Billy Jean. The couple was found dead; it is a twisted murder plot which lands not only Janelle, but both her parents, behind bars.

AFFLUENZA

It was a story that made national headlines – Ethan Couch, a privileged 16 year old with a troubled past, killed four innocent people while driving drunk. It was not the accident itself that catapulted the case into the national media; rather it was the teen's defense team's argument that Couch suffered from "affluenza". At the sentencing, a prominent psychologist testified that Couch was a product of profoundly dysfunctional parents, who gave their son too much and never taught him the consequences of his actions. The strategy worked, and Couch did not go to jail – sparking a national outrage over privilege and accountability. Matt Gutman reports.

Justin and Marsha Harris of Arkansas seemed like perfect adopters – they were pillars of their community. They fought to adopt three abused sisters. Unfortunately, they could not handle the girls. The Harris' say there was nothing else they could have done and had good intentions when they resorted to "re-homing." In this case, the girls were handed to a man who turned out to be a pedophile.
