

KFSN-TV QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS REPORT
THIRD QUARTER 2003

From July 1, through and including September 30, 2003, KFSN-TV presented 19-1/2 hours of regularly scheduled local news programs a week, in addition to public affairs programs and syndicated programs. KFSN also broadcast programs and public service announcements provided by the ABC Television Network. Attached is the ABC-TV Network Second quarter news and public affairs program information report.

This half-hour news program reviews the day's news events, local, national, and international. Also covered are weather and sports. Friday's newscast features the Action News Person of the Week.

Monday through Sunday, 11:00-11:35PM, 35 min., Local

This half-hour news program reviews the day's news events, local, national, and international. Also covered are sports and weather; Consumer Reports are included.

Sunday, 10:30AM – 11:00AM, 30 min., Local/Public Affairs

Half-hour weekly local talk/interview program dealing exclusively with issues and local affairs.

CHILDREN FIRST

Children First is in its fifth year of production. This year-long effort focuses on the challenges, problems, and opportunities facing children living in Central California. The program concentrates on how the average person can make a difference in a child's life and highlight local news organizations that work with children and youth. *Children First* includes local news produced half-hour programs, :30 vignettes, public service announcements, and special stories on Action News.

CALIFORNIA DECIDES: VOICE YOUR CHOICE DEBATE 2003

A 90 MINUTE DEBATE, SPONSORED BY THE CALIFORNIA BROADCASTERS ASSOCIATION AND CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, WILL PROVIDE VIEWERS AND LISTENERS WITH AN OPPORTUNITY TO EDUCATE THEMSELVES ABOUT THE RECALL ELECTION, THE CANDIDATES RUNNING FOR GOVERNOR, AND CRITICAL ISSUES AFFECTING THE STATE. THREE CANDIDATES HAVE QUALIFIED AND ACCEPTED SEATS AT THIS DEBATE AND THEY INCLUDE CRUZ BUSTAMANTE, TOM MCCLINTOCK AND ARNOLD SCHWARZENEGGER.

WE'LL HAVE COVERAGE OF THAT EVENT FOR YOU SATURDAY ON ACTION NEWS LIVE AT ELEVEN.

NORTH VALLEY COUNTIES SAY THEY'VE DONE THE PART TO FIX THE PROBLEM AND FEEL TRAPPED.

MORE EVIDENCE TONIGHT THAT THE AIR QUALITY IN THE CENTRAL VALLEY IS AMONG THE WORST IN THE NATION. THE SURFACE TRANSPORTATION POLICY PROJECT HAS RELEASED ITS STUDY OF THE CITIES AROUND THE NATION, WHICH HAD THE UNHEALTHIEST AIR DAYS FROM THE YEAR 2000 TO THE YEAR 2002. FRESNO FINISHED SECOND ONLY TO THE RIVERSIDE -SAN BERNARDINO AREA. THE TOP FIVE ARE ALL CALIFORNIA CITIES. THE STUDY BLAMES A LACK OF PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION, TOO MANY CARS, AND A ROLL BACK OF NATIONAL CLEAN AIR LAWS.

FOR MONTHS, SENATOR "FLOREZ" OF SHAFTER HAS PUSHED CLEAN AIR BILLS THAT TARGET AGRICULTURE. AGRICULTURE HAS ENJOYED AN EXEMPTION FROM POLLUTION CONTROLS FOR DECADES AND FLOREZ SAYS THERE WILL BE "NO" CHANGES.

NEW RULES TO HELP CLEAN UP OUR AIR WILL PUT SOME EXTRA DEMANDS ON BIG BUSINESS IN THE VALLEY. THE "SAN JOAQUIN VALLEY AIR POLLUTION CONTROL DISTRICT" WILL REQUIRE BIG BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY TO REDUCE EMISSIONS BY TEN TONS PER DAY. THE BOARD DECIDED TO HOLD OFF ON RE-CATEGORIZING VALLEY AIR AS "EXTREME."

ALTHOUGH HE'S WAY BEHIND IN THE POLLS, UEBERROTH TOLD THE FRESNO MEDIA HIS BUSINESS EXPERIENCE MAKES HIM THE BEST MAN FOR GOVERNOR. WHEN ASKED ABOUT THE CURRENT CONFLICT OVER AIR QUALITY AND AGRICULTURE, HE SAID HE'S ON THE FARMERS SIDE.
