Seg 1 – Mike Buresh gives a Hurricane Ian recap. Gulf coast storm surge was +6' in some places. Corey Simma discusses homeowner's insurance (get the flood insurance early!). If you evacuate, bring insurance documents, or have them available online. Mike Buresh discusses the coastal erosion & repair issues that resulted from Hurricanes Matthew, Irma, Ian, and Nacole. And that impacts roadways, infrastructure, etc. as well. The Army Corps of Engineers has been tasked with beach repair in Vilano Beach.

Seg 2 – Buresh reports on the 5-year anniversary of Hurricane Michael, and recovery is still underway in the Florida panhandle. Trevor Gibbs reports on storm surge impacts on river levels inland, including \$34 million in damages from Irma in St. Johns Co. Reminder: flood waters are NOT clean, don't wade or swim through them.

Seg 3 – Buresh reports on storm names, and which names have been retired. He also reviews how storm damage is sometimes internal, sometimes external, and sometimes absolute. Things can be replaced, though. (Just keep insurance records.)

This Week in the 904

TOPICS: (debut episode) Crime in Jax., 8/26 mass shooting.

Seg 1 - In the debut episode, John Bachman interviews Sheriff TK Waters regarding the 8/26/23 mass shooting at Dollar General in Newtown. They begin with recounting the specific events of the day, then explore the evidence discovery and timeline afterwards.

Seg2 -Sheriff Waters shares his personal experiences with racism, and how racism influences acts of violence and discrimination. There have always been, and will always be, individuals acting on personal feelings toward other races (he calls them “outliers,”), but Sheriff Waters contends they are not representative of the local community in general. However, certain political ideologies and legislative practices, even locally, facilitate racial divides in the community. (He does not elaborate, but feel free to associate ideas as you will – Confederate statues, community funding disparities, gerrymandering, etc.)

Seg 3 – Bishop Rudolph McKissick blames Gov. DeSantis for promoting racial tension (audio clip). Gov. DeSantis called such allegations “nonsense,” (audio clip). Sheriff Waters does not name names among leaders who are contributing to the racial divide; however, he does say that leaders who do not emphasize and work toward unity are not helping to resolve racial tensions. He advocates some services available to provide security, comfort, and assistance to the community.

This Week in the 904

Seg 1 - This week’s episode follows the aftermath of the Dollar General shootings, which left three dead plus the shooter. Bishop Rudolph McKissick Jr., of Bethel Baptist Church, speaks to the community’s union in opposition to racism and hatred. The demonstrations and expressions are not without their own controversy, though, as McKissick and others penned a “cease and desist” letter for Governor Ron DeSantis and the Florida legislature on their “rhetoric of hate,” that McKissick contends emboldens hateful behavior. (Ex: instructional doctrines from this administration against Critical Race Theory instruction, and teaching that slaves were happy and benefitted by learning trade skills.) McKissick criticized the governor for not listening well, and for being punitively retributive. McKissick argues that the rhetoric in use politically motivates and validates hateful behavior against minorities.

DeSantis, of course, denies any responsibility.

Seg 2 – McKissick addresses calling the Governor “demonic,” then offers an absurd “theologian” definition of what that means. (“Any thinking or actions that may occur that would not be in line with the philosophy of the God I serve.”— editor’s note, that’s self-serving...who says DeSantis is accountable to the same god?) McKissick later orients (his) religious perspective in the role of politics, and how party politics fail to serve (his perception of) public interests.

Seg 3 – McKissick addresses the racial divides in current communities, and what does/does not bridge those divides. Emphasis is on racial awareness, and the social discomfort some face in honestly confronting the topic, likewise recognition of love, bigotry, economy, where people see beyond their immediate home, neighborhood, or comfort zone. He charges faith leaders, educators, politicians, business, and community leaders in facilitating dialog and engagement. (The Jacksonville Jewish Community Alliance is actively engaged in a series of community events addressing exactly this.) He also charges that urban and suburban development projects target neighborhoods to achieve an aesthetic driven by commerce, rather than by community improvement (citing examples in Downtown development, but not in local schools?).
