4/2/23	Can crisis tip us into an ecologically sane civilization? UK Think tank report author Laurie Laybourn on a future where disasters ripple across the world. Then let's get away – to Antarctica. Why did sea ice crash around that frozen continent Increasing El Nino events may drive global sea levels higher. Australian scientist Adriaan Purich shares big changes at the South Pole.

4/9/23	Tornadoes, climate and a rocky future. Long-time science journalist Alex Smith finally admits his own hopes and fears, knowing what we know now. Some neglected new science shows up, plus clips with Todd Rose on collective illusions, and a word from 11-year-old climate podcaster Zach Fox-DeVol .
4/16/23	Antarctic currents, We the Children, and worst car maker award. From Australia, Dr. Matthew England explains new Antarctic science that literally changes the whole world. I talk with 11-year-old Zach Fox-DeVol about his “We the Children” podcast. From Public Citizen, Erika Thi Patterson reports front-line action to clean up car making – including the surprise worst manufacturer we all thought was so green.
4/23/23	Social barriers against climate action: neuropsychologist Adam Aron investigates with his book “The Climate Crisis”. From Grist, Senior Writer Naveena Sadasivam breaks stories of state repression, corporate-wrong doing – and outright corruption to grease the deadly status quo. Nobody thinks climate misinformation is accidental.
4/30/23	Are your savings helping the mad new expansion of fossil fuels? From RAN, Dr. April Merleaux names big banks expanding oil, gas & coal from the Arctic to the Amazon. Where does that lead? From London, broadcaster, author, and science journalist Gaia Vince breaks boundaries in her book “ <i>Nomad Century – How To Survive The Climate Upheaval</i> ”.
5/7/23	“Endless record heat” over Asia. Strange Spring heat waves from Spain to Botswana. Is it because the ocean has never been hotter? Then Katrin Gandswindt from Urgewald names the trillion dollar pension funds and investment houses paying for a new surge in fossil fuel production. Psychologist Derrick Sebree Jr. on the African American experience during the climate shift.
5/14/23	Did you know energy is free, and Peak Oil is not dead? French expert in technology, energy, and climate, Jean-Marc Jancovici . Jean-Marc is a Professor, author of several books, the latest being “Sleep quiet until 2100, and other misunderstandings about climate and energy”. His first in-depth English radio interview. Jean-Marc co-founded Carbone 4 consultancy, and The Shift Project. He advises, writes books, and lectures mostly in French,

	but his ideas resonate with American writers like Richard Heinberg . The world premiere of an English language in-depth radio interview with Jean-Marc Jancovici.
5/21/23	Three medical experts on Extreme Heat: Elizabeth Hanna, Robert Kopp and Jonathan Patz . NASA just announced Earth is heating faster than expected. Deadly heat in India, unheard-of heat in Spain. Around the world, people have died and many more will be killed by heat in the future. But how does heat kill? and who?
