- 1. Drug Use Crank. This drug can destroy lives, ruin families and more. In November WCTE aired a documentary entitled "Crank: Darkness on the Edge of Town." This program was produced over a one year period by an independent producer in cooperation with WCTE.
- 2. Health October is "Breast Cancer Awareness Month." "House Call," airing on Oct. 29 featured physicians and health care givers talking about the detection and treatment of breast cancer. The program "House Call," allows viewers to can call in questions to guest physicians.
- 3. Retirement and Other Issues Don Weinrauch, host of "Business Profiles," recently experienced numerous problems when his elderly mother died. In an effort to prepare his viewers for retirement, health planning, etc., he produced a number of programs dealing with these issues.
