- **Housing**
Transitional and permanent housing, revitalization of neighborhoods and affordable housing and at risk homeowners.
- **Child Care**
Quality child care, health, safety and early intervention by companies, non-profits organizations, government agencies, etc.
- **Crime**
Looking at crime and what is being done to prevent, provide safety, and warning the community.
- **Health/ Food & Nutrition**
Provide affordable and accessible physical and mental health management and training. Education on health preventative and making healthier decisions. Coordinate services and allocate resources for necessary food and nutritional education in the community for those in need.
- **Child and Youth Development**
Comprehensive child and youth education, including after school programs, promote reading, mentoring programs, promote healthier choices, and life skills.
- **Neighborhoods Development**
Empowering neighborhoods and residents to strengthening participation in community to improve quality of life in most at-risk communities.

WKRN produces daily newscasts providing local information relevant to Middle Tennessee and Southern Kentucky. The station produces 40 hours each week of local news, weather, traffic and sports. And in addition provides breaking news, special reports, and severe weather coverage as needed. Regularly scheduled newscasts air Monday through Friday, 4:00 a.m. – 7:00 a.m., 4:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m., 5:00 p.m. – 5:30 p.m., 6:00 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. – 10:35 p.m. Saturdays 5:00 a.m. – 7:00 a.m., 8:00 a.m. – 9:00 a.m., 5:00 p.m. – 5:30 p.m., 10:00 p.m. – 10:35 p.m. and Sundays 5:00 a.m. – 7:00 a.m., 9:00 a.m. – 10:00 a.m., 5:00 p.m. – 5:30 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. – 10:35 p.m..

Positively Tennessee - WKRN regularly produces a series which appears in various newscasts each week that highlights products or services provided right here in the Middle Tennessee viewing area.

This Week with Bob Mueller

July – September 2015, Saturday 6:00 – 6:30pm and repeats Sundays, 11:00 – 11:30pm

WKRN produces and aired every Sunday "This Week with Bob Mueller." This half hour program highlights Tennessee's current political scene and major local and national news event and community concerns, with round table discussions and special guests each week. WKRN's Bob Mueller hosts this program.

July 24, 2015

Stuff the Bus Sort-A-Thon – Embassy Suites, Murfreesboro, TN

A group of station employees helped United Way sort and stuff backpacks during a two hour sort-a-thon for the Stuff the Bus program. Through the station's efforts, United Way was able to surpass their goal and stuffed over 2,000 backpacks. The backpacks will be distributed to at-risk kids who lack the schools supplies to succeed in the classroom.

August 24 – September 30, 2015

Food 2 Families School Food Drives

A three month campaign involving Middle Tennessee market wide grade schools, middle schools and high schools – educating children about the importance of sharing and caring for one's neighbor and fighting hunger in the Middle Tennessee. One 30 second PSA produced and over 60 area schools signed up for this year's campaign. 21 grades schools were visited to encourage and educate these young students on the program of hunger in the community. This year's program could raise over 300,000 non-perishable food items for Second Harvest Food Bank.

September 19, 2015

Heart Walk Rutherford County

WKRN was a key supporter of the AHA's Rutherford County Heart Walks in Murfreesboro, TN. Two 15 second PSA promoted the walk and encourage viewers to participate. WKRN talent – Bob Mueller, Joseph Pleasant and Najaha Sherman hosted the Heart Walk event and kick off. Over \$115,000 was raised by walks to help fund research for heart disease.

September 19, 2015

RMHC Hustle for the House 5K & 1 Mile Fun Run

WKRN once again joined forces with Ronald McDonald House Charities of Nashville to support their Second Annual Hustle for the House 5K. Station employees participated in the run and station reporter, Paige Hill, emceed for the kick off and award presentation. Station employees also volunteered at a hydration station for the run, handing out water to the runners and walkers. Over \$48,000 was raised from this event to benefit the House, which helps families of critically ill children staying at area hospitals.
