Topics covered include establishing and improving a credit history, understanding what a mortgage is, understanding when and how to refinance, looking out for pitfalls when buying a home and finally what to do in case something goes wrong. The segment emphasizes the importance of buying a home and offers information on organizations that advocate the consumer.

Topic: Art

This program covers the impact of Latino art on American society. The show illustrates the different art cultures as depicted throughout all Latin American countries. Segments cover professional and amateur artists as well as the benefits of art to the public.

Topic: Violence in the Community
