-More Nebraska Seniors Completing FAFSA

There's an increase this year of more than 12 percent in the number of Nebraska high school seniors who've completed the forms to determine if they qualify for federal financial aid. -Governor Ricketts Fires Superintendent

Friday, Governor Pete Ricketts fired State Patrol Superintendent Colonel Brad Rice, after receiving preliminary results of an investigation of the patrol. Ricketts declined to disclose the five others placed on paid administrative leave. An incident involving questionable "use of force" last year may be the cause of investigation. The Omaha World Herald reported on inconsistencies in the official Nebraska State Patrol report on a fatal crash in western Nebraska last year which involved a trooper

-Sandhill Cranes Migration Begins

The annual Sandhill Cranes migration is big business for central Nebraska. Each year more than six hundred thousand cranes stop along the Platte River Valley in early spring to rest and refuel before flying north to their breeding ground.

Associate Dean of the College of Business and Technology at the University of Nebraska Kearney, Bree Dority says they conducted a study to show the economic impact related to tourism during the migration each spring in thirteen counties totaled fourteen point three million dollars this year alone.
