

Re: Public Awareness / Quarterly Issues

In the period from July 1, 2022, through September 30, 2022, radio stations KJTH/KZTH/KXTH/KTHL/KIXO/KTHM/KTHF addressed several issues of public concern. Numerous public service announcements were made on behalf of various local non-profit organizations and churches. In the month of July, we promoted on air and on our social media platforms a contest that we have started to do every summer called "Sounds of Summer." A special sound plays over the air whether that be the sound of a cricket chirping or the waves of the ocean; the listener has to guess the correct sound to win a prize. These prizes aren't just any prize. Prizes included passes to Main Event, Skyzone, Brickopolis, and Escape Room all located in Oklahoma City. However if the listener guessed incorrectly they did get a Nothing Bundt Cake coupon just for playing along. This contest is a huge success for The House every year with participants. Also in the month of July, we hosted a blood drive with the OBI at our Edmond Studios. Those who came out to donate also received Braum's ice cream. We had a total of 10 people eligible to donate blood which saved the lives of three patients. In the month of August, we attended several community Back to School events. Our staff attended Feed the Neighborhood in Enid which was a major event for kids who do not have backpacks or school supplies for the upcoming school year. Over 1,000 students came out to this event; we passed out lanyards, pencils, stickers, cups and rulers; all of which were gone within a couple of hours. We also attended Lights on Stillwater and Spotlight on Shawnee which are two college events that welcome back students to school. We passed out several promotional items and gave out promo cards of our frequency there. Also in August we promoted on air, on our social media platforms, and also attended the OKC Dodgers "Faith and Family Night with artist Tauren Wells." Our booth at the baseball field handed out special fans for people to fan themselves with and also anybody who signed up for our text alerts that night were eligible to win a Tauren Wells signed hat. 107 people participated in that sign up and over 500 people stopped by our booth that night. In the month of September, we kicked off our annual Fall Fundraiser to help raise the funds necessary to meet our 2022 non profit budget. We also partnered with Mardel again for the start of our annual monthly Teacher Appreciation Contest at their stores in Oklahoma City, OK and Wichita, KS. We revamped the contest with new signage in the Mardel stores. This contest asks for participants to enter their favorite teacher in to be eligible to win a \$100 Mardel giftcard, special cookies for their classroom, and a swag bag from The House; only one winner is chosen each month. There were over 75 nominations for this September contest. The House FM also passed along public information on severe and inclement weather. And, on the attached sheets, other issues are listed which were broadcast on the program "Focus on the Family". "Focus on the Family" airs each weekday from 5-5:30am.
