Friday, April 5, 2019

The Woman in the Suitcase

On February 21, 2005, Inna Budnytska was found unconscious, naked, beaten and near death, abandoned in an undeveloped Miami cul-de-sac. Budnytska, a guest in a nearby airport hotel, had no memory of her attack and rape. Authorities looked at the hotel's surveillance footage for potential answers, but found puzzling information. In a two-hour documentary, "20/20" reports on the mysterious case and features private investigator Ken Brennan discovering how Budnytska left the hotel and tracking down the man whose DNA matched her attacker.

Friday, April 12, 2019

Your Biggest Fan

"20/20" documentary takes a look at one of the first celebrity stalking cases almost 30 years ago. Rebecca Schaeffer, a promising young actress known for her role on the hit sitcom "My Sister Sam," was preparing to audition for the movie role of a lifetime, a part in "The Godfather Part III," when her longtime stalker, an obsessed fan named Robert John Bardo, trekked across state lines and shot her point blank at the door of her Los Angeles home, killing her. "20/20" looks back at Rebecca's life and budding career, and uncovers the details of Bardo's fixation, exploring the startling truth behind what it's like to have a stalker and how stalking laws have changed in the aftermath of Rebecca's death.

Friday, May 3, 2019

Donor 106

A "20/20" documentary event exclusively documents the emotional journey of Eve Wiley as she searches for her biological father. Eve was conceived with the help of a sperm donor and thought she found her father 14 years ago when she was united with "Donor 106" from the sperm bank's records, and the two formed a loving father-daughter relationship. But recently, as Eve searched DNA websites for siblings, she was shocked to discover that "Donor 106" wasn't her father and instead, her biological father is her mother's former fertility doctor. ABC News consultant CeCe Moore and alongside ABC News investigative correspondent Kyra Phillips report.

Friday, May 10, 2019

Death Row

After claiming to survive the brutal stabbing that left her two sons dead, Dallas housewife Darlie Routier urged police to find the alleged intruder. In a shocking twist, she became the No. 1 suspect and was sentenced to death. Now, nearly 23 years since the case first captured the nation's attention, a two-hour "20/20" documentary explores the details of the crime, trial and Darlie's current defense team's retrial strategy for her as she sits on death row.

Friday, May 17, 2019

Overtured

When 19-year-old college student Mark Fisher was murdered, the public outcry was deafening. John Giuca and his neighbor Antonio Russo were both convicted and sentenced to 25 years to life in prison for Fisher's murder. But, just last year, Giuca's conviction was overturned by an appeals court and, shortly after, Russo confessed to detectives that he shot and killed Fisher, without implicating Giuca. A two-hour "20/20" documentary reports on new details of the case, and features a new interview with anchor Juju Chang.

Friday, May 24, 2019

One Night in Central Park

Trisha Meili was viciously beaten, raped and left to die inside New York City's Central Park. The series of events that followed, triggered a media frenzy and forever changed the lives of all involved, including the five African American and Hispanic teenagers – Raymond Santana, Antron McCray, Yusef Salaam, Kevin Richardson and Corey Wise – who were convicted in the attack due to their confessions, which they said were coerced by police. Their verdicts were later set aside after Matias Reyes confessed to and was convicted in the attack. Now, 30 years after the attack, a two-hour "20/20" documentary re-examines the brutal crime and its aftermath.

Friday, May 31, 2019

The Final Act

In May 2010, authorities found a 23-year-old college student and dancer, Juri "Julie" Kibuishi, dead inside the home of her close friend Sam Herr. Police initially suspected that Sam pulled the trigger, but as they continued to investigate, they quickly unraveled the mystery that Sam's friend and neighbor, Daniel Wozniak, was the true killer. Wozniak confessed to killing Sam. ABC News correspondent Jim Avila reports the new details of the case, including Wozniak's confession, motive and fate as sits on death row.

Friday, June 14, 2019

The Perfect Nanny

When Michele MacNeill's 6-year-old child found her unresponsive in her bathtub, her daughters Alexis Somers and Rachel MacNeill immediately suspected that their father, Martin MacNeill, had killed her. It took authorities five years to charge Martin, a wealthy doctor and father of eight, with Michele's murder. A two-hour "20/20" documentary reports on the twists and turns of the story including what prosecutors say was Martin's plot to kill Michele; his affair with another woman, Gypsy Willis, who moved in as the nanny just weeks after Michele's death.

Friday, June 21, 2019

Diane Downs

A mother's infatuation with a married man who said he had no interest in being a father to anyone's children was the possible motive behind the crimes of Diane Downs, who shot her three young children in her car, seriously injuring two and killing one. Diane captured the nation's attention as the story made headlines and became a bestselling book and a two-part TV series starring Farrah Fawcett, both titled "Small Sacrifices." Now, 36 years after that tragic day, Diane's youngest child, Becky Babcock, who was born while Diane was incarcerated and adopted by another family, speaks to "20/20" in a new interview. Friday, June 28, 2019

A Family Affair

Ronald "Scott" Catt shocked a community when police apprehended him in Texas for doing what most fathers could never imagine – robbing two banks of \$108,000 with his son, Hayden, while his 18-year-old daughter, Abby, drove the getaway car. A two-hour "20/20" documentary unravels the details behind the heists, including the manipulative tactics Scott used to rope Hayden and Abby into the crimes.

Friday, April 26, 2019

Brave New Face

After Cameron "Cam" Underwood tried to commit suicide at age 24 by shooting himself in the face, his life was saved by doctors but he was left disfigured, missing teeth, a chin, cheekbones and a facial structure. Last December, Cam underwent a life-changing face transplant surgery that took over 25 hours to perform. More than two years after that tragic day, "20/20" co-anchor **Amy Robach** sits down with Cam as he shares his new face with the world during his first television interview, and opens up about his surgery and new lease on life. The hour also features Cam's emotional first meeting with Sally Fisher, the mother of his face donor, Will Fisher. (OAD: 11/16/18)

Friday, June 7, 2019

What the Camera Didn't See

Nique Leili was found dead near her suburban home a week after going missing. Her family immediately suspected husband Matt, who filed for divorce within days of her disappearance. He claimed Nique was "crazy" and that she stormed off. Matt, who had installed 21 cameras and other surveillance devices in his home to keep watch on the spouse he did not trust, refused to help police. It took nearly four years for prosecutors to determine there was enough evidence to charge Matt and take the case to trial. Jim Avila reports. (OAD: 2/19/16)

Taken: Elizabeth Thomas

"20/20" features the first on-camera interview with Elizabeth Thomas, who was taken at age 15 by her Tennessee high school teacher Tad Cummins, resulting in panicked friends and family and a 38-day nationwide manhunt. In the interview, Elizabeth opens up to ABC News correspondent Eva Pilgrim, saying Tad had a gun in his car and threatened to harm her and her family unless she left town with him to start a new life. "20/20" features interviews with those closest to Tad and Elizabeth who describe the relationship between the two and what they think led him to take her in March 2017. (OAD: 9/21/18)

Thursday, June 13, 2019

Teen Abduction

In October 2013, 14-year-old Abby Hernandez disappeared on her way home from school without a trace. Nine months later, the New Hampshire teen returned home with a harrowing story of kidnapping, captivity and unspeakable abuse. Mostly silent for nearly five years since she disappeared, Abby tells her story to ABC News Correspondent Deborah Roberts. (OAD: 9/07/18)

The six-part series features gripping first-hand accounts of how these events came together at the same dizzying, chaotic time.

Tuesday, April 23, 2019

1969: Moon Shot

In July 1969 when Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins traveled to the moon and planted the American flag on the lunar surface, it brought the nation and the world together. Though the billions spent on the moon shot were controversial, especially among civil rights leaders, it would make America the world leader in technology. Young astronauts and engineers of today look back at why what they did was so incredible – and what we owe them.

Tuesday, April 30, 2019

1969: Manson Girls

Two young women, while still in their teens, fell in love with Charles Manson and became part of his group of devoted followers. Lynette "Squeaky" Fromme and Dianne Lake describe in revelatory detail the journeys that led each of them to join the so-called "Manson Family." The two former Manson Family members give an inside view of what life with Charles was like; how the counter culture of the '60s that extolled sex, drugs and rock 'n roll shaped their view of the world; and the convictions that moved the group toward a violent drug-fueled murder spree that left seven dead, including actress Sharon Tate, who was more than eight months pregnant at the time and living in the home she shared with her, husband, Roman Polanski.

Tuesday, May 7, 2019

1969: The Girl in the Car

While Apollo 11 astronauts orbited the moon preparing for their historic landing, realizing a goal set by the late President John F. Kennedy, his brother Senator Ted Kennedy drove off a bridge into the waters of Martha's Vineyard. Ted left a young woman, Mary Jo Kopechne, in the submerged car. Kopechne died and her story has largely been lost to history as the media and the public focused on the man whose career was forever damaged by the accident.

Tuesday, May 14, 2019

1969: The FBI and the Panther

In 1969, a running battle between the Department of Justice, the Nixon White House and the Black Power movement reached its height. Patterns of infiltration, wiretapping and violence marked that year. The special episode features powerful firsthand accounts that chronicle how the Black Panther Party established itself and became so influential in 1969; how their agenda evolved; what the Panthers represented to African Americans; and why the White House deemed them a threat.

Tuesday, May 21, 2019

1969: Generation Woodstock

In upstate New York two determined 20-somethings hatched a far-fetched plan to transform a dairy farm into a politically inspired rock festival billed as "3 Days of Peace & Music." Meanwhile, in New York's Greenwich Village, an underground community of LGBTQ+ youth was becoming fed up with social inequality, ready to rise up to challenge harsh laws aimed at their community and break centuries of taboos. Ultimately, both in 1969 changed America and the world forever. "Generation Woodstock" spotlights a trailblazing, freethinking generation that was determined to change America by challenging the status how its spirit lives on in the current youth movements of 2019.

Tuesday, May 28, 2019

1969: Fortunate Sons (Season Finale)

In 1969, as millions of young Americans turned 18 and were eligible for the draft for the first time, parents and their young adult children were at odds over what it meant to be American. Were the hippies waving Viet Cong flags the real patriots, or was it the "silent majority" who voted Richard Nixon into office and supported the war effort? Where did that leave the young men returning from the war – the drafted and the volunteers – who were changed forever by what they had seen? The show explores the growing divide in the nation that year.
