Programs and Issues – 2019

The Programs and Issues in this file are “representative” of our news and public affairs efforts – but do not fully demonstrate the breath of our reporting and our commitment to “live” local and relevant radio. Below is a summary of some of our major regularly scheduled broadcast efforts.

Monday-Friday:

Radio VT News provides extended coverage of local, state and regional news:

6:05am – 7:05am – 8:05am – 12:05pm – 4:05pm – 5:05pm

Each Newscasts is 5 to 10-minutes in length and features a variety of reports.

At 7:30AM Mon-Fri – The Morning Briefing: 10-mins of World & National News

The Morning News Service airs from 7-9am – two full hours of news, weather, sports, travel updates, commentary, interviews, plus studio and phone guests. WDEV employs our own forecaster Roger Hill who details the micro-climate of the region while watching major national weather stories and climate change. The MNS is produced by Radio Vermont News with additional world and national updates from CBS Radio News.

Radio Vermont News has developed reporter relations with WCAX-TV Channel 3 News. Monday-Friday reporter Melissa Sheketoff joins the Morning News Service with a “live” interactive update to explore stories in much greater depth than available from wire service reports.

This is our newsmaker public affairs interview program. Rick Cengeri, host a show that provides detailed analysis of the news plus a Vermont perspective on world events. His guests are varied and represent a wide spectrum. During the legislative session, Ric originates his program direct from the Vermont Statehouse in Montpelier (Fridays and during special event days). His program also goes mobile for events such as the Chamber of Commerce Business EXPO, the Tunbridge World’s Fair and other gatherings.

The Midday News Service: Noon-1PM

An hour-long update of the very latest news, business report, sports, weather and a variety of human interest features. This is the most comprehensive lunchtime news hour of any Vermont radio station. With the “Special Assignment” section, Radio VT News often delivers lengthy segments of news conferences or legislative debate. We are committed to providing our listeners with more than a “sound bite” service.

The very latest news developments, sports and weather, perfect for the drive home. Special updated reports on the day’s breaking news stories with Calvin Cutler from WCAX-TV News around 4:05PM and at 5:05PM, VT Digger.org reports – the state’s leading on-line investigative news site.

Re-Broadcast of WCAX-TV News: 11-11:30pm

Since the conversion to all digital over-the-air TV broadcasts, many in our listening area told us that they missed WCAX news – no longer available to them “over the air.”

Through special retransmission agreement with WCAX News, WDEV re-broadcasts the 11pm report as a service to the public. (This is occasionally pre-empted by late-airing sporting events such as when the Red Sox play on the West Coast.)

Saturday Morning:

Similar to weekdays, WDEV is “live and local” with updated news reports including the Morning News Service from 7-8am. This hour also features “For the Birds” a program dedicated to watching and listening to birds; “The Green Mountain Club” report – with opportunities to explore VT outdoors and take advantage of guided and organized hikes around the state.

Sunday Morning:

At 6:00AM, WDEV airs CBS Radio Sunday Morning, and “The Takeout with Majhor Garrett”, a weekly news magazine show. National and International issues are explored in-depth with a variety of reporters and guests.

WDEV airs Red Sox Baseball, Norwich D3 Hockey, NASCAR racing, local stock car racing and high school basketball (boys & girls) regular-season and championship games. WDEV provide “Team Coverage” of every Town Meeting Day (March) plus coverage of Primary and General Election nights.

With COVID cases and hospitalizations rising again, the Vermont National Guard Thursday began rebuilding a surge hospital at the fairgrounds in Essex Junction.

About two-thirds of all in-patient beds and all intensive care beds are now full, but officials want to be ready in case those numbers increase.

The Champlain Valley Expo is again turning into an overflow hospital.

Vermont National Guard Major Matthew Lehman tells Channel 3 when the surge site was taken down this summer due to a decline in coronavirus cases, they packed it up so it could easily be put back together.

The Health Department announced 99 new cases of the Coronavirus on Friday. That case number puts Vermont over the 4,000 case threshold over the entire course of the pandemic.

Vermont has now seen 4,005 total positive cases. There are currently 16 Vermonters in the hospital and two in the ICU.

Vermont also announced 72 new cases on Thursday with three more deaths, bringing the states death total to 67.

Governor Phil Scott addressed that Friday:

The pastor of a church in Irasburg says the state improperly handled an alleged COVID situation in his congregation.

This comes after the Health Department issued a warning to parishioners Friday that a member tested positive for COVID19.

Pastor George Lawson of the New Hope Bible Church posted online about a call Wednesday from an official from the Health Department, who asked him for a list of names of all parishioners who attended church Sunday, November 22nd but Lawson said he did not have one.

Lawson says the parishioner told him later they did not go. Lawson says the person also claims the COVID test actually came back negative.

Lawson says the parishioner took another COVID test this weekend. He says if they or anyone else in the congregation tests positive, he'll close the church for a week while people quarantine.

The church did hold a service on Sunday.

New Text Document

New Year's Eve is the deadline for Vermont to spend all of its \$1.25 billion in Cares Act federal funding, but many state officials and nonprofits say it's not going to provide enough help to everyone who needs it and that Congress must act to pass another stimulus package.

Vermont has spent about two-thirds of its Cares Act funding on housing, business and farm grants, education, COVID testing, broadband, PPE, and many other sectors.

With the year-end deadline to spend it all, some states are calling for an extension or more flexibility.

Vt. Finance Commissioner Adam Greshin tells Channel 3 the Scott administration and the Legislature are planning to spend it all with the expectation that more aid is not on the way.

Greshin says the state is hearing from three key groups that need help -- health care organizations seeking PPE and testing; businesses and advocacy groups looking for funding; and frontline workers asking for more hazard pay.

But without more help from the federal government, some of the programs will expire, including the hotel voucher program for the homeless and grants for renters and landlords.

Here's Erhard Mahnke with the Vermont Affordable Housing Coalition.

Organizations that provide food to Vermonters are also feeling the squeeze. During the pandemic, one in three residents experienced food insecurity. But Hunger Free Vermont's Anore Horton is calling on Vermonters to use the state's existing programs, like 3Squares Vermont, if they need food assistance.

Vermont's tax commissioner is forecasting that education property taxes could rise an average of 9% next year, mostly as a result of the pandemic-induced recession, new pension obligations, and rising school spending.

VTDigger reports that prediction was laid out in the so-called December 1 letter, a document the Department is required to prepare and send to lawmakers by that date each year.

The forecast from the annual projections are not set in stone, but they do set the stage for local budgeting decisions and debates at the Statehouse.

However, state leaders said they do not think a 9% increase would be tenable for Vermonters struggling to recover financially from the pandemic.

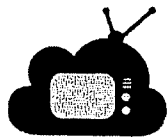

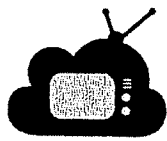

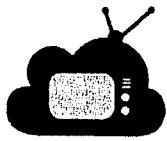

While most Vermont counties are expected to vote for former Vice President Joe Biden on Election Day, GOP officials say Essex County will likely go red again in 2020. Essex was the sole Vermont county that voted for Trump in 2016,

POLL OBSERVERS

Vermont Secretary of State Jim Condos signed a directive that will introduce new requirements for poll observers who want to “challenge” voters on Election Day.

VT Digger reports that under state law, political parties, independent candidates and public committees advocating for or against ballot questions are allowed to send two representatives to Vermont polling places to watch and challenge voters’ rights to cast ballots.

These observers can challenge voters on two grounds: if they suspect a voter is not the person they claim to be, or that they have already voted in a given election. Members of local boards of civil authority then determine whether an individual can vote.

Condos’ directive will require election observers who want to challenge voters to register with town clerks no later than Friday, four days before the election. He said the requirement is aimed at giving local election officials the opportunity to make adjustments to accommodate for poll observers, and maintain a safe, socially-distanced environment.

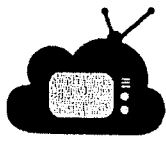

A draft report commissioned by lawmakers recommends consolidating the Vermont State College system while urging the state to spend more money on higher education.

The commission was created to assess the future of the financially struggling system after former chancellor Jeb Spaulding recommended closing Northern Vermont University's campuses in Johnson and Lyndon, as well as Vermont Technical College.

The plan would have left Castleton University to fulfill the system's function.

Community backlash prompted Spaulding to withdraw the proposal and resign.

The Select Committee on the Future of Public Higher Education in Vermont was created by the Legislature's Joint Fiscal Office. Its draft report was made available earlier this week.

VSC spokeswoman Katherine Levasseur said the final report would not be issued until April.

The report notes that Vermont has ranked well behind other states for public investment in higher education for decades, making the VSC one of the least-affordable state college systems for in-state students, all of which is exacerbated by demographic trends increasing competition for students among colleges.

The report claims any real solution will involve more state money, but the report also calls for cost reductions.

The report recommended either combining NVU, Castleton, and Vermont Tech, or combining Castleton and NVU, while leaving VTC as its own entity.

The report estimates that consolidating the three will save \$20 million to \$25 million a year, while leaving VTC separate would save \$14 million a year.

Community College of Vermont remains untouched in both scenarios.

The report notes that CCV is more cost-effective than its counterparts in other states.

Facing a growing budget deficit exacerbated by the pandemic response, The University of Vermont presented a plan to eliminate 12 majors, 11 minors, and four master's degree programs from its College of Arts and Sciences.

According to the document sent to faculty, programs on the chopping block include geology, religion, and some foreign language majors.

William Falls, the dean of the college, says the programs have seen declining student enrollment with each graduating on average fewer than five students per year. The 120 students enrolled in the programs now will be able to finish their degree before the programs are phased out.

He said some staff could be reassigned to other departments, but there's no guarantee.

One program on the chopping block is geology. Professor Paul Bierman tells Channel 3 that losing this program could also mean UVM losing prospective students and money.

Goddard College announced that President Bernard Bull will leave the Plainfield School.

The Times-Argus reports he has accepted the position of president at Concordia University in Nebraska.

Bull joined Goddard in 2018, just as the school learned it had been placed on a two-year probation term by the New England Commission of Higher Education and faced the threat of losing its accreditation.

Under Bull's leadership, Goddard was able to work toward balancing its budget and stabilizing its finances, during a stretch where some other Vermont colleges have closed.

Goddard was removed from the probationary status in October and has been given 10-year accreditation.

Bull said the school went from a projection of over a million dollar projected deficit budget to operating from a balanced budget with growing cash reserves.

Gloria Willingham-Toure' is the Chair of Goddard's Board of Trustees. She says they expect the school to name a new president by June.

UVM administrators are responding to concerns about a proposal to cut more than two dozen programs at the school.

The cuts were recommended because of low enrollment, graduation rates and an increasing deficit within the college of arts and sciences.

Majors, minors and master's programs in geology, religion, classics and foreign languages are on the cut list.

UVM Provost Patricia Prelock tells Channel 3 that many of the classes will still be offered but students would not be able to choose them as a major or minor if the proposal passes.

The Montpelier-based New England Culinary Institute is closing.

In a letter to the community, NECI (necky) said it is discontinuing all credit-bearing courses, immediately commencing a teach-out.

When the current students graduate in the Spring, the school will shut down for good, though leaders haven't specified a date.

The school was founded in 1980. It had more than 800 students enrolled in 1999. This past February, there were just 50 students enrolled at the school.

NECI President Milan Milasinovic pointed the pandemic as "the burden that we could not overcome."

He partially blames the state's requirement to close all retail operations in March for limiting their ability to properly educate culinary students on an "economically viable basis."

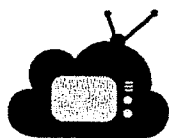

Vermont is now four years into its all-payer health care model, a multibillion-dollar gambit to rein in costs and improve services, but supporters say it's not moving as quickly or as well as hoped.

Vermont is approaching a crossroads in health care reform efforts. At the core of the debate is the question of whether the new all-payer model is actually saving the state money.

In the coming months, state leaders will decide whether to continue the experimental effort administered by OneCare Vermont, a group of hospitals and providers tasked with overseeing reform.

OneCare seeks to lower skyrocketing health care costs by investing in preventative care and paying doctors, home health providers, and others through fixed payments instead of charging for each procedure.

Kevin Mullin, chair of the Green Mountain Care Board, the state regulator charged with ensuring the model is working.

In a recent warning, federal regulators, who are allowing the all-payer experiment, say the state isn't meeting its targets in how many Vermonters are participating in OneCare.

By this point, OneCare was supposed to have 260,000 Vermonters in the program, but there are only about 150,000.

The Green Mountain Care Board unanimously approved OneCare's \$1.4 billion budget Wednesday, but urged the organization to do more to track its success in rolling out Vermont's health care reform efforts.

VTDigger reports that, after rebuking the company for increasing salaries, the board cut administrative and salary costs back to 2019 levels.

Next year's budget is an attempt to address some of the major complaints with the system.

Officials say 2021 will be a decisive year in determining the success of OneCare, which is in its fourth year of a five-year agreement to change the way health care is funded in Vermont.
