The guidelines given out by the FDA urged companies to provide standardized language on dosages. With such an inconsistency in directions and measuring devices such as spoons or cups, parents can be giving their child too much or too little medication. All of the 148 products that had been tested still print inconsistent measurement instructions.

Robo-signing is when bank employees and affiliates approve legal documents in the foreclosure process without ever verifying the detail of the foreclosures. Bank of America, JP Morgan Chase, and GMAC Mortgage have all acknowledged these problems and have stopped evictions and sales of foreclosed houses in 23 states.
