Trump Social Safety Measure	Despierta America	5/24/19	7:08AM	:30	President Donald Trump ordered measures on Thursday to protect the social safety net and promote self-sufficiency for non-citizens, in order to protect the benefits of Americans. The memorandum states that government agencies will fully apply the restrictions established by the current law on the use of social assistance programs based on income from non-citizens. The order details that, according to the current law, those who sponsor non-citizens must assume financial responsibility for social assistance benefits based on the income they receive. Trump called on agencies that regulate assistance benefits, including the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), to develop and issue recommendations and guidance to ensure that welfare payments based on income are recovered from the sponsor.
U.S. Tariffs Increase to All Mexican Goods	Despierta America	5/31/19	7:00AM	1:41	President Trump abruptly announced a new five percent tariff on Mexico beginning in early June, saying the levy will gradually increase until the ongoing illegal immigration surge at the southern border is remedied and illegal migrants stopped. The International Emergency Economic Powers Act of 1977 permits tariffs to be levied by the executive in the event of a national emergency originating from a foreign source.

President Trump says he will apply tariffs of 5% on all Mexican goods on June 10, and increase the rate in coming months to 25% if Mexico does not substantially halt illegal immigration across the U.S.-Mexican border.

In the declaration, the Treasury also announced that it will deny travel permits to private and corporate aircraft. However, everything indicates that the flights of commercial airlines to the island will not be affected with this new measure, as well as travel for journalistic purposes, professional meetings, academic research and university groups. The Treasury and Commerce Departments implemented changes to the sanction rules on Cuba, to keep U.S. money out of reach of Cuban military intelligence and security services, according to the Treasury Department Twitter account posted this morning.

Trial results were presented at the annual meeting of the American Society of Clinical Oncology in Chicago Saturday and will be published Tuesday in the New England Journal of Medicine.

So far, the number exceeds one thousand cases, according to the Department of Health and Human Services.
