HUNTING SEASON HARVEST DOWN 27% OVER
LAST YEAR.**

Wisconsin gun deer license sales are about on par with last year.

The state's nine-day gun deer season opened Saturday. The state Department of Natural Resources released figures Tuesday that show as of midnight Sunday hunters had purchased 555,227 licenses that allow them to kill deer with a firearm across the state's multiple deer seasons.

That's down about 1.5% from 2018. Data from that year shows that as of midnight Sunday of opening weekend that year the DNR had sold 564,052 licenses.

Preliminary data shows the harvest was down dramatically over opening weekend this year, with hunters managing to kill only 90,286 deer. That's down 27% from 123,090 deer killed over opening weekend 2018.

CONTRACTING UNDER FEDERAL INVESTIGATION.

The United States has filed a complaint seeking a civil injunction against De Pere business Summit Contracting, Inc., and owners Chad Schampers and Nathaniel Smith. The complaint was filed based on alleged wire fraud and banking law violations, according to the United States Attorney of the Eastern District of Wisconsin.

The purpose of the injunction is to "prevent a continuing and substantial injury to the victims of fraud."

Complaints have also been filed with the state consumer protection agency and the Better Business Bureau.

The U.S. Attorney's Office alleges that Schampers and Smith have "conducted a fraudulent scheme that induces customers to finance construction projects, often by misrepresenting the terms of the financing offered."

The complaint reads, "As alleged, once the projects are approved for financing, defendants fully withdraw the funds for the project from the financing company before Summit completes (or in some instances, even commences) its work by making false statements to financing companies that the work has already been completed.

BRIEF OUTLINE OF NEWS STORY: UTILITY CREWS RESTORING POWER AFTER STRONG LATE FALL STORM.

Wisconsin Public Service (WPS) crews will work through Sunday night repairing electric outages following another strong winter storm.

Sunday's storm brought as much as a foot of heavy, wet snow and winds greater than 30 miles per hour. Since early this morning, WPS has restored service to more than 27,000 customers.

Similar to the powerful pre-Thanksgiving storm, WPS crews have come across downed power lines, downed trees and tree limbs falling onto power lines.

Crews also have faced difficult road and travel conditions while responding and repairing outages.

All available crews will be working around the clock into Monday to make repairs and restore service to all customers as quickly and safely as possible.

Additional outside crews also are assisting WPS in restoring power in the areas most affected by the storm.

It doesn't apply to children who need medical treatment, clinic appointments, or the emergency department. The ban will be in place until further notice.

BRIEF OUTLINE OF NEWS STORY: CHILTON MAN
SENTENCED FOR MANUFACTURING FIREARM
PART FOR AUSTRALIAN CRIMINAL

A Chilton man has been sentenced to two years in federal prison for reportedly manufacturing numerous firearms and firearm-parts for an Australian criminal and gun-enthusiast.

According to the US Attorney of the Eastern District of Wisconsin, 59-year-old Andy Lloyd Huebschmann exported rifle kits to Australia illegally. In those kits, officials say there were component parts for rifles that could function with either semi-automatic or fully automatic triggers, and 1911 firearm frames that could be assembled into completed pistols.

In addition to the prison sentence, Huebschmann was ordered to pay a \$15,000 fine and will spend one year on supervised release following his release.
