EcoShock, Sunday 10-11am

Date	Program Summary
1/1/23	The holiday Radio Ecoshock Green Music Festival. Best of eco-music, many you won't find on Itunes. Some sent in by listeners, or the artists, not on albums, etc. Plus two Occupy songs (by Makana and David Rovics). A little inspiration for the heart. First broadcast 2011.
1/8/23	Millions of northern Europeans wore coats indoors, as energy prices skyrocket. Then the winter heat wave hit. Author & energy watcher Nate Hagens interviews writer/film-maker Nora Bateson in Sweden. Is this a trial run for living with less? Alex investigates Liquid Natural Gas (LNG) tankers to "save" Europe. Desert for this radio meal is a few minutes with the late French philosopher Guy Debord . He saw the social lie that keeps us pinned to suicidal lifestyles.
1/15/23	Half the world's glaciers will disappear within a single lifetime. Breaking science with Dr. David Rounce . Netherlands researcher Leon Simons : geoengineering has been cooling the planet for decades. That is over now. Co-author of the new bombshell from James Hansen tackles more warming revealed. Hansen predicts sea level rise much higher than thought and up to 10 degrees C hotter. If true, catastrophe is on the near horizon.
1/22/23	James Hansen , former top NASA climate scientist – his new paper warns the climate is already committed to extreme changes that will devastate life on this planet, including humanity. Alex investigates "Global Warming in the Pipeline". Dr. Barry Lomax reports a near-miss extinction in recent decades – from UV-B that caused "The Great Dying" 250 million years ago.

1/29/23	Cognitive scientist Philip Fernbach discovers a disturbing mechanism in society and the mind. As the polycrisis becomes permanent, former World Watch Editor Erik Assadourian explains the new Gaian Way. Can this help?
2/5/23	The ocean acts like a giant air-conditioner, absorbing 90% of extra heat added by humans. What if it stops? Dr. Keith Moore explains. From New Zealand, Dr. Kevin Trenberth reports more record ocean heating – levels not seen for over a million years. Is this powering weather extremes?
2/12/23	Tipping points, feed-backs & social collapse: the late Australian super-scientist Will Steffen in his own voice. From Radio Ecoshock 2018, Hothouse Earth and Trajectories of the Earth System. From Ecoshock 2020, the risk of “societal collapse” as climate impacts mount. We need to listen until we really “hear it”. A best of the best replay, for a life well given.
2/19/23	Up to 20% of creatures you know will go extinct this century, according to research by Australian biologist Corey Bradshaw , Professor of Global Ecology at Flinders University, Adelaide. Then: why do top economists claim global warming over 3 degrees will cause only minor damage to the economy? From theanalysis.news podcast, Colin Anthes interviews Australian economist Steve Keen about crazy numbers from the people who advise governments, banks and business.
2/26/23	We talk mental health in the climate crisis with Dr. Susan Clayton , author of the Climate Anxiety Index. Then we go tiny: pollinators are disappearing at an alarming rate. Now we know the cost – in dollars and lives lost, with research scientist Matthew Smith from the Harvard Chan School of Public Health in Boston.
3/5/23	Blistering heat waves across the Southern Hemisphere, strange storms in the North. Alex reports new science of Atmospheric Rivers, Arctic Ice and teleconnections. Columbian scientist Paola Arias Gomez explains continuing drought & record heat smashing agriculture in Argentina, South Brazil, and Uruguay – another hit for world food prices. Plus Greta Thunberg reads from her latest: “The Climate Book”.

3/12/23	The latest and best overview of climate feedbacks is out. UK scientist Tim Lenton reports possible futures. From New York, author and activist Andrew Boyd on his new book “I Want A Better Catastrophe.”
3/19/23	Systems & security expert Thomas Homer-Dixon : situation update and battered hope. From Rotterdam, Dr. Yogi Hendlin , exploring the brains of fossil fuel lovers, as the house is on fire. Homer-Dixon is author of “The Upside of Down” and “The Ingenuity Gap”, Director of the Cascades Institute. He says these times of concurrent crises are the new normal. The future will be even stranger. Two bright minds in difficult times, with tools to cope. Thomas Homer-Dixon and Dr. Yogi Hendlin coming right at you, on Radio Ecoshock this week.
3/26/23	Space physics expert Professor Thomas W. Murphy warns government and corporate plans are impossible. The growth game is OVER. We are never going back to “normal”. Post Carbon Institute Fellow and author of 14 books Richard Heinberg says “The renewable energy transition is failing”. Is he giving up? Should we give up?
