TOPIC: Respiratory illnesses are on the rise in Okanogan County. The CDC has issued an advisory to health care providers about the low vaccination rate for flu, COVID and RSV diseases. They are concerned that low vaccination rates could lead to more severe diseases and strain the health care system. They believe that future holiday gatherings of family & friends will cause infections to spike. Hospitalizations have increased among all age groups with increases of 200% for flu, 51% for COVID and 60% for RSV. The CDC is encouraging residents to get vaccinated as soon as possible.
