



Quarterly Issues/Program Report (First Quarter)
January 1, 2009 – March 31, 2009

NBC 10 attempts to serve the public interest, convenience and necessity by presenting broadcast material, which addresses significant issues of the people in Greater Philadelphia, South Jersey, Delaware and the Lehigh Valley, which are all communities that are served by NBC 10.

NBC 10 recognizes that it has an ongoing obligation to remain aware of such community issues and to exercise its best judgment as to what broadcast material should be programmed to address those needs and interests.

During this quarter, NBC 10 News presented a number of Live@Issue segments that featured the Mayor of Philadelphia Michael Nutter. In these segments, Mayor Nutter discusses his plans to move the city and its outlining areas into an upward mobile direction. Also, with the upcoming presidential inauguration of Barack Obama, the public affairs program featured segments with local politicians discussing the issues that are most prevalent to Pennsylvania constituents.

Additionally, NBC 10 News presented its ongoing segments within the 5, 6 and 11PM newscasts titled “The Bottom Line,” which features reports on efforts taken to survive in this economic downturn.

In the community issues -- In February 2009, Citizens Bank of Pennsylvania, NBC 10, Greater Philadelphia Cares, The Philadelphia Inquirer, Philadelphia Daily News and Philly.com announced the most recent ‘Champion In Action’ winner – **SquashSmarts** was recognized for its work with Philadelphia’s inner-city public school students, helping them realize their academic, athletic and individual potential through its after-school program that includes an intense curriculum of squash fitness instructions. **Champions in Action** is designed to recognize smaller grass roots and non-profit organizations for their contributions to our community. SquashSmarts was awarded \$25,000 and will receive media coverage, including public service announcements.

March, 26, 2009 – NBC 10 Investigators went undercover to expose people who are illegally giving women but injections.

February 14, 2009 – NBC 10 News reported that the rate of disability among working women in the United States has grown almost twice as fast as the rate among working males during the past decade (over 60 percent and 32 percent, respectively), according to Social Security Administration data. Yet half of women (51 percent) are unprepared to cover their living expenses for three months or more should an accident or injury leave them unable to work, according to the 2009 Worker Disability Planning and Preparedness Study, conducted by the Council for Disability Awareness (CDA).
