

In the period from April 1, 2020, through June 30, 2020, radio stations KJTH/KZTH/KXTH/KTHL/KIXO/KTHM/KTHF addressed several issues of public concern. Numerous public service announcements were made on behalf of various local non-profit organizations and churches. In the month of April, concerts were canceled due to COVID-19 but that didn't stop the Christian music industry. We participated in an on-air and social media promotion that let listeners get the chance to win a digital download to Rend Collective's new album. Staff and donors were also invited to attend a special online concert featuring Micah Tyler. In May, we celebrated those students who were graduating from elementary school, high school, and college.
