Tuesday, July 10, 2018

Julius Jones: The Crime

In 1999, 19-year-old former high school basketball state champion and star football player Julius Jones was arrested days after a businessman was gunned down by a black man in a white suburb of Oklahoma City. At the time of the murder, Julius was a student at the University of Oklahoma on a partial academic scholarship, attempting to walk on to the basketball team. Nineteen years later, we hear from Tommy Griffin, father of NBA superstar Blake Griffin, who coached Julius; and in interviews from death row, Julius tells his version of events while federal public defenders retrace the steps that led to what they claim is a miscarriage of justice.

Tuesday, July 17, 2018

Julius Jones: The Trial

The State calls their star witness, Christopher Jordan, who testifies he was there when Julius pulled the trigger. Julius and his family watch as his defense takes this last opportunity to save him, but there are missed opportunities to hear Julius' side of the story, and a critical piece of evidence is never shown to the jury. The clock is ticking for Julius, but two witnesses have come forward in his favor since the conviction, and he now holds out hope thanks to his current lawyers.

Tuesday, July 24, 2018

Julius Jones: The Fight

With Julius Jones at the top of the state of Oklahoma's list of impending executions, federal public defenders Amanda Bass and Dale Baich are in a race to win a new trial. When new evidence comes to light, there may be hope for Julius.

Friday, July 6, 2018

- A white woman with an adopted black child is being harassed by an onlooker who doesn't believe she should be the parent to the child of another race. How will bystanders react? (OAD: 9/8/17)
- While at a clothing store, a woman is distracted by her phone as her children act out of control. They run around and destroy merchandise while she shops. How will other shoppers react? (OAD: 6/19/15)
- A teacher is out with her student to supposedly help him study. They start to discuss their relationship and it quickly becomes apparent that there is something more going on between them than just tutoring. Will those who overhear comment on the situation? (OAD: 6/24/16)
- At a toy store, a young boy loves the dolls and selects one for his mother to buy him. But she is determined to have him pick out what she considers a boy's toy. A young girl wants to play with a truck, but her mother does not agree with her choice. What will other shoppers think when they see the mothers disapprove? (OAD: 7/28/17)
- A mom coaches her clearly musically gifted son as he plays the guitar, but nothing the child does is good enough. Will others step in? (OAD: 6/26/15)

Friday, July 13, 2018

- A pregnant teen tells her parents that she no longer wants to put her baby up for adoption and instead wants to raise the child. Her parents disapprove and push for adoption. What will those who overhear say? Joining to watch the action behind the scenes is Catelynn Baltierra, "Teen Mom" star.
- An African-American man, wearing a hooded sweater, is shopping at an upscale clothing store in Manhattan. Although the customer has done nothing wrong, the salesperson becomes uneasy and begins to insinuate that the customer can't afford the clothing being sold. Eventually the salesperson calls the security guard to pat him down before he leaves the store, simply because of his skin color and clothing. How will fellow shoppers react? Will anyone defend the man? (OAD: 5/23/14)

- A mother and daughter are at a clothing store and begin to treat the salesperson poorly. The daughter bosses the salesperson around and tells her that because her parents can afford the entire store, she should receive better treatment. Will fellow shoppers step in?
- A woman is grocery shopping and instead of pulling items from the shelves, she's taking from other shoppers' carts. What will others say?
- A man in a full tuxedo walks into a bar. He starts talking about how he is supposed to get married in a few hours, but he doesn't think he can go through with it. Will other customers support him and give him advice? What happens when the bride walks in?

Friday, July 20, 2018

- A child is at a sports memorabilia store trying to replace an autographed baseball belonging to his dad after he accidentally smudged the signature on the original. He discovers he's a few dollars short. Will fellow shoppers help the child replace the ball or advise him to come clean to his father? Joining to watch the action behind-the-scenes is actor Chauncey Leopardi. This scenario is inspired by "The Sandlot."
- A waiter is struggling to take a customer's order due to his stutter. The customer quickly grows impatient and starts to yell at the waiter. What will fellow diners say? Will anyone defend the waiter? This scenario is inspired by "The King's Speech."
- A mom and daughter are at a boutique clothing store when the mother tries to force her daughter to try on clothing that is too small. The mother explains that it will motivate her daughter to exercise and lose weight for the summer, but the daughter is clearly uncomfortable wearing a dress so tight. Will anyone step in? This scenario is inspired by "Spanglish."
- A mother and her two children walk into a sporting goods store. The mother wants to buy her son soccer cleats. The son says he doesn't want to play soccer, he wants to study ballet. His mother believes that sports are more appropriate for a boy. What will others in the store say to the mother and son? This scenario is inspired by "Billy Elliot."
- A transgender man and his girlfriend are out in public together when others begin to harass them about their relationship. What will bystanders do? This scenario is inspired by "Boys Don't Cry."

Friday, July 27, 2018

- A muscular female trainer is insulted for being too fit by someone watching her workout. What will others who overhear say?
- A man and woman are at a restaurant discussing with their teen child that they are separating after many years of marriage because the father has come out as gay. But their teenager is not happy to hear the news. Will fellow diners step in and say something?
- A diner asks other diners to watch his laptop while he takes a phone call outside a restaurant. They agree and after he steps away, someone tries to take the laptop. What will the diners do? (Rebroadcast. OAD: 7/7/17)
- A mother is out to lunch with her children who are loudly playing on their electronic devices, running around, making a mess with their food and clearly disrupting other diners' meals. The mother does not try to rein in their bad behavior and even steps away to make a few phone calls. Will anyone in the restaurant say something about the behavior?

Friday, August 3, 2018

- Two women are having lunch at a restaurant when one tells the other that she's pregnant. Instead of reacting with joy, the woman tells her friend that she is too old to have a child at 48, causing the pregnant woman to become noticeably upset. What will those who overhear do?
- A Hispanic couple is at a diner when their white waitress arrives to take their order. When they have a hard time speaking English, the waitress grows frustrated and begins to insult them. Will fellow diners step in and say something?
- A waiter at a restaurant is too busy telling jokes and stories to do his job. Will customers speak up or let him continue?
- A minor is in a store and asks other older customers to buy e-cigarettes for him. What will customers do? (OAD: 7/24/15)
- A fake baby is placed in a car with a speaker attached so passersby hear crying coming from the child. When the parents leave the child alone in the hot car to run an errand, how will people react? (OAD: 8/8/14)

Friday, August 10, 2018

- A man wearing a Make America Great Again hat walks into a café and takes a seat. Immediately the café's manager expresses that he does not agree with the politically themed hat. The manager tells him he must remove his hat before he can be served, but the customer defends his right to express himself. The scenario is then reversed when the same man walks into the café wearing an Impeach 45 shirt, and the same manager refuses to serve him, saying he finds the customer's shirt to be disrespectful. What will fellow customers say? Will they defend the customer's right to express himself, whether or not they agree with his politically themed clothing?
- In a diner, two parents start reprimanding their 30-year-old son who is still living at home, telling him he needs to grow up and move out. What will other shoppers say? Inspired by the national headline in which 30-year-old Michael Rotonado was ordered by a judge to move out of his parents' house after they went to court to evict him.
- A group of teens promises to give a homeless man a dollar if he does what they say. The teens humiliate the man by asking him to sing, dance, bark like a dog and more. Will passersby step in and defend the homeless man? (OAD: 8/28/15)
- A customer at a restaurant pays his bill and exits the restaurant, accidentally leaving behind a bank envelope stuffed with money. As the busboy clears the table, a nearby diner grabs the envelope with the cash, overjoyed with her find. The customer who has lost the money returns, visibly upset, looking for his lost envelope. What will other customers do? Will they step in? (OAD: 6/13/14)

Friday, August 17, 2018

- A woman using food stamps at a grocery store is short a few dollars. When others in line offer to help, the cashier tries to prevent them, claiming the customer is already receiving enough help through food stamps. What will the shoppers do?
- A young boy whose parents practice "free range" parenting, a technique which encourages children to function independently with little parental supervision, asks passersby what time it is, explaining he has been left to play on his own for several hours and is meeting his mom later. How will they respond?
- At a restaurant, a man is telling his very traditional Chinese parents that he is gay. His parents make it clear they will not accept their son's sexual orientation, citing their culture and beliefs. What will fellow diners say?
- Fraternity brothers are publicly hazing and humiliating new recruits. How will passersby react? What happens when sorority recruits are being hazed? (OAD: 9/15/17)

Friday, August 24, 2018

- A married gay couple is having lunch with their adopted daughter when another customer begins to criticize the couple for raising a child without a mother. The customer says he believes that the child will have issues because of it. How will customers in Kentucky react when they overhear this? How will customers react in New York City when the same scene is played out?
- A mother is nursing her baby at a restaurant when another diner interrupts her. The diner tells the mother that she is disturbing others in the restaurant and asks her to either leave or stop. How will others react when the critical diner is a man? How will they react if the diner is a woman?
- A woman asks a bartender to charge her cell phone behind the bar. When she walks away, the bartender starts reading her texts and emails. He even tries to share her personal photos with others at the bar. Will anyone at the bar speak up? (OAD: 5/29/15)
- A man asks a shopper standing in line at the supermarket if he can cut in front of him since he is in a rush. The shopper agrees and when the man who cut the line begins to check out, sounds ring out and he is informed that he is the store's 500 millionth customer and just won a two-week trip to Hawaii. How will the shoppers who let the man cut in line react when they realize they were so close to winning the prize? (OAD: 6/6/14)

Friday, August 31, 2018

- An African American woman attempts to use a coupon, but the cashier refuses to accept or scan it, thinking it's fake. After the cashier calls the manager, the manager suggests that the customer leaves before he calls the police. What will other shoppers do?
- A foster mom is at a restaurant and begins to clearly treat her foster son differently than her biological daughter. What will fellow diners say? (OAD: 6/5/15)
- A slender young man introduces his plus-size girlfriend to his parents for the first time. He's head over heels in love with her and thinks she's beautiful, but all his parents see is an overweight woman, and they don't approve. What will those who overhear do? (OAD: 6/23/17)
- Two male college students go to a bar and start to take Adderall and drink alcohol so they can stay up and party all night. They try to convince their female friend to do the same. Will anyone at the bar try to prevent this dangerous behavior? (OAD: 7/29/16)

- A diner asks another customer to watch her laptop as she steps outside to use her phone. While the diner is away, the other customer spills a drink on the laptop, panics, and begs bystanders not to tell. Will they? (OAD: 7/14/17)

Friday, September 7, 2018

- In a diner, a young black football player tells his coach he wants to take a knee during the national anthem at the first game of the season. The coach is very stern and tells the young man that he must stand or he will be kicked off the team. The athlete tries to explain that he isn't disrespecting the flag or the military but instead is voicing his disapproval of police brutality. The scenario is repeated with a white football player. The same scenario was filmed in two different places: Bardstown, Kentucky, and Bronx, New York. How will others react?
- At a nail salon, one customer leaves her new diamond engagement ring in a small tray while she selects her nail polish. When she isn't looking, another customer takes the ring and tries to quickly pay and leave. Will fellow customers step in?
- A teacher is in a store shopping for food for herself and basic school supplies for her large class. Her card is denied at the register and she removes food from her cart instead of school supplies, explaining that the class needs them. What will other shoppers do?
- A teenager is out with his parents who are trying to spend quality time with him. However, the teen is only interested in playing the video game "Fortnite." His parents try to get his attention in many ways, but the teen keeps playing. How will others who overhear this react?

Hot Car

As the country goes through a historic heat wave of 100-degree temperatures, "20/20" presents an hour on one of the most notorious cases of a child left in a hot car. But was it an accident? On June 18, 2014, Leanna Taylor lost her son and life as she knew it. In the aftermath of this tragic incident, investigators learned that her now ex-husband, Justin Ross Harris, was leading a double life and cheating on Leanna. Ross left their 22-month-old son, Cooper Harris, in a hot car resulting in his death and is now serving a life sentence for his murder. Leanna's actions were scrutinized after Cooper's death, causing police to question her possible involvement, but she was never charged. Leanna speaks to "20/20" anchor Amy Robach. (OAD: 2/17/17)

Uncovered Secrets

PANDAS

What if your child suddenly went from being happy one day to angry and violent the next? "20/20" embeds with three families across the country who have watched their children rapidly begin to exhibit a wide range of psychiatric and neurological problems. One thing in common that preceded the symptoms: a brush with strep throat. ABC News' **Juju Chang** follows these families and their children as they undergo treatment and desperately search for answers. "20/20" investigates the controversy behind the disorder, known as PANDAS (Pediatric Autoimmune Neuropsychiatric Disorder Associated with Streptococcal infections), that some doctors are skeptical even exists.

A Mother's Crusade

Kelsie Schelling mysteriously vanished into thin air in Pueblo, Colorado, over three years ago. The family says surveillance video, text messages and other evidence point to her boyfriend's involvement, yet, to their outrage, police have not yet classified the case as a homicide and have not charged him with a crime. But then a series of Facebook messages to Kelsie's mother raise new theories – is the missing girl's disappearance prompting someone to attempt extortion? "20/20" Ryan Smith's reports. Friday, August 10, 2018

What the Camera Didn't See

Nique Leili was found dead near her suburban home a week after going missing. Her family immediately suspected husband Matt, who filed for divorce within days of her disappearance. He claimed Nique was "crazy" and that she stormed off. Matt, who had installed 21 cameras and other surveillance devices in his home to keep watch on the spouse he did not trust, refused to help police. It took nearly four years for prosecutors to determine there was enough evidence to charge Matt and take the case to trial. Jim Avila reports. (OAD: 2/19/16)

Inspirational Journey

"20/20" reports on the inspirational journey of a reality television executive who fought back from death's door and lived to tell the tale. Friday, August 24, 2018

Lost At Sea

A tragic accident or foul play? "20/20" features an interview with Nathan Carman about his rescue from the ill-fated fishing trip that claimed his mother Linda's life. Nathan claims it was an accident that sunk his fishing boat, but authorities are still investigating the circumstances of Linda's disappearance. The hour explores the latest details and previews the lawsuit filed by Nathan's aunts, which claims that he did improper work on the boat which caused it to sink, leading to Linda's death. (OAD: 2/3/17)

Friday, August 31, 2018

Underage Drinking

A night of underage drinking led to two lives forever changed and an Alabama town divided. Eighteen-year-old running back Cameron Harrison was charged with first degree rape of Savannah, a 16-year-old classmate, after a police investigation into a high school party on Oct. 24, 2015. In an interview with ABC News correspondent Ryan Smith, Savannah speaks about the party and what happened afterward. (OAD: 6/2/17)

Friday, September 7, 2018

Teen Abduction

In October 2013, 14-year-old Abby Hernandez disappeared on her way home from school without a trace. Nine months later, the New Hampshire teen returned home with a harrowing story of kidnapping, captivity and unspeakable abuse. Mostly silent for nearly five years since she disappeared, Abby tells her story for the first time to ABC News correspondent Deborah Roberts.

Death of a Cheerleader

"20/20" investigates the tumultuous and allegedly emotionally abusive relationship of 18-year-old Riley Gaul and 16-year-old Emma Walker that turned deadly when she was shot in her sleep. In the interview, Elizabeth opens up to ABC News correspondent Eva Pilgrim, saying Tad had a gun in his car and threatened to harm her and her family unless she left town with him to start a new life. Fentanyl Drug

Music superstar Prince's death shocked the world when he overdosed on counterfeit prescription pills, made of the synthetic opioid fentanyl. Over two years later, deaths from similar black market pills continue to plague the country. She became so furious that she wanted to have the other woman killed, attempting to arrange a murder-for-hire plot. The hitman turned out to be an ATF officer who recorded every minute of the encounter, including her \$2,000 down payment and promise of \$18,000 more. Nine years ago, Dippolito was at the center of one of South Florida's most sensational trials after being recorded while allegedly trying to hire a hitman to kill her husband. The supposed hitman turned out to be an undercover cop, and Dippolito was quickly found guilty by a jury. However, since that initial conviction, Dippolito had a second trial in which the jury was hung and a third trial in which she was convicted and denied her appeal attempt.
