(1) TOPIC: Garfield County Fairgrounds

DATE/TIME: April 22, 9:00-9:30 a.m.

PROGRAM: Mr. Floyd was introduced as the new Director of the Fairgrounds. He described his duties in the new position, the upcoming events, rental facilities available to the public, upgrades to the fairgrounds for 2022 and presented an outline of the Garfield County Rodeo and the guests artists who would be performing at the Rodeo.

(2) TOPIC: Project Sanctuary

PROGRAM: This activity is a very important offering to our veterans and their families suffering from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder. Project Sanctuary conferences are held every year throughout the United States in resort areas that donate their facilities for a 5 day period. The families are all included at no charge with activities and counseling for the children, personal sessions with trained therapists, general therapy sessions for the parents, entertainment in the evenings and recreational activities for the children daily.
