Section I. Issues

The Stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- Water Crisis: Lack of water has been the big issue in Southern Utah, but a new problem arose during this especially wet winter -- flooding. We are still technically in a long-term drought, but now have real flooding fears with a huge, record-setting snowpack in the mountains surrounding our county.
- **Economy:** High unemployment gave way to very low unemployment, but it came at a cost as a lot of young workers are electing to remain out of the workforce with the federal government subsidizing their current lifestyles and the need to gain income taking a backburner. Plus, inflation is at a crippling high.
- **Realty concerns:** House prices went up and are starting to fall now, but the crippling interest rate has made that happen and young families are still unable to afford a home.
- **Community Involvement:** Appearances weekly from the local mayors like Michele Randall, Kress Staheli and Nanette Billings get us updates on the respective cities in our listening area.
- **Complete Streets:** St. George City councilman, Dannielle Larkin, is pushing for St. George to become a 15-minute walking city with "complete streets" that have room for cars, trucks, buses, bicycles, scooters, and pedestrians.

The Andy Griffin Show is broadcast on all our St. George area stations and addresses these issues and many more throughout the year.
