We have a young man who bought a used iPhone online and found out he can't use it because it's locked. What does that mean? Well, it's pretty interesting the process it takes now to buy a used phone that isn't stolen. It's much like buying a used car now. You have to ask the seller for the phone's IMEI number (not the serial number) then run it through a Web site to see if it's been reported stolen. If it checks out, ask the seller to meet you at the cell service provider's storefront. Double check the IMEI number to make sure it's the one they gave. Then have the seller turn off the "Find my iPhone" app and return it to the factory settings. The phone will ask for a password that only the real owner would know. Finally, ask the retailer to sign you up for service right there. That way you'll know if the seller has any outstanding bills. If there is a bill, you can't turn on your new used phone until that person pays the tab. Police in NYC and San Fran have reported a huge decrease in iPhone theft since these safety hoops were put into place.
