Re: Public Awareness / Quarterly Issues

In the period from October 1, 2022, through December 31, 2022, radio stations KJTH/KZTH/KXTH/KTHL/KIXO/KTHM/KTHF addressed several issues of public concern. Numerous public service announcements were made on behalf of various local non-profit organizations and churches. In the month of October, we had our annual "Minister Appreciation" contest. Listeners had the opportunity to nominate their minister to win a two night stay at a hotel in OKC, two tickets to see Zach Williams in concert, a \$100 Mardel giftcard, and a \$150 Visa giftcard for food and other expenses. This contest was promoted on air and on our social media platforms. We had over 120 minister appreciation submissions. Also in the month of October, our Promotions team attended over seven community fall festival events happening around our listening areas. In November, we partnered with the Salvation Army for our annual "Turkey for T-shirts" event. Staff and Salvation Army reps went to six different cities around Oklahoma and Kansas to gather donated turkeys from participants. Anyone who donated a turkey received a House FM t-shirt and was also registered to win a \$150 visa giftcard. A total of 152 turkeys were donated in person (which is 55 more turkeys than last year!) and 18 turkeys donated online. These turkeys were given to the local Salvation Army to help families in the community who were in need of turkey for the holidays. At the end of November, we hosted a two day fundraiser to help finish out the end of year strong. As part of the fundraiser, we connected with the Regional Food Banks in Oklahoma and Kansas to help feed families that were in need. Thanks to our support of our listeners, over 4,000 meals were donated through the partnership. We also partnered with the "Festival of Angels" organization to pass out candy canes and promo cards to more than 20,000 motorists that came to see the light display at Lake Ponca and L.A. Cann Gardens in Ponca City, Oklahoma. The House FM also passed along public information on severe and inclement weather. And, on the attached sheets, other issues are listed which were broadcast on the program "Focus on the Family". "Focus on the Family" airs each weekday from 5-5:30am.

Date 10/11/2022- 10/12/2022  
Title Finding God on the Streets I-II  
Length 57 minutes  
Description Pastor Dimas Salaberrios shares his remarkable testimony of coming to faith in Jesus Christ after he spiraled out of control as a young drug dealer whose life was consumed by addiction, violence and crime.

Date 10/24/2022  
Title Finding True Healing from Trauma  
Length 25 minutes  
Description Dr. Elizabeth Stevens was a high-achieving psychiatrist in the U.S. Air Force. Her work came to an abrupt halt when she was debilitated by a traumatic brain injury and a series of other traumatic events which caused PTSD. In this conversation, Dr. Stevens offers hope to those who are bound by the pain of trauma and describes how spiritual healing was the turning point in her recovery.

Title Unleashing the Possibilities for Children in Foster Care  
Length 27 minutes  
Description Out of difficult circumstances, he was adopted into a large, loving family and later adopted two children of his own. Now he boldly promotes the adoption option instead of abortion, which the culture too readily encourages. Ryan Bomberger, founder of The Radiance Foundation, reveals important research on abortion, dispels myths about adoption, and explains why more people should explore adoption from foster care. The discussion also promotes ways to support other adoptive families.

Description Brandon and Analyn Miller believe that the focus on fixing your weaknesses is a waste of time. Instead embrace your strengths as a parent, which will energize you and help you find creative ways to overcome weaknesses. They have identified 12 “parenting strengths” such as Trainer, Organizer, Fortitude, Sensitivity, Zest, and more. Brandon and Analyn share how they clashed in their parenting approach until they learned to value their differences and each other’s strengths. The Millers also point out that strengths can be misused and urge parents to embrace Jesus as the source of their power.

He shares powerful stories of Christian dissidents under communism and encourages families to live counterculturally as radical disciples of Jesus Christ.
