WVAZ provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Community and Current Events** : Chicago Community Trust " On the Table discussion and commemorating its 100 anniversary Chicago Urban League 2015 Summit Luncheon. The Chicago Urban League will hold its annual luncheon Thursday April 30th at the Hilton Chicago. This year (tm)s theme is Transformational Change: Igniting the Entrepreneurial Spirit.
