SECTION A: NEWSCAST OVERVIEW AND QUARTERLY ISSUES ADDRESSED

WRBN Radio produces daily newscasts that air on a regularly scheduled basis. A one-minute news tease is aired at the bottom of the hour Monday through Friday between 6:00am and 9:00am. On WRBN, just after NBC news at the top of the hour between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00am Monday through Friday, WRBN airs a 3-minute live newscast. A two-minute recorded newscast airs at 12:00pm and at 4:00pm, 5:00pm, and 6:00pm Monday through Friday on WRBN. These are two-minutes in length. WRBN reports local and area news events and issues on an ongoing basis.

News Treatments: The nominal length of each of our lead or feature news stories described below is between 30-seconds and one minute. One to two versions of each story aired multiple times during a 12-hour news cycle and are posted online.

Some of the issues covered in these newscasts and programs during the **second** quarter are as follows. Dates indicate local news treatment unless otherwise noted.

1- ELECTIONS

News Treatments: June 4th, April 28th, May 13th

We routinely give updates regarding election dates and turnouts prior to and during early elections and on election day. We also report on all public forums the candidates are involved in.

2- RABUN COUNTY UNEMPLOYMENT

News Treatments: April 28th, June 6, June 23rd

Unemployment in the area has been statistically higher than in the rest of the state and country. The radio station reports every month regarding unemployment from numbers released throughout the month from the Georgia Department of Labor as well as initial claims. Unemployment numbers are much higher here on average than they are in the rest of the state though as of late are on the decline. The numbers remain high, but the area has seen a decrease this quarter.

3-COUNCIL/COMMISSIONER MEETINGS

News Treatments: May 12th, May 19th, April 2nd

The radio station covers almost every local government function, which at times are not always attended in great numbers. The station provides a service by informing the public of what happens in their local government.

4- CLAYTON RABUN COUNTY WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY

News Treatments: April 7th, April 29th, June 6th, June 13th

Almost one quarter of the population receives water or sewer services from the City of Clayton, who purchases the water from the Water and Sewer Authority. Consolidating systems between the city and the authority has been an ongoing emphasis of the authority, as well as a sewer

expansion project on Highway 441 North, and the take over of the Water Treatment Plant.

5- DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY UPDATES

News Treatments: May 5th, June 2nd

The Development Authority of Rabun County (DARC) is a County based government entity that encourages job growth throughout the county. One of the largest projects the group has undertaken was the \$16M Rabun County Business Park. The funding came from tax money; so routine reporting provides the listener with an update on how their funds are being used. During this quarter, the authority focused on problems with bringing new companies to the Business Park.

6- BOARD OF EDUCATION

News Treatments: April 24th, April 28th, May 1st, May 8th, June 25th

Each month we report on the meeting and agenda for the Board of Education and afterwards ongoings of the meeting that are important to the community. The Board of Education is now searching to replace the Superintendent and High School Principal

7- RABUN COUNTY WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY

News Treatments: April 7th, April 29th, June 6th, June 13th

At the end of March 2013, a piece of legislation known as House Bill 496 was passed by the state legislature providing for the creation of the new Rabun County Water and Sewer Authority. The second quarter saw the two Authorities draw closer to becoming one, and many discussions on Dillard water and the North Loop . Both Water and Sewer Authorities meet on the same day.

1-Coffee Talk

Coffee talk is a 5 to 7 minute public service feature airing live on the Sky104 Morning Show weekdays around 8:45am on WRBN-FM. The program deals with any number of topics that affect the citizens of our community. The following shows aired in the **second** quarter of 2013.

a. Rabun County Public Library

Interviewed Rabun County Public Library Director Stephanie Howard about upcoming events taking place at the library, specifically their summer reading program that took place all throughout the second quarter. Hundreds of participants were involved with the program, and Howard provided essential information about some of the events. Aired at 8:45 am on April 8th, May 6th, June 3rd.

b. CMBA

Talked with Cricket Werkheiser and Jenny Wilson with the Clayton Merchants and Business Association about various events taking place in downtown Clayton in the second quarter. Events included the upcoming Independence Day festivities and the Clayton Crawl which, according to the CMBA, are set to bring thousands of people to the city of Clayton. Aired April 3rd, May 2nd, and June 6th.

c. Financial Advisor Ara Joyce

Talked with Ara Joyce, a financial advisor with Edward Jones in Clayton, about several free “Lunch and Learns” being offered to ladies in the area. We also talked about taxes for a few minutes before the deadline to file with the IRS in 2014. The programs covered topics such as saving for retirement, how to invest, and how to know the value of your possession to make sure you are properly insured. Aired April 15th, May 23rd, June 5th.

d. North Georgia Technical College

Every couple of weeks, someone from North Georgia Technical College stops by to talk about what all they have going on. This quarter, guests included their marine engine instructor, Morris Harrison, as well as their Public Relations and Information Director Sandra Maughon. We also spoke with their Lego Camp Instructors, Brad Cagle. The college works with the Rabun County School System and offers education opportunities to many students in the area. Aired April 23rd, May 21st, and June 4th.
