Nearly two million Graco infant car seats are being recalled because of a faulty buckle that makes the car seats difficult to open. Graco recalled 1.9 million car seats for select infant, toddler convertible car seats and harnessed booster seats this week. Graco stressed there have been no reported injuries related to the car seat problem. According to a CBS news report, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration spurred the recall, after fielding dozens of reports that the car seats were tough to open. The company will offer free replacement buckles to any owner who has the seat. Consumers can determine if their infant and toddler car seats are affected and order a replacement harness buckle using the online order form. While waiting for a replacement kit, it is safe to use the infant and toddler car seat, Graco said.

NASA released a breathtaking satellite image today of Tropical Storm Arthur, the first named Atlantic storm of the 2014 hurricane season. The photo was captured by the space agency's Aqua satellite on Monday afternoon, just before the tropical depression off the coast of southern Florida was upgraded to a tropical storm and named Arthur today. Arthur is expected to gain strength and forecast to hit the Outer Banks of North Carolina around 2 a.m. Friday as a hurricane with winds near 75 mph, according to the National Hurricane Center. A tropical storm watch is in effect for the east coast of Florida from Fort Pierce to Flagler Beach.

League City council members passed an ordinance that would ban the processing and detention of immigrants caught crossing our border illegally. While there were protests and legal arguments against the measure, the ordinance passed by a 6-2 vote Tuesday. The federal government has been seeking facilities to house thousands of unaccompanied Central American children caught crossing the border illegally. U.S. law mandates children be housed separately from adults. Detention facilities along the border and at military installations are overcrowded.

Homeland Security Secretary Jeh Johnson told the Senate that \$3.7 billion in emergency funding requested by President Barack Obama anticipated up to 90,000 of the unaccompanied minors this fiscal year. At least 57,000 minors have crossed the Texas border in the past nine months, causing overcrowded holding facilities and a huge backlog of cases awaiting hearings. The emergency money requested by Obama would hire more border patrol officers, judges and others to deal with the immigration crisis of under age children mostly from Guatemala, Honduras and El Salvador.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, about 133 million Americans-nearly half of the adult population-live with at least one chronic illness that affects their daily lives; chronic disease accounts for seven in ten deaths in the U.S. each year. The management of these conditions, many of which are largely preventable, consumes more than 75% of American expenditures on health care. With obesity rates of nearly 40%, Hispanics are at greater risk of developing diabetes and other chronic health conditions than non-Hispanic Whites. They are 50% more likely to die from diabetes and have three times the rate of new HIV infections when compared with non-Hispanic Whites. As the Latino community grows to represent one-third of the U.S. population by 2050, so will the prevalence of chronic conditions that Hispanics face, such as diabetes, heart disease, asthma, obesity and their complications.

The fire, which is burning in alpine timber, has been added to the Mills Canyon Complex fire, according to Chelan County Emergency Management. The Saddle Mountain Fire started Friday afternoon in Kittitas County near the Yakima Training Center. The fire was burning toward Huntzinger Road and cut off 69 people and a fire truck at the Auvil Fruit Company, according to a Kittitas County press release. Forty people were able to escape via the Priest Rapids Dam initially and by Saturday afternoon everyone was safe and accounted for.

Title: NEW STUDY SUGGESTS 42 STATES AT RISK FOR EARTHQUAKES

A new study by the U.S. Geological Survey suggests 42 states have a reasonable chance of experiencing damaging ground shaking from an earthquake in the next 50 years. The 8 states that did not have significant hazard levels are Florida, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, North Dakota and Wisconsin. The 16 states at highest risk are Alaska, Arkansas, California, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Kentucky, Missouri, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, South Carolina, Tennessee, Utah, Washington and Wyoming. The biggest changes to the map are on the west coast. Geologists are focusing on the Cascadian subduction zone in the Pacific Northwest along with the San Andreas and Hayward faults in California.

Although Congress approved the fee hike to help reduce the deficit, TSA is the agency getting pounded by more than 300 comments through Friday largely criticizing the agency and government taxation. Although the fees are going into effect, TSA will collect comments through Aug. 19. Patrick Riehl of Cambridge, Mass., argued that two things other than the TSA have made aviation safer since the Sept. 11 attacks that prompted creation of the agency: reinforced cockpit doors and passengers who fight back.

The announcement comes amid a wave of growing resistance to the federal government's efforts to shelter the unprecedented 57,000 children from Central America who have crossed the border in the last nine months - double the number who made illegal border crossings last year. Instead of bumping children to the back of that long line, the courts are now giving each child an initial court hearing within three weeks, according to the Justice Department's Executive Office for Immigration Review. A spokeswoman for the courts didn't answer questions about how many children's hearings had been set under the new plan, or which courts had scheduled additional hearings.

Topic: CALIFORNIA DROUGHT CRISIS REACHES WORST LEVEL AS IT SPREADS NORTH

As California starts handing out its first fines to water-wasters, new data reveals the state's crippling drought conditions have never been worse. As of Tuesday - the same day the stricter restrictions went into effect - more than 58 percent of the state was in an "exceptional drought" stage, according to the latest U.S. Drought Monitor map. That's a drastic jump from just a week earlier when about 36 percent of the state was suffering under exceptional drought, meaning there's widespread crop and pasture losses and shortages of water in reservoirs, streams and wells. In comparison, there were no areas in California categorized as exceptional - the most extreme category - at the beginning of the year even amid a three-year dry period.

GM is taking claims to compensate families of persons who died or were hurt in accidents involving defective GM vehicles. General Motors (GM) has been in the public spotlight lately because of allegations that it failed to recall millions of vehicles even though it was aware of a potential ignition defect that could cause serious injuries and deaths. The company recalled 1.6 million vehicles in February 2014 due to a faulty ignition switch that could kill the engine and disable the airbags without warning. On March 28, GM expanded the recall to include older cars that may have been repaired with a faulty ignition switch. So far, the total number of vehicles affected by the ignition switch recall is 2.6 million worldwide.

While the AHA stresses that e-cigarettes should be closely monitored to keep them from being a "gateway" product for other nicotine products, there is a place for them to help people quit smoking. But, the authors stressed, "There is not yet enough evidence for clinicians to counsel their patients who are using combustible tobacco products to use e-cigarettes as a primary cessation aid," and should only be used when other treatments have failed or are not adopted. The AHA's proposed guidelines, developed by an expert advisory group working with those researching e-cigarettes and tobacco control and prevention, largely support those being considered by the FDA. The research, run by the University of California Davis' MIND Institute, provided directed therapy to babies ages 6-9 months old that were identified as having early signs of autism, such as an inability to make eye contact, lack of babbling and fixations. By the time the seven babies reached their third birthday - a time when autism can reliably be diagnosed - five didn't show any autism symptoms and a sixth had only mild symptoms. The treatment now needs to be tried in many more children to make sure that it can be consistently helpful, said study co-author Sally Rogers, a professor and developmental psychologist at UC Davis.

The CDC estimated that 10 to 15 million people are infected with them each year. The Enterovirus D68 strain, in particular, dates to 1962 and hasn't been widely reported in years, which experts said could be part of the problem.

Missouri will allow medical school graduates to work as "assistant physicians" treating patients in underserved rural areas, even though they have not been trained in a residency program. In the U.S., at least one year of residency after medical school is usually required to practice medicine independently. Most medical school graduates spend at least three years in residency before starting to practice on their own. Under the new law, an assistant physician must have passed the first two sections of the national licensing exam for doctors but not the final one. If they want to become full-fledged physicians, they will still have to pass the last test and do a one-year residency.

Synopsis: Colorado's 64 sheriffs will no longer honor federal government requests to hold suspected illegal immigrants beyond their release date on the charges they were arrested for, the American Civil Liberties Union said on Thursday. Earlier this year, the ACLU's Colorado chapter notified the sheriffs they could be held liable for potential civil rights violations if they continued to hold people at the request of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. So-called ICE detainees ask that local law-enforcement agencies hold a person for up to 48 hours after they are eligible for release, but recent court rulings have held that the requests are voluntary and do not have the force of law.

Topic: HUNDREDS OF BABIES POSSIBLY EXPOSED TO TB AT TEXAS HOSPITAL

Synopsis: More than 700 newborns and 40 employees of a Texas hospital may have been exposed to a worker who had an active case of the sometimes-deadly tuberculosis, health officials said on Friday. The employee, working in a nursery at Providence Memorial Hospital in El Paso, interacted with patients for months before later being diagnosed with the disease, the El Paso Department of Public Health said. A total of 706 babies and 43 employees were possibly exposed to the infected worker between September

2013 and August 2014, the health department said. Health and hospital officials were working to contact the affected families and would provide screening and follow-up care free of charge.

Synopsis: An expanding wildfire in Northern California has reached 82,018 acres, or more than 128 square miles, as of Sunday morning, California fire officials said. The fire, which began Sept. 13, about 60 miles east of Sacramento, Calif., is 10% contained. Overnight, the fire grew by just 74 acres, the slowest growth of the week. Fire officials reported that increased humidity Saturday night helped to moderate the fire's activity.

Topic: TAX RETURNS MAY BE NEED TO BE PAID BACK FOR HEALTHCARE REFORM

Synopsis: In a few months, millions of Americans will be filing either form 8962 to reconcile the advance premium tax credit they received with the tax credit they were actually due, or form 8965 because they claim an exemption from the shared responsibility (individual mandate) provision of the Affordable Care Act. By the close of open enrollment in April, 6.7 million Americans had chosen a qualified health plan with premium tax credits, and many more have since enrolled in a QHP through a special enrollment period and received tax credits. Each of them will need to file a form 8962. The Congressional Budget Office estimates that 30 million Americans are potentially subject to the shared responsibility requirement, and that 23 million of them may qualify for an exemption. Many of the 23 million will have to file form 8965.

The last week of August, two fishing boats with 40 undocumented immigrants were detected and one loaded with drugs in San Diego. 2013 closed with boats and other watercrafts with undocumented immigrants and drugs confiscated, a record for the command that monitors the border. This is 370% more than in 2008; from October 1st, 2013 to August 15th, 79 incidents were counted.

The recall is for Chicken Breast Grilled Strips sold in 3.5-pound resealable bags. The chicken was produced on Aug. 5 and shipped to retailers in California, Texas, Utah and Washington State, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service said Thursday. Listeria primarily affects the elderly, pregnant women, newborns and people with weakened immune systems. Symptoms include fever, muscle aches, headache, stiff neck, confusion, loss of balance and gastrointestinal problems.

Synopsis: With an eye on the elections of November 4, Texas and New Mexico revived the debate over undocumented immigrants access to driver's licenses and the desirability of maintaining or changing their now opposed policies. In the Lone Star state, the undocumented lost the right to have or renew driving licenses in 2011, a busy year in terms of legislation for the approval of a package of more than 100 anti-immigration laws. Democratic State Representative Roberto Alonzo drove in two years later, taking advantage of a new, more relaxed about laws pertaining to immigration, a proposal to re-issuing licenses. The rule has caused nearly two million undocumented immigrants driving without license in Texas and therefore at least the same numbers of people are uninsured.

The march was sparked by two arrests caught on camera. One video shows a pregnant woman being pushed to the ground by a police officer. Police say the woman interfered when they were arresting her son. Police tell us the officer's gun and shield have been taken away. They say he is still getting paid but is not doing enforcement. But officials said there are no other suspected cases in Texas. At the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Dr. Tom Frieden said the patient left Liberia on Sept. 19, arrived the next day to visit family and started feeling ill four or five days later. He said it was not clear how the person became infected.

According to the consulate of Mexico in Calexico a Queretaro native woman, 48 years, crossed illegally with a group of 6 people. The version of the border patrol was that on the arrival to the scene there were only 2 women. One had given notice to the authorities and the other who suffered from the effects of exposure to heat. Eduardo Jacobo Border Patrol spokesman commented, "The other person was unconscious but breathing when she was found." The undocumented woman received medical attention by the border patrol and was taken to the hospital in El Centro where she was pronounced dead a few minutes later. With this it has already been 7 deaths of undocumented persons in the Imperial Valley, also 11 immigrants have been rescued lost in the desert. Given that the authorities urge people not to venture beyond these areas since like on this case it can be a deadly trap. Although the number of deaths of undocumented immigrants has decreased in the Imperial Valley, in the last years for the authorities a death is too much. The Consulate of Mexico in Calexico is awaiting the results of the autopsy of the deceased to end the process of repatriation of the body to Queretaro. Local establishments say they have not received official notification from the Corona company but still are recalling the product from the market until further notice. Removal of beer started yesterday and affects 1% of the bottles produced. According to the British Journal of Cancer, exposure to glass particles may result in cancers in the lungs and kidneys depending on the quantities consumed and immunity of people to avoid these consequences, beer drinkers say it is best not to regret this later. According to health authorities, August to October are the months most likely to increase in mosquitoes in the region as it is the rainy season thus also increasing the risk of contracting the Nile virus. In Imperial County there have been 9 cases of Nile virus since 2003 which was when the first case was presented. For doctors such situations are not common, but explained that there are several risk factors that can lead a young person to have a heart attack like the one young Calexico student had.
