Section II: Most Significant Programming

A. Coronavirus In Shelby County: Broadcast on April 3 at 5:45 a.m. Duration: 15 minutes. The program *Focus* featured Dr. Kenneth Ward from the Department of Public Health at the University of Memphis. As part of an ongoing series on Coronavirus and its impact on Memphis, Dr. Ward discussed the latest covid variants, continued vaccination efforts and the long term impact of the virus on Memphis and Shelby County.

B. Environmental Solutions: Broadcast on May 12 at 10:20 a.m. and May 14 at 3:20 p.m. Duration: 7:00 minutes per segment. A segment of the program *E-Town* featured environmentalist author and activist Bill McKibben who discussed practical solutions to such environmental issues as carbon emissions, deforestation, loss of biodiversity and lack of clean water.

C. Importance of Parks and Public Lands: Broadcast on June 2 at 10:20 a.m. and June 4 at 3:20 p.m. Duration: 5:47 minutes per segment. A segment of the program *E-Town* featured Neil Mulholland, former president of the National Parks Foundation, who discussed the value of open space and the importance of conserving parks and public lands in our communities.

D. Saving Endangered Species: Broadcast on April 7 at 10:20 a.m. and April 9 at 3:20 p.m. Duration: 8:00 minutes per segment. A segment of the program *E-Town* featured Richie Moretti, founder and director of the The Turtle Hospital.

Since 1986, Mr. Moretti's work has resulted in over 1000 sea turtles successfully rehabilitated and released back into the wild. Mr. Moretti discussed how animal advocates can work to protect endangered animals and their habitats throughout the country.

E. Child Abuse: Broadcast on June 23 at 10:20 a.m. and June 25 at 3:20 p.m. Duration: 8:30 minutes per segment. A segment of the program *E-Town* featured psychologist Craig Secher, president and founder of Realities For Children. Mr. Secher discussed the dire need to support abused, neglected and at-risk children with a safety net of services and funding.

F. Climate Change: Broadcast Monday thru Friday at Noon, April thru June 2022. Duration: 1:30 minutes per segment. *Climate Connections* is a daily program that is designed to educate the public about all issues concerning climate change. Among the topics discussed this quarter were: free online environmental justice courses for high school students; increased pollen concentrations; how to save water; weatherization and efficiency upgrades to mobile homes; employment opportunities in clean energy; worm composting; and the benefits of electrical vehicles.
