The following shows constitute WPTF's regular programming and address the Community Issues above listed.

- 1. The WPTF Morning Show (Monday Friday, 5 a.m. to 9 a.m.)
 This is a locally-produced news program hosted by Chris Edwards and Jon Champion. The show focuses on world, national and local news, plus weather, and traffic and interview segments throughout the show. Tony Riggsbee, and Craig Green anchor the news, and Jon Champion provides traffic reports. Harrison Riddle operates the board and helps to produce the show. The program includes updates from CBS, and CBS Market Watch. There are regular guest appearances by people in the political, tech, aviation, business, legal, financial, entertainment and health care fields.
- 2. The Brian Kilmeade Show (Monday Friday 9 a.m. to 12:00 Noon, 7 p.m. to 10 p.m.) The Brian Kilmeade Show tackles the top stories and news of the day, be they political, financial, sports, entertainment or gossip and brings to WPTF the global resources of FOX News and Fox Radio.

- 3. The Triangle's Noon News (Monday Friday 12:00 Noon to 1:00 p.m.)
- This locally-produced news program is hosted by long-time broadcast veteran Bruce Ferrell. The hourlong show focuses on local, national and international news, weather, and traffic. There are interview segments throughout the show and news updates from CBS. There are regular guest appearances by people in the political, tech, and business, legal, financial, entertainment and health care fields. Segments from the North Carolina News Network are also included in the show.
- 4. The Dana Show (Monday –Friday, 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.) The Dana Show is an award-winning show featuring Dana Loesch.
- 5. The WPTF Afternoon News (Monday Friday, 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.) Hosted by Jeff Hamlin, this program focuses on world, national and local news, plus weather and traffic reports. It includes interviews with local and national guests in the political, legal, financial, entertainment and health care fields.
- 6. The WPTF Evening News (Monday-Friday, 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.) Hosted by Kristine Bellino, Gayle Hurd, and Jeff Hamlin, this fast-paced news program reports the headlines of the day with reporters covering major news stories.
- 7. Fox Across America with Jimmy Failla (Monday Friday 10:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m.) Nationally syndicated talk radio show focused on current events and light topics.
- 8. Red-Eye Radio (Monday Sunday, 1:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m.) Hosts Eric Harley and Gary McNamara engage their millions of listeners and callers with the major issues of the day including current events, legislation, popular culture, family issues, detailed national weather forecasts, safety tips and interviews with trucking industry leaders.
- 9. WPTF News: WPTF broadcasts world, national and local news at the top and bottom of every hour 24 hours a day. Newscasts also include sports and weather. Breaking news is broadcast immediately. Major news events are carried live.
- 10. WPTF Traffic Reports: WPTF broadcasts local traffic weekdays from 5 am to 9 am and 3 pm to 7 pm. Reports are aired at :08, :18, :28, :38, :48 and :58. Each report runs at least a full minute in length and are produced locally within WPTF's studios by the Triangle Traffic Network.
- 11. The Takeout with Major Garret (Saturdays 5:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.): The Takeout is a weekly podcast about politics, policy and pop culture hosted by CBS News Chief White House Correspondent Major Garrett.
- 12. The CBS News Weekend Roundup (Saturdays, 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m.) is a weekly news show that reviews the previous week's news and provides insights on possible future developments.

- 13. The Triangle's Saturday Morning News (Saturdays, 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.) A locally-produced program focuses on world, national and local news, plus weather and interview segments throughout the show. The bulk of this program is news, weather, traffic and other information help listeners get their Saturday started.
- 14. Weekend Gardener (Saturdays, 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.) Hosted by veteran journalist Mike Raley and former NC Attorney General Rufus Edmiston, this is a locally-produced show that has experts answering listener's calls about plants and gardening.
- 15. Asset Protection Today with Bill Alexander (Saturdays, 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 Noon, Sundays 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.) Attorney Bill Alexander addresses the important issues of retirement and estates.
- 16. Here's to Your Health (various hosts) (Third Saturday of every month 6:00pm to 6:30pm) Hosts interview guests focusing on a wide variety of medical topics.
- 17. Making Your Home Great (Saturdays 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.) -Various experts discuss home improvement, decorating, repairs and more.
- 18. Financial Safari (Saturdays 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., Sundays 12 Noon to 1:00 p.m.) The Financial Safari with Peter J. D'Arruda is designed to equip listeners with the tools and knowledge that you need to successfully navigate through today's complex financial jungle. Each week the hosts and guests on the show reveal the latest developments in the financial world to keep you informed of changes that may affect you personally, while sharing some common-sense strategies that will help make the most out of retirement savings.
- 19. Aging Matters (Saturdays, 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.) This award-winning, locally-produced program focuses on care for elderly adults in North Carolina.
- 20. Money Matters (Saturdays and Sundays, 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.)
 Hosts Doug and Linda Lewis, certified financial planners, answer questions about the economy, and personal finance. They deal with issues of 401K and other employer retirement plans, IRAs, Roth IRA's, etc. They discuss the markets, national, regional, and local financial news and the impact a story may have on the economy.
- 21. Carolina Newsmakers (Sundays, 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.)
 A locally produced, public affairs, programming highlighting local and state newsmakers discussing various topics hosted by WPTF owner Don Curtis.
- 22. Sunday Morning Magazine (Sundays, 8:00 a.m. to 8:30 a.m.)
 Hosted by WPTF owner Don Curtis, this locally produced program reviews various stories in the news. Don is joined by Jason Kong and Kristine Bellino who comment on the stories presented.

- 23. Living in the Light with Anne Graham Lotz (Sundays, 8:30 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.)
 Anne Graham Lotz is an American Christian evangelist and the second daughter of evangelist Billy Graham and his wife Ruth Graham. In this weekly 30-minute program, Anne allows listeners to get to know God personally, intimately...as His friend living in the light of His Word.
- 24. Religious Programming: (Sundays, 10 a.m. to 12:00 Noon)
 WPTF broadcasts the Sunday morning worship services of Duke Chapel and Edenton Street United Methodist Church and White Memorial Presbyterian Church on alternate Sundays.

Carolina Newsmakers Sundays, 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. This weekly public affairs program is hosted by WPTF owner, Don Curtis.
