1. Achievements of Local People

- a. Ryan Dalton and the Street Children of Capetown  
A 1999 graduate of Cookeville High School spends years doing social work with street children in South Africa. Aired Sunday, Nov. 17 at 5:30 p.m. and Thursday, Dec. 29 at 8:30 p.m.
- b. Snapshot: Life through the Lens of Jack Stoddart  
Documentary follows the photographer as he shares his work, visits neighbors and relates what drew him from Miami to establish a fine arts gallery in rural Crawford, Tenn. Aired Thursday, Nov. 17 at 5:30 p.m. and Thursday, Dec. 29 at 7:30 p.m.
- c. Hippy Jack and Friends  
Documentary follows photographer Jack Stoddart as he revisits the site of the original commune, talks with his neighbors about their lives on the plateau and their reaction to the hippies. Aired Thursday, Dec. 29 at 8 p.m.

2. Local History – WCTE aired Camp Crossville: Prisoners of War on the Cumberland Plateau. This show, produced with help from retired TTU professor Calvin Dickinson, documented life at Camp Crossville, which housed German prisoners of war from 1942-1945. Gerhard Hennes, a German captain captured in North Africa and A.C. Clark, camp supervisor, were interviewed for the show, which also featured photographs from the camp and video of camp artifacts.
