					Education” law today. Florida lawmakers passed the law last year banning discussion in grades K through 3. Some sexual health topics can be discussed but only if they’re required by existing state standards.
Education/FL Education Ranking	Channel 3 News – 10pm	May 5th	10:00pm	1:14	For the seventh year in a row, a “US News and World Report” study ranks Florida at number one in the nation overall for education. The ranking is based largely on the state’s public higher education system. It scored above other states on metrics including graduation rates, cost of degrees and student debt. The state’s Pre-K-to12 system ranked number 14 based on high school graduation rates, preschool enrollment rates and results of the national assessment of educational progress.

K through 12 teachers are divided over whether they think being armed would make schools safer. What's their top concern? According to a new survey by the Rand Corporation, it's bullying.

Governor Ron Desantis signed the bill earlier this month. It puts tougher penalties and restrictions on immigration policies. The new law requires employers with 25 or more employees to use e-verify to check the immigration status of employees. It also requires hospitals to collect and submit information on the cost of providing healthcare to illegal immigrants. But many immigrants are worried about how it will impact them and their families.

Often selling unhealthy food choices and it could take years to get another grocery store.

While heat-related illnesses can affect anyone, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says those most susceptible include those 65 and older, anyone with high blood pressure and people who work outside in the heat.

Researchers say habitual napping was linked with larger total brain volume. That in turn is associated with a lower risk of dementia and other diseases. It increases criminal penalties from a misdemeanor to a felony. People could now face prison time if they hurt a K-9. It would be a misdemeanor charge for teasing or harrasing one. The new law also applies to police horses.

Now, the FBI has created a database to help them and local law enforcement track and create a real time picture of these incidents.

Today, critics and protesters of the new law made their voices heard in Florida's Capitol.</p>
