Section II: Most Significant Programming

A. Memphis Civilian Law Enforcement Review Board: Broadcast on February 13 at 5:45 a.m. Duration: 15 minutes. The program *Focus* featured Sandeep Padnekar, board member from the Memphis Civilian Law Enforcement Review Board. Mr. Padnekar discussed the history and current status of civilian oversight of the Memphis Police Department. He also discussed efforts to give the Review Board more power to respond to citizens' complaints and concerns about the Memphis Police Department

B. Conservation of Birds and their Habitats: Broadcast Sunday thru Saturday at 5:59 pm, January thru March 2022. Duration: 1:45 minutes per segment. *BirdNote* is a daily program that is dedicated to the conservation of birds and their habitats. Among the topics discussed this quarter were creating bird habitats at home, reintroducing eagles to the Washington, D.C. area, the rebound of wintering Trumpeter Swans in nearby Arkansas, engaging hunters with wetlands conservation, cavity nesting birds of the mid-south, the conservation of marsh lands in Texas, Louisiana and Florida, and the Fish Crow which is endemic to West Tennessee.

C. Lingering Effects of Hurricane Katrina in Mississippi: Broadcast on March 10 at 10:20 a.m. and March 12 at 3:20 p.m. Duration: 7:51 minutes per segment. A segment of the program *E-Town* featured Barb Flannigan from Karing, an Illinois non-profit created to help Mississippi coastal communities rebuild after Hurricane

Katrina. Ms. Flannigan discussed the problems still going on 17 years after the deadly hurricane and how the storm impacted the entire state, including nearby North Mississippi and the Delta region.

D. Environmental Impact of Cruise Lines: Broadcast on March 17 at 10:20 a.m. and March 19 at 3:20 p.m. Duration: 9:04 minutes per segment. A segment of the program *E-Town* featured Gershon Cohen from the Campaign to Safeguard America's Waterways. Mr. Cohen discussed the harmful impact on our coastlines and waterways from the luxury cruise industry.

E.: Healthcare For The Homeless: Broadcast on January 13 at 10:20 a.m. and January 15 at 3:20 p.m. Duration: 6:30 minutes per segment. A segment of the program *E-Town* featured Dr. Jim Withers from Operation Safety Net, who discussed the lack of desperately needed medical care for the homeless.

F. Climate Change: Broadcast Monday thru Friday at Noon, January thru March 2022. Duration: 1:30 minutes per segment. *Climate Connections* is a daily program that is designed to educate the public about all issues concerning climate change. Among the topics discussed this quarter were simple ways cities can make it easier for people to go solar, expected increase in the number of heat waves, septic system failures due to climate change, spiking natural gas prices, how to conserve water, and how extreme weather is threatening forests in the Southeastern United States.
