History</p>	<p>The Somme: From Defeat to Victory This 2006 dramatized documentary tells the story of the World War I Battle of the Somme, based on real accounts.</p> <p>NOVA “Zeppelin Terror Attack” Early in World War I, Germany launched a terror campaign over Britain, bombing civilians from the sky from Zeppelins – enormous airships filled with hydrogen gas. NOVA reconstructs and detonates the unique artillery the British devised to finally take down these flying machines.</p> <p>Triangle Fire: American Experience Fire breaks out in the Triangle Shirtwaist Factory in New York’s Greenwich Village on March 25, 1911. Workers try to escape but factory owners keep the doors locked; the inadequate fire escape crumbles; and 146 people die. Public outrage forces government action on workplace safety laws.</p> <p>Earthrise: Apollo 8 and the First Lunar Voyage This documentary recounts the flight many consider to be NASA’s most daring and important.
