- Nebraska's Largest Solar Farm Is Up and Running

The largest solar farm in Nebraska has started operations. The Associated Press reports that the 53-acre solar farm in Kearney will generate 5.8 megawatts of renewable energy which is about 5 percent of the city's electrical demand. Other communities pursuing solar projects include Callaway, Gothenburg, Lincoln and South Sioux City. Nebraska Lt. Governor Mike Foley says there's 25 megawatts of solar power capacity planned or in progress statewide.
