

Re: Public Awareness / Quarterly Issues

In the period from April 1, 2021, through June 30, 2021, radio stations KJTH/KZTH/KXTH/KTHL/KIXO/KTHM/KTHF addressed several issues of public concern. Numerous public service announcements were made on behalf of various local non-profit organizations and churches. In the month of April, concerts were slowly starting to happen again in our listening areas. We promoted and attended a TobyMac Drive In Show, Danny Gokey concert in Oklahoma City, Matthew West concert in Enid, and Winter Jam in Oklahoma City. We got to meet and speak with our listeners again who attended these concerts. Also in the month of April, we promoted on air and on social media special music that was played during Holy Week, which focused on Christ's death on the cross and resurrection. We sent our mascot, Homie, to a local church's Easter egg hunt and gave away tickets to listeners who attended a Phil Wickham Easter concert on social media. During the month of May, we held our annual community OBI Blood Drive which we promoted over the air and on social media. Locations for this event happened at our studio in Ponca City and at Olive Garden's parking lot in Stillwater. There were 36 people who successfully donated blood. Also in May, we held a three-week promotion that asked listeners to go visit our mobile app and use the "Open Mic" feature to say something to a graduating student that would eventually be heard over the air. Graduates from all over Kansas and Oklahoma were given "Shout Outs" on the Morning Show. In the month of June, our "House Call Artist" was Riley Clemmons. Participants were eligible to fill out a form on our website to be entered in to win a zoom call experience with the artist. This promotion lasted a month and had over 100 people enter to win that zoom call with Riley. Only 10 winners were picked. Also in the month of June, we featured the new and improved Music Crew Survey to our listeners. This survey asked participants to pick between several songs and decide which one was their favorite. Participants were entered to win a pair of Apple AirPods along with the song that received the highest rating; which was then called the "Song of the Summer". The House FM also passed along public information on severe and inclement weather. And, on the attached sheets, other issues are listed which were broadcast on the program "Focus on the Family". "Focus on the Family" airs each weekday from 5-5:30am.

He talks about some of the dynamics of addiction in the Christian community, such as shame, accountability and the importance of receiving God's love and forgiveness. He also tackles the tough questions about intervention for family members who refuse to seek help.
