3rd Annual Burns Night at the Library Thursday, January 23 @ 5:00



Do you have a love of music, poetry, being entertained, and all things Scottish? Then you should attend the third annual Burns Night at the Library. Caven Clark will be celebrating his own Scottish Heritage with his performance of Scottish tunes and recitations of poems by Burns.

Robert Burns is widely hailed as the National Poet of Scotland and as a pioneer of the Romantic period of English literature. Celebrations of his

life and work began during the 19th Century and has spread worldwide, particularly among those of Scottish descent.

Born January 25, 1759 in the village of Alloway, to his tenant farmer parents, Burns' life was cut short by his death at the age of 37 in 1796. In his short lifetime he was a prolific writer with some of his most

famous works being "A Red, Red Rose", "A Man's a Man for A' That", "To a Mouse", "The Battle of Sherramuir", "Tam O' Shanter" and "Auld Lang Syne".

The selection of Burn's work and words will cover as much ground as possible in the hour long program with Clark playing Scottish smallpipes, Scottish border pipes, pennywhistles and perhaps a harp. Traditional refreshments of shortbread and tea will be served beginning at 5:00 with the program following at 5:30. It will be a fun-filled evening for all.

When a loved one dies, grief can overwhelm you. Envision dealing with grief while at the same time

trying to untangle the labyrinth of questions about legal stuff and costs because no will or other documents exist.

Whether you are a young parent with small children, a middle aged professional at the height of a career, a baby boomer getting ready for retirement or a senior citizen facing end of life issues, this program should prove to be beneficial.



Pictured is Hall School which was west of Lead Hill in the Black Ranch area. By 1936, Hall School, east of what is now Hwy 281, no longer existed. This photograph was taken in the late 1800s or early 1900s. Boone County had 85 school houses in 1897 with an average value of \$271.09. One was constructed of brick, ten were log buildings and 74 were of frame construction.




