The survey shows the cost of the entire meal is up 14 percent over 2020, which is more than twice October's inflation rate.</p> <p>If you think you're getting more credit card offers in the mail, it's not your imagination. The Wall Street Journal reports credit card companies are trying to sign up new customers to make up for a drop in credit card usage. As an incentive, lenders have increased their cash-back offers.</p> <p>The housing market is sinking, not for a lack of buyers but for a lack of homes for sale. Inventory levels have been near record lows for more than a year. Not helping matters, the Commerce Department reports new home construction dropped nearly four percent in October.</p>

That word came from Christian Aid Ministries which the missionaries worked for. No other information was given on why these two were released or who they are. Lord we pray for your protection on the 15 people still being held and we pray for their freedom soon</p>

When her heart stopped while she was sleeping, she unknowingly rolled over and hit her husband in the face which alerted him to the emergency. Her husband, who had never performed CPR before in his life, pulled her off the bed to perform CPR while their teenagers stood by. The husband was able to bring his wife back to consciousness until the ambulance came. The woman had another episode while in the hospital, and had a defibrillator installed which will automatically notify the hospital if she has another heart episode.</p> <p>You might say it was a slap in the face that saved her life.</p>

That suggests interest rates in general could go higher, with credit card rates the most affected.</p> <p>You aren't seeing many television commercials urging you to buy a new car as a Christmas gift. The new car shortage means dealers have fewer vehicles and aren't offering deals. Karl Brauer, executive analyst at I-See-Cars.com says if you can, you should wait a few months before buying a car. It's winter, there's inflation, and electric bills are going up. It's probably no surprise that the latest J.D. Power survey of utility company customers shows that satisfaction is going down. The survey put residential customer satisfaction at 748, slightly lower than last year.</p>

U.S. government data shows that Fentanyl overdoses have surged to the leading cause of death for adults between the ages of 18 and 45. Mexico and China are the primary sources for the flow of fentanyl into the United States, according to the Drug Enforcement Agency. And, other drugs can be laced with Fentanyl. Lord we pray that people turn to you rather than drugs.</p> <p>The 12 remaining missionaries who were among 17 kidnapped by the notorious 400 Mawozo gang in Haiti have now all been released. It is not known if any ransom was paid. The leader of the gang had initially demanded \$1-million ransom per missionary. Christian Aid Ministries has not released any other details about their freedom. Lord we thank you that all these missionaries are free and safe.</p>

The village is so small that they do not have street lights, but each year the 2,000 residents are illuminated by the tree an elderly couple planted in 1978. Just six feet tall at that time, a cherry picker is now used to place the 3,000 bulbs needed. The illuminated tree can be seen for miles as you approach the small town. Since everyone had to keep their distance due to COVID this year, fireworks and a trailer to broadcast music were added to the event.</p>

				<p>The couple say they are still stunned by the size of the tree which grows more than a foot each year: "We had no idea just how big it would grow. It's absolutely huge now and towers over our house."</p> <p>Sometimes they even get Christmas cards addressed to the tree.</p>
