ROCKY MOUNTAIN REGIONAL JURIED EXHIBITION IS OPEN

Red Lodge, MT – Stop in to see the incredible art selected for the *Rocky Mountain Regional Juried Exhibition (RMRJE)* on view March 1-30, 2024 at the Carbon County Arts Guild & Depot Gallery. The exhibition was open to artists residing in seven western states. From the 196 entries submitted, 69 pieces of art were selected. The juror for the exhibition is Idaho artist Bonnie Zahn-Griffith. A painter and educator, Griffith paints on location throughout the US and teaches workshops on plein air techniques and the art of pastel painting. Griffith's work has been in numerous shows including the 2019 and 2020 *Timeless Legacy – Women Artists of Glacier Park* invitational exhibition featuring work by 25 nationally renowned women artists at the Hockaday Museum of Art in Kalispell, Montana.

Artists selected for the 2024 RMRJE are from Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Utah, and Wyoming. There are a variety of styles ranging from realism to abstract to impressionistic and illustrative. For example, Great Falls artist Kathleen Houseman's painting, *In the Shadows of the Neighborhood*, shows a painterly use of brushwork and a strong use of light. In comparison, Bridger artist Dana Zier portrays the realistic quality of a glass jar with fruit in her still-life painting, *Pear Destiny*.

The *Rocky Mountain Regional Juried Exhibition* also features a variety of mediums. There are paintings in oil, acrylic, watercolor, and pastel as well as work in encaustic, charcoal, graphite, collage, and ink. Sculptures in the exhibition include fused glass work by Lindi O'Brien, pyrography by Michelle Ellen (both women from Montana), as well as bronze work by Wyoming artists JC Dye and Richard Burke, Melissa Getz of Colorado, and Willis Johnson of Red Lodge.

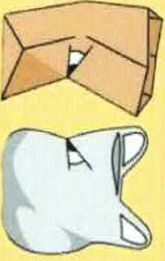

NEIGHBORS HELPING NEIGHBORS

Meet Sharon, Your Fromberg Neighbor

Sharon is a 30 year resident of Fromberg who lives in a home she previously shared with her Mom before her mom's passing about 10 years ago. **Sharon is on a fixed income and started using CART when she could no longer afford a car and insurance.**

"I do not have a car, without CART I would not be able to get out of the house to do the simplest things. CART is a godsend."

Sharon lives in the neighborhood of Fromberg that was hardest hit during the floods along the Clark's Fork River in June 2022. Somehow her house was spared, but most of her neighbors were permanently displaced. Sharon found herself therefore even more isolated after the floods, and less able to secure rides or assistance.

CART TALKING POINTS

- What is CART? CART is a Carbon County-wide public transportation system. We provide rides to people who need them. CART transports your neighbors to everything from doctors' appointments to everyday errands.
- Transportation supports seniors aging in place, reduces isolation, and ensures that everyone has access to the resources needed to be healthy and connected in their community.
- Rides are available to Billings for medical appointments three times a week. **CART is currently the ONLY public transportation service offered within the county.**
- Montana has endured a recent wave of assisted living facility closures, with three facilities closing in the area. CART is an essential service that helps residents age in their local communities. Supporting our aging population is incredibly important.....
 - Median age in Carbon County 50.7yrs
 - Other resort areas:
 - Gallatin County (Bozeman) 33.5yrs
 - Teton County, Wyoming (Jackson Hole) 39.9yrs
 - Flathead County (Whitefish, Kalispell) 42.3yrs
- Without CART, many of our neighbors are unable to meet basic daily needs like the grocery store, pharmacy, doctors' appointments, post office, and social gatherings at the senior center.
- Despite State and Federal funding provided through the Montana Department of Transportation, business and individual donations, Fun Run donations, passengers paying what they can, AND a cost control analysis that resulted in a reduction in force, a funding gap still exists.
