The scams are being distributed mostly through internet ads.</p> <p>Uber has added a new feature that lets customers book COVID-19 vaccination appointments at Walgreens directly from its app. The ride-hailing giant said it's partnered with Walgreens to make it easier for U.S. customers to schedule a vaccine appointment at the pharmacy chain's stores.</p>

Early reports indicated at least 38 people were killed. Videos posted online show thousands of people tightly packed together and trying to flee the chaos at the site. It is the largest event held in the country since the coronavirus pandemic began, with tens of thousands reportedly attending. Lord we pray for the grieving families and we ask for healing for those who were injured.</p> <p>Police believe a gunman killed two sheriffs deputies, his mother and his stepfather at a North Carolina home before killing himself Wednesday. The shooting sparked a lengthy standoff between the gunman and authorities in Boone, North Carolina, that ended late Wednesday night. Lord we pray for your comfort on the families of the two deputies as well as the other victims of this shooting.</p>

Biggar, a sixth grade teacher at Detroit Lakes Middle School, says her students treat Kale Hannahs with kindness and compassion every day.</p> <p>It's a weird age, and I think we sometimes underestimate our own kids, Biggar said in an interview with a local news outlet.</p>

Palestinians poured onto the streets of Gaza soon after the truce began, shouting God is greatest and thanks to God. Both Israel and Hamas have claimed victory in the conflict. Lord we pray that the ceasefire will hold and the differences will be peacefully worked out.</p> <p>Pro-Israel and Pro-Palestinian protesters clashed in New York City on Thursday even after Israel and Hamas militants agreed to a cease-fire. One video shows a device exploding after being thrown at a crowd of people on a midtown Manhattan sidewalk. In a body camera recording that the Gloucester County Sheriff's Office shared on Facebook, Deputy Jon Holt can be heard pulling over in his patrol vehicle and telling dispatch that the car is flipped upside down.</p> <p>The one-minute clip at the scene of the accident then shows Holt running to the vehicle where one child is screaming that his mother is stuck. The deputy helps another smaller child out of the car, and then he can be heard groaning as he lifts the vehicle.</p> <p>The driver was laying underneath the vehicle with her head pinned by the sunroof, the sheriff's office wrote on Facebook. Seeing the trauma her child was witnessing, Deputy J. Holt went into overdrive.</p> <p>Hundreds of people have thanked Holt for his service and have called him a hero on social media. Holt was already honored with local and regional Top Cop Awards in February after he saved two people from a burning house last year.</p> <p>I'm just an average cop and you know, it's what we do. And thinking of doing anything different is you know, out of the question, Holt said.</p> <p>The sheriffs office didnt identify the driver. The deputy said shes doing well.</p>

They have kind of been her protectors. Its a bond that goes all the way back to kindergarten, when Madison was first integrated into regular classrooms – something her parents pushed for so she could receive the best education; possible. Ever since, Jackson and English made it a point to eat lunch or walk with her if they saw that Madison was alone. During field trips, they would stand by her side or even hold her hand.</p> <p>They dont look at her as a kid with Down syndrome, Fabian-Moore said. They just look at her as [a] friend. As a thank you, Madisons dad posted a photo on Twitter of the three of them side by side at their high school graduation.
