Chick-fil-A recently received reports of potential unusual activity involving payment cards used at a few of their restaurants. The company says they are working hard to investigate these events and will share additional facts. If the investigation reveals that a breach has occurred, customers will not be liable for any fraudulent charges to their accounts --- any fraudulent charges will be the responsibility of either Chick-fil-A or the bank that issued the card. If their customers are impacted, the company will arrange for free identity protection services, including credit monitoring.

Topic: UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANTS IN CALIFORNIA APPLY FOR DRIVERS LICENCES

Time: 8:30pm Synopsis:

Undocumented immigrants in California started applying for drivers' licenses for the first time this year, a change that registered more than 11 thousand applicants in all California. L.A. council member Gil Cedillo, who led the campaign to reinstate driver's licenses for immigrants when he was in the state Legislature, arrived early in Granada Hills to welcome the first applicants. The DMV says initial interest in the program has been strong. Nearly 400,000 appointments for 2015 were made over two weeks in November, a 115 percent increase in activity over the same period last year. Some immigrant rights' advocates have expressed concern about AB 60 applicants handing over personal information to the government, especially if they've had run-ins with immigration authorities. Other advocacy groups have pushed hard to get licenses into the hands of immigrant drivers and pressured the DMV to issue a design that would avoid stigmatizing cardholders. After months of back-and-forth with the Department of Homeland Security, the DMV finalized a design that included the letters "DP" for "driving privilege" on the front of the card to distinguish it from a standard driver's license. Also included is wording that the card cannot be used for "official federal purposes."

Topic: MARICOPA COUNTY SHERIFF ARPAIO WILL NOT BE ABLE TO CONDUCT RAIDS TO

ARREST UNDOCUMENTED WORKERS

Time: 4:38pm Synopsis:

A federal judge has ordered Arizona's Maricopa County Sheriff Joe Arpaio to stop conducting raids on undocumented immigrants who are using stolen identities to work. Critics say the raids, carried out under two identity theft laws, have torn hundreds of families apart. U.S. District Judge David Campbell ruled in a preliminary injunction Monday that Arpaio's tactics were likely unconstitutional and halted the raids, at least until a federal court reaches its decision in a class-action lawsuit aimed at ending the tactic. Civil rights advocacy group Puente Arizona is the lead plaintiff in the case against the sheriff, as well as Maricopa County Attorney Bill Montgomery and Robert Halliday, director of the Arizona Department of Public Safety. The three have been leading the raids since 2008, resulting in the arrests of at least 790 immigrants.

The national security department said today that anybody that enters the country illegally, or that aids others in doing so, will not be eligible for the recent executive action proposed and set in motion by president Obama. This warning comes in part with a publicity campaign directed at Mexico and Central America, which seeks to bring to light the immigration reform that has been active since Obama's announcement November 20th.

Topic: DRIVER LICESES TO UNDOCUMENTED IN CALIFORNIA

California officials say 46,200 immigrants started applying for a driver's license in the first three days that the state began issuing licenses to immigrants who are in the country illegally. Department of Motor Vehicles spokeswoman said Tuesday that 970 licenses were issued Friday to immigrants who weren't required to take a road test because they previously had a license in California or another state. Most applicants are given permits after passing a required written test and must return for a road test before getting a license. The DMV says 54 percent of all new driver's license applicants who took the written test in English on Friday passed it, while 36 percent passed it in Spanish. California expects 1.4 million people to apply for the licenses in the next three years.

Topic: TEMPORARY PROTECTION STATUS EXTENSION

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) announced El Salvador's designation for Temporary Protected Status is being extended for 18 months, from March 10, 2015, through Sept. 9, 2016. The extension allows eligible TPS beneficiaries to retain TPS through Sept. 9, 2016, so long as they otherwise continue to meet the eligibility requirements. Employers should alert all company representatives responsible for the completion of the I-9 process about this development, as employers are often unsure

about how to complete and/or re-verify the I-9 form for individuals holding TPS work authorization. For individuals already holding TPS under the El Salvador designation, the 60-day re-registration period runs from Jan. 7, 2015 through March 9, 2015. USCIS will issue new Employment Authorization Documents (EADs) with a Sept. 9, 2016, expiration date to those who re-register timely.

Local health officials say five more people who visited Disney theme parks in Southern California last month have fallen ill with measles, bringing the number of cases in the state to a dozen. Orange County Health Care Agency spokeswoman Nicole Stanfield says the county's six patients — including one reported previously by the state — visited the theme parks between Dec. 15 and Dec. 20. Stanfield says only one was fully vaccinated against the disease. California's state health agency reported earlier this week that seven Californians and two people in Utah likely contracted measles at Disneyland or Disney California Adventure. In Colorado, the El Paso County Public Health department said Thursday that a patient diagnosed with measles this month in Colorado Springs had visited Disneyland in mid-December.

Topic: HIGH FEES LIMITING U.S. CITIZENSHIP

In 2000, the start of the George W. Bush administration, the cost of applying for citizenship was \$225. That increased rapidly, so that by 2008, the final year of his administration, the cost was \$675. The share of those naturalizing who are Mexican American dropped. After the 2007 surge, the share of legal permanent residents of Mexican origin who naturalized, dropped from 19.8 percent in 2008 (naturalizations generally occur a year after application) percent to 12.7 percent in 2010. But what the CRS failed to do was look at difference between fees to become a citizen and to renew a green card that resulted after the fee increases. Seeing that green card renewal was far cheaper than naturalization, legal residents opted to keep renewing legal residency rather than become citizens. Citizenship application costs rose so drastically during the George W. Bush administration that naturalizations dropped dramatically, particularly for legal permanent residents who were poorer, less educated and of Mexican origin, according to advocates pushing the Obama administration to reduce the fees.

As world leaders gather in Paris to mourn the victims of the Charlie Hebdo massacre, police in New York City have been placed on high alert for a possible ISIS attack. The NYPD have been warned to look out for jihadi attacks after the terrorist group released a call to attack American police officers, soldiers, intelligence officers and civilians in a social media video on Saturday. The warning says that these threats should be taken more seriously 'in light of the terrorist attacks in France earlier this week' which resulted in the death of more than a dozen people - most of them staff members of the satirical newspaper. The video released on Saturday by ISIS starts with President Obama and British Prime Minister David Cameron speaking about the terrorist group. Then spokesman Abu Mohamad Al-Adnani appears and said not to let the battle pass by wherever may be. Strike their police, security and intelligence members, as well as their treacherous agents. Al-Adnani horrifying instructions encourage supporters to smash a targets head with a rock 'or slaughter him with a knife, or run him over with a car.

Topic: ID'S FOR UNDOCUMENTED IN NY

Under the largest program of its kind in the country, a municipal ID card in New York City will permit about half a million immigrants without legal documentation to access key services such as library cards and be able to open bank accounts. It will also benefit the homeless and the elderly, say city officials. This includes utility bills, high school diplomas or school registration. The cards, called IDNYC, will be available to anyone over 14 years old. The card is not a driver's license and cannot be used as a federal ID.

US Airport screeners have been ordered to enhance the number of random searches of passengers and carry-on luggage, an order first issued last week but only being made public now. The security order comes in the wake of this alarming, step-by-step recipe of kitchen ingredients for what al Qaeda calls in its latest magazine inspire, the hidden bomb to bring down an airplane. The device is designed to get by standard airport magnetometers, and would only be detected by full body scanner machines which are not

present at many smaller airports. Officials acknowledge at least two of them got away, the girlfriend of the gunman at the grocery store, and an accomplice, both in this airport surveillance video seen arriving in Turkey and both now believed to be in Syria. As French authorities try to unravel the plot, one question involves how the terrorists got such heavy duty weapons. This new video shows the two brothers holding up a gas station, with automatic weapons and extremely powerful military rocket launcher. The US military came face to face with another terror weapon Monday, as supposed ISIS followers took over the twitter feed and the YouTube channel of the US Central command, headquarters for American efforts against the terrorists. They posted ISIS videos, and this threat: American soldiers, we are coming, watch your back. The military says no classified information was involved in the cyber-attack, but the FBI today is launching a full investigation.

Topic: FACEBOOK AIMS TO FIND MISSING KIDS

Facebook is rolling out a new tool that it hopes will make it easier for police to find lost and kidnapped children. The social media giant on Tuesday announced a new plan to post Amber Alerts for missing children on the news feed of people who may be nearby. Facebook has already been used to help find missing children and the formal collaboration with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children - which runs the Amber Alert program - will only build on those organic actions, company officials said. Under the new program, Amber Alerts distributed by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children will appear near the top of a Facebook user's news feed, with an option for them to learn more information - such as what number to call if they have information about the case - and share it with others. The alert will only go to people within a certain geographic area of where the child is believed to be, based on where users set their Facebook location as well as analysis of their check-ins, Internet protocol (IP) addresses and any other location information that they already share with the company.

He had reportedly expressed support for "violent" jihad on Twitter. Terrorist group members and supporters will almost certainly continue to use social media platforms to disseminate English language violent extremist messages.

Topic: BIRTH CERTIFICATES FOR MEXICAN RESIDENTS IN THE US AND OTHER COUNTRIES

The Mexican government began issuing copies of birth certificates Thursday at consulates in the U.S., including the one in Atlanta and Los Angeles. Millions of Mexicans are not able to travel back to their country to obtain such documents. Millions of dreamers needed their birth certificates to qualify for the deferred action federal program. Now, as a result of direct internet connection with Mexican civil registries, dreamers and other undocumented immigrants will be able to obtain their birth certificates. 92 percent of the birth certificates in Mexico are digitalized, meaning that 80 of 100 cases will have their certificates in the system.

Topic: MORE THAN 63 PERCENT OF AMERICAN APPROVE OBAMA'S ANNOUNCEMENT TO RE-

ESTABLISH DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS WITH CUBA

In a Pew Research Center poll 63 percent of Americans said they approve of Obama's announcement in December to re-establish diplomatic relationships with Cuba after more than 50 years of tensions. Even more of those surveyed - 66 percent - said they think Obama should go even further and end the trade embargo on Cuba. Support for Obama's actions is strong across racial lines, with 62 percent backing among whites, 64 percent among blacks and 65 percent among Hispanics. But while many Americans support actions to end what Obama has called "an outdated approach that for decades has failed to advance our interests" they do not think that this new approach will advance interests either. The poll was conducted Jan. 7-11 and surveyed 1,504 adults. It has a margin of error of plus or minus 2.9 percentage points.

Topic: PRESIDENT OBAMA WANTS LOWER TAXES FOR MIDDLE CLASS AND HIGHER FOR THE

RICH

President Barack Obama would like to make tax increases for the wealthy and reductions or credits for the middle class, as part of a tax reform. The administration wants to increase the top rate to 28 percent, from the current rate of about 25 percent with various surcharges, while expanding the number of things that would be subject to it. It would do that by cracking down on what's known as a "stepped-up basis." Here's how it works: If you sell stock for \$1 million that you bought for \$100,000, you pay capital gains taxes on the \$900,000 profit. But if you die, and your kid gets the stock, he or she is excused from paying taxes on the \$900,000. For your child, the new starting point in calculating capital gains taxes is the \$1 million, so that \$900,000 escapes taxation. It's a tax break that mostly, though not exclusively, benefits the wealthy. According to the Congressional Budget Office, it cost the Treasury about \$50 billion in 2013, and 21 percent of the tax benefits went to the top 1 percent.

Topic: U.S AND CUBA OVER MIGRATION POLICY

The United States said Wednesday it dispatched additional ships to the Florida Straits to halt Cuban rafters but rebuffed demands for broader changes to U.S. migration rules that dominated the first day of talks between Cuban officials and the highest-ranking U.S. delegation to the island in more than three decades. Cuba urged the U.S. to end immigration privileges that grant virtually automatic legal residency to any Cuban who touches U.S. soil. Its government blames the Cold War policy for luring tens of thousands of Cubans a year to make perilous journeys by sea and land to try to reach the United States. Still, many Cubans are worried the elimination of the rules would take away their chance to have a better life in the U.S. U.S. officials reported a spike in the number of rafters attempting to reach Florida after the Dec. 17 announcement that the countries would move to normalize ties. Those numbers appear to have slowed in recent days. In Washington, U.S. Homeland Security Secretary Jeh Johnson issued a statement saying additional Coast Guard cutters have been deployed to stop Cuban and Haitian migrants from reaching the United States by boat.

Topic: REACTIONS TOWARDS OBAMA'S INITIATIVES

Time: 3:30 pm Synopsis:

President Barack Obama called for higher taxes on wealthy Americans and new initiatives to boost the middle class as he urged Americans to turn the page on years of economic woes and hard-fought wars in his sixth State of the Union address before Congress. Some highlights from Obama's proposals: TAX HIKES: Raise the top capital gains rate on couples with incomes above \$500,000 to 28 percent, the rate under President Ronald Reagan. Impose a fee on roughly 100 massive financial firms with assets exceeding \$50 billion. Eliminate a tax break on inheritances. The administration estimates these changes would generate \$320 billion over a decade. TAX BREAKS: Create a \$500 tax credit for families where both spouses work and have an annual income up to \$210,000. Expand the child care credit to up to \$3,000 per child under age 5. Offer the Earned Income Tax Credit to childless workers and noncustodial parents. Consolidate six overlapping education tax breaks into two. EDUCATION: Offer two years of free community or technical college. Students would need to go to school at least half-time, maintain a 2.5 grade point average and make progress toward a degree. The White House estimates that would cost \$60 billion over a decade. PAID LEAVE: Call for federal and local laws allowing workers to earn up to a week of paid sick time a year. Urge Congress to give federal workers an additional six weeks of paid parental leave. Call for more than \$2 billion from Congress for paid family and medical leave programs. HOME OWNERSHIP: Cut insurance premiums for government-backed mortgages by half a percentage point to .85 percent. The White House says the reduction would save new home buyers and those who refinance \$900 a year compared to current rates. RETIREMENT SAVINGS: Boost retirement savings by

automatically enrolling people without access to a workplace retirement plan in an Individual Retirement Account. Expand access to employer plans for certain part-time workers. MIDDLE EAST: Urge Congress to pass a new authorization for use of military force against the Islamic State group and militant extremists in the Mideast. Until now, Obama has been relying on 9/11-era war powers. CUBA: Seek support for normalizing diplomatic relations with Cuba. Obama wants Congress to lift the economic embargo on Cuba, though the White House doesn't expect Congress to take that step quickly. IRAN: Vow to veto new sanctions on Iran while world powers pursue nuclear talks. TRADE: Ask Congress for so-called "fast track" trade promotion authority to allow an up-or-down vote on trade pacts. Obama wants to secure two major trade agreements -- one with the EU, and one with Asia-Pacific nations. CYBERSECURITY: Call for legislation enabling information-sharing between the private sector and U.S. agencies like the Homeland Security Department. Companies would qualify for targeted liability protection if they comply with certain privacy restrictions. NO GOING BACK: Threaten to veto congressional attempts to roll back Obama's executive actions on climate change and immigration and existing laws on health care and financial reform.

Topic: DISNEY PARKS-LINKED MEASLES OUTBREAK GROWS TO 70 CASES

Time: 3:30 pm Synopsis:

Seventy people have been infected in a measles outbreak that led California public health officials to urge those who haven't been vaccinated against the disease, including children too young to be immunized, should avoid Disney parks where the spread originated. New infections linked to the theme parks emerged Wednesday in the outbreak that has spread to five U.S. states and Mexico, though the vast majority, 62, occurred in California. Because measles is highly contagious, people who have not received the measles-mumps-rubella, or MMR, vaccine are susceptible and should avoid visiting Disney for the time being. The people who have been infected range in age from 7 months to 70 years old. The vast majority was not vaccinated, and a quarter had to be hospitalized. Among those sickened were five Disney employees. Three have since returned to work. The company previously said park employees who may have been in contact with those infected were asked to show proof of vaccination or have a blood test to show immunity against measles. Those with pending results were put on paid leave. Vaccinations are also being offered to all employees. Measles has hit California hard recently. The state typically sees four to 60 measles cases a year.

TODIC: ELECTRONIC CIGARETTES COULD POTENTIALLY RELEASE A CANCER-CAUSING

CHEMICAL Time: 4:30 pm Synopsis:

Using certain electronic cigarettes at high temperature settings could potentially release more formaldehyde, a cancer-causing chemical, than smoking traditional cigarettes does, new lab tests suggest. The research does not prove a health risk as it involved limited testing on just one brand of ecigarettes and was done in test tubes, not people. It also does not mean e-cigarettes are better or worse than regular ones; tobacco smoke contains dozens of things that can cause cancer. But it does highlight how little is known about the safety of e-cigarettes, battery-powered devices that heat liquid to deliver nicotine in a vapor rather than from burning tobacco. The study was published Wednesday as a letter in the New England Journal of Medicine. The journal said it had been reviewed by experts in the field. Formaldehyde is found in many things, certain building materials, disinfectants and embalming fluid. An earlier study found e-cigarettes generated less formaldehyde than regular cigarettes do, but that study looked at just the gas portion of the vapor. The new one looked at the liquid particles in the vapor, like the spray from an aerosol can.

Topic: LIMITED FUNDING FOR DRIVER'S UNDOCUMENTED LICENSE PROGRAM

Immigrant rights supporters packed a budget committee hearing at the state capitol Thursday afternoon to protest a decision by Republicans to largely cut off funding for a program that grants drivers licenses to undocumented immigrants. The conflict started with a vote by the powerful Joint Budget Committee. Republicans on the panel voted Wednesday against allowing money collected from immigrant driver's license applicants be used to continue the program. The result is that undocumented immigrants throughout Colorado will now only be able to get licenses from a single office in Denver. On Thursday, the committee delayed discussing the issue because one of its members, Rep. Dave Young, D-Greeley, was absent. But it looks likely that the license program could be back on the agenda this coming Monday.

Topic: TSA AGENTS DISCOVERED 2,212 GUNS AT AIRPORT CHECKPOINTS IN 2014

The Transportation Security Administration found more than 2,000 firearms at the nation's airports last year - the overwhelming majority of them loaded, the Department of Homeland Security said today. TSA agents discovered 2,212 firearms - or a little more than six a day - in carry-on bags; 83 percent of them were loaded, the department said. The number was a 22 percent increase from 2013, when 1,813 firearms were discovered. The number of firearms discovered at TSA checkpoints has risen nearly every year since 2005. Also last year, the department said, more than 1,400 "firearm components, replica firearms, stun guns, and other similar dangerous objects were discovered" in carry-on luggage.

Topic: MILITARY COMBAT PLANES ESCORT 2 COMERCIAL JETLINERS AFTER CREDIBLE BOMB

F-16 fighter jets escorted two passenger planes into Atlanta's Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport on Saturday after a bomb threat made on Twitter was deemed credible. Southwest Airlines Flight 2492 and Delta Flight 1156 landed safely at the airport and were searched by bomb disposal units, according to airline officials. Nothing out of the ordinary was found. One runway was closed temporarily, causing delays for other flights as passengers on the two flights were questioned and their luggage was searched by bomb-sniffing dogs, officials said. More than 4,200 flights originally scheduled on Tuesday have been canceled, according to the tracking site FlightAware. Most of these planes were scheduled to fly through airports in New York, Boston and Philadelphia, cities and regions that are expecting significant, pounding snowfall. LaGuardia Airport in New York, which saw more than 700 cancellations on Monday, has no flights in or out scheduled for Tuesday, said the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, which manages the region's three airports. Some flights were still on for Tuesday, but far fewer than would have otherwise been planned. John F. Kennedy Airport and Newark Liberty Airport, which each had about 500 flights halted Monday, both have relatively few flights still scheduled for Tuesday, the Port Authority said. In Boston, Logan Airport is expecting essentially no flights on Tuesday, and airport authorities expect that flights could resume Wednesday. Nearly 300 flights on Monday and another 600 flights on Tuesday were nixed. Philadelphia International Airport said that "most" of its flights were canceled Tuesday, as airlines called off more than 800 planned flights. It is unclear just what the impact will be from these cancellations, because until the snowfall starts to dwindle, it is unclear precisely when the airports will be able to resume flights in cities bracing for the snow. But problems in airports like these can create issues for travelers in the region, stranding them for days. They can also echo far beyond the places currently dealing with travel restrictions, as issues at key hubs in the Northeast can cause headaches throughout the national air traffic system.

Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti is one of a long list of mayors who have signed on to an amicus brief supporting President Obama's executive order on immigration. The brief was filed Monday in Texas v. United States, a federal lawsuit filed in December with the intent of stopping the recent order from taking effect. Garcetti and New York Mayor Bill de Blasio organized the coalition of city leaders, which includes Mayors Ed Lee of San Francisco, Rahm Emanuel of Chicago, Muriel Bowser of Washington, D.C. and more than two dozen others. Obama's executive order, signed in November, would temporarily protect millions of immigrants from deportation. Those who would qualify for a three-year reprieve and a work permit include certain immigrants who arrived as minors, and parents of U.S. citizens and legal residents who have spent at least five years in the United States. The amicus brief from the mayors argues that these provisions will fuel economic growth in cities across the country, increase public safety and public engagement, and facilitate the full integration of immigrant residents by promoting family unity and limiting family separation. These positive impacts are possible because Executive Action will permit undocumented immigrants to better reach their potential and contribute to their communities.

Speaker John Boehner told House Republicans in a closed-door meeting today that a lawsuit might be the best, or only, option to try and overturn President Obama's executive action on immigration. One month before the Homeland Security Department runs out of funding, Republican leaders are scrambling to find alternative ways to express their displeasure over the president's decision last year to grant work visas to up to five million undocumented immigrants. The department runs out of money on Feb. 27, under an agreement Congress reached last year to keep the rest of the government running, and Republican leaders are unwilling to risk government shutdown over another immigration fight. But the lawsuits against Obama from Congress are beginning to stack up. Last year, House Republicans took legal action against

The Obama administration has ordered immigration agents to ask immigrants they encounter living in the country illegally whether they might qualify under President Barack Obama's plans to avoid deporting them, according to internal training materials obtained by The Associated Press. Agents also have been told to review government files to identify any jailed immigrants they might be able to release under the program. The directives from the Homeland Security Department mark an unusual change for U.S. immigration enforcement, placing the obligation on the government for identifying immigrants who might qualify for lenient treatment. Previously, it was the responsibility of immigrants or their lawyers to assert that they might qualify under rules that could keep them out of jail and inside the United States. One training document includes scenarios describing encounters between agents and immigrants with guidance about how agents should proceed, with a checklist of questions to determine whether immigrants might qualify under the president's plans. ICE officials earlier began releasing immigrants who qualified for leniency from federal immigration jails. Obama in November announced a program to allow roughly 4 million parents of U.S. citizens and legal permanent residents to apply for permission to stay in the country for up to three years and get a work permit. The program mirrors one announced in 2012 that provides protection from deportation for young immigrants brought to the country as children.

The snowstorm was expected to be the most far-reaching of the season to date, stretching from Nebraska to Maine, according to the National Weather Service. During the first six years of the Obama administration - from 2009 to 2014 - the U.S. Customs and Immigration Services (USCIS) issued 982,000 new work permits to illegal aliens or aliens unqualified for admission, with 957,000 going to aliens who crossed the border illegally. USCIS issued 5,461,568 new work permits to immigrants during the same period, in addition to the 1.1 million legal immigrants and 700,000 guest workers admitted to the United States each year. The Employment Authorization Documentation card (EAD, Form I-765), known popularly as a "work permit," is a document issued by USCIS that provides its holder with a legal right to work in the United States.

The Obama administration has informed lawmakers that the President will seek a formal authorization to fight the Islamic State that would prohibit the use of enduring offensive ground forces and limit engagement to three years. The approach offers what the White House hopes is a middle way on Capitol Hill for those on the right and left who remain deeply skeptical of its plans to thwart extremist groups. The request, which could come in writing as early as Wednesday morning, would open what is expected to be a month's long debate over presidential war powers and the wisdom of committing to another unpredictable mission in the Middle East while the nation is still struggling with the consequences of two prolonged wars. The White House has tried to address concerns by drafting a resolution that tries to be both circumscribed and flexible. It would explicitly disallow extended use of combat forces, lawmakers and aides who are familiar with the plan said Tuesday. That language is intended as a compromise to ease concerns of members in both noninterventionist and interventionist camps: those who believe the

use of ground forces should be explicitly forbidden, and those who do not want to hamstring the commander in chief.

Topic: U.S. GOVERNMENT IS POISED TO WITHDRAW LONGSTANDING WARNINGS ABOUT CHOLESTEROL

The nation's top nutrition advisory panel has decided to drop its caution about eating cholesterol-laden food, a move that could undo almost 40 years of government warnings about its consumption. The group's finding that cholesterol in the diet need no longer be considered a "nutrient of concern" stands in contrast to the committee's findings five years ago, the last time it convened. During those proceedings, as in previous years, the panel deemed the issue of excess cholesterol in the American diet a public health concern. The finding follows an evolution of thinking among many nutritionists who now believe that, for healthy adults, eating foods high in cholesterol may not significantly affect the level of cholesterol in the blood or increase the risk of heart disease. The greater danger in this regard, these experts believe, lies not in products such as eggs, shrimp or lobster, which are high in cholesterol, but in too many servings of foods heavy with saturated fats, such as fatty meats, whole milk, and butter. The new view on cholesterol in food does not reverse warnings about high levels of "bad" cholesterol in the blood, which have been linked to heart disease. Moreover, some experts warned that people with particular health problems, such as diabetes, should continue to avoid cholesterol-rich diets.

Topic: HALF A MILLION DOLLARS INDEMNIZATION TO A MEXICAN IMMIGRANT DUE TO ABUSE OF POWER FROM A BORDER PATROL

A federal court ordered the US government to pay a Mexican citizen about half a million dollars after being shot in the back by a Border Patrol agent in the Arizona desert. On February 5, Judge James Soto ordered to pay \$497,000 to Jesus Castro Romo after he was hit by a bullet from Agent Abel Canales during a routine immigration detention in the desert. Canales, who was later taken to a federal prison for working with members of a Mexican drug cartel, said in a first statement that Castro was unarmed. But a second witness said the Mexican citizen was holding a stone and was attacking him verbally. The judge also questioned the fact that an agent reacts with weapons to armed alien with stones. A stone is not as deadly as a gun, plus it requires a high degree of accuracy and strength to be as deadly as a gun, said the judge. The judge ordered the government to pay Castro for the wounds after the shooting, treatment, drug costs, pain and suffering caused, representing a total amount of \$553,000.

Topic: APP HELPS BLIND PEOPLE 'SEE'

Checking the expiry date on a tin of food, or navigating through a train station is easy for people with full vision. But for the blind these everyday tasks can prove difficult. To solve this problem, a visually impaired developer from Denmark has launched the Be My Eyes app. It connects blind people to a sighted volunteer using a live video chat. The volunteer can then answer questions and see the blind person's surroundings using a phone's camera. The volunteer helper gets a notification for help, and once it accepts the request, a live video connection opens. Using the live video, the volunteer can see whatever is in front of the blind person using the phone's built-in camera. They can then help the blind person answer their question. At the end of each session, the app lets both users rate the call, or report misuse. Be My Eyes said that anyone who misuses the system will be banned from the network. The app is currently only available for people using an iPhone 4S or above, running iOS 7. An Android app is in development.

Topic: FLORIDA SCHOOLS STILL USE THE MEDIEVAL PRACTICE OF PADDLING

Most Florida public school kids will never be whacked with a paddle for misbehaving. The number of students subjected to corporal punishment statewide has dropped dramatically in recent years, from 65,050 in 1988-89 to 4,274 in 2008-09 and 2,966 in 2011-12. But Florida is still one of 19 states that nonetheless allow schoolchildren to be spanked, and now there's a new push to end what critics call a form of institutionalized violence. A recent study by two University of Florida College of Education professors - and funded by the Southern Poverty Law Center - recommends that the entire state retire the paddle once and for all. Twenty-eight of the state's 67 school districts avail themselves of this disciplinary option, most of them in rural and conservative regions, including Clay and Nassau counties in Northeast Florida. The school district in Suwannee County, about an hour's drive west of Jacksonville, with a student population of about 6,000, paddled the most - 359 times in 2012-13. Duval County, once the state's paddling leader, abolished corporal punishment in 2005. At the time nearly 80 percent of paddled students just so happened to be black.

Thousands of children were in the care of the Border Patrol after an unprecedented surge in unaccompanied minors who crossed into Texas illegally. Many children were sent to Nogales, Arizona, where they were held in a large warehouse while their cases were processed. Many of the children were from Central American countries and said they were fleeing extreme violence and poverty.

As a result of the cut, only one DMV office in the state is now able to offer driver's license appointments to the estimated 150,000 undocumented immigrants who are eligible to apply. The next available appointment is in March 2016. Republican state lawmakers on the Joint Budget Committee voted twice last week not to approve the necessary \$166,000 the Division of Motor Vehicles needed to continue running the program at five of the 56 DMV offices in Colorado. Colorado began issuing driver's licenses to undocumented immigrants in July, and since then the demand has been so high that at one point the state's website for appointments crashed because of traffic. In fact, Democrats and Latino advocates have been urging lawmakers to add more DMV locations where undocumented immigrants can go and get a license.

Demonstrators marched the streets of Pasco Saturday to protest the police shooting of Antonio Zambrano-Montes Tuesday night. Some wore shirts that read, "Stop police brutality / It was a rock." Zambrano-Montes was throwing rocks, witnesses say, at a busy intersection before police shot him. Adults and children marched and chanted "justicia," the Spanish word for "justice." Zambrano-Montes was part of Pasco's majority-Latino population. His family has said he was an undocumented worker from Mexico. The agricultural town of Pasco is in the media spotlight, with the presence of television cameras and satellite trucks growing throughout the week. Martin Valdez of the Greater Washington Hispanic Chamber of Commerce acknowledged at the march the shooting has become international news. Marchers stopped to pray at the corner where Zambrano-Montes was shot. Investigators say he was not armed with a gun or knife at the time of his death. Whether he still carried any rocks is under review. The Franklin County coroner plans to order an inquest. Zambrano-Montes' family has prepared to sue the city of Pasco for \$25 million. Speakers who took the microphone called for peaceful demonstrations throughout the day. At the end of the rally some people told the crowd through a megaphone that they had come from Seattle and asked others not to leave, but to lay down in the street.

U.S. District Judge Andrew Hanen of Texas has temporarily blocked President Obama's executive action on illegal immigration by granting a request from 26 states to allow the courts to look at its constitutionality before it is implemented. The lawsuit is being headed by Texas Governor Greg Abbott. The case examines complex issues relating to immigration which necessarily involve questions of federalism, separation of powers, and the ability and advisability, if any, of the Judiciary to hear and resolve such a dispute. The temporary injunction enjoins the implementation of the DAPA program that awards legal presence and additional benefits to the four million or more individuals potentially covered by the DAPA Memorandum and to the three expansions/additions to the DACA program also contained in the same DAPA Memorandum. It does not enjoin or impair the Secretary's ability to marshal his assets or deploy the resources of the DHS. It does not enjoin the Secretary's ability to set priorities for the DHS. It does not enjoin the previously instituted 2012 DACA program except for the expansions created in the November 20, 2014 DAPA Memorandum. DACA is the program President Obama implemented in 2012 allowing illegal immigrants brought to the United States with their parents to stay. DAPA is President Obama's most recent program issued through a December executive action granting temporary amnesty to nearly five million illegal immigrants. The federal government has been blocked from temporarily implementing DAPA or expanding DACA. The Homeland Security Department is ceasing preparations for a program designed to shield millions of immigrants from deportation. Homeland Security Secretary Jeh Johnson says his agency will stop working on the program to protect parents of U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents until further notice. The ruling means that the Homeland Security Department also won't be accepting applications for an expanded Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program, which was to start Wednesday. The effort to protect immigrant parents living in the country illegally was to start in May.

The hospital typically pays for the flight, but that's it. Furthermore, the undocumented patients are often sent to medical facilities in their home countries that are ill-equipped to provide them with the necessary care. Consequences range from long-term disability to death.

Obama administration officials, as well as many Democrats in Congress, have also been unwilling to discuss how they would handle a ruling that ended subsidies in most states, preferring to focus attention on Republican opposition to the law. After deflecting questions for weeks about whether the administration had a contingency plan, Sylvia Mathews Burwell, the secretary of health and human services, wrote in a letter to members of Congress on Tuesday that it did not.

Obama signed a "student aid bill of rights" and spelled out an assortment of policy tweaks and projects to try to make it easier for people with student loans to pay back their debt. Obama has asked the Treasury and Education departments and the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau to report by Oct. 1 on whether bankruptcy laws or other laws or regulations should be changed for student loans. The lending industry has resisted loosening bankruptcy standards for student loans, but advocates have argued students burdened by heavy debt should be able to more easily use that as a way to discharge their obligations. The review will focus on private student loans that do not carry protections given to federal student loan borrowers, such as the ability for borrowers with permanent disabilities to discharge loans, an administration official said. House said 40 million Americans have student loans. More than 70 percent of U.S. students who graduate with a bachelor's degree leave with debt, which averages \$28,400. The White House said it will require clearer disclosures from companies to make sure borrowers understand who is servicing their loan and how to set monthly payments and change repayment plans. Obama will direct his Education Department to create a system by July 1, 2016, to better oversee and address complaints from borrowers about lenders, servicers and collection agencies, the White House said.

As the fire raged in the East Village neighborhood, there were desperate attempts to flee, with residents jumping from fire escapes, and dramatic rescues, with one man climbing through the smoke to look for people who might have been stranded and others pulling a woman to safety. The blaze was so intense that firefighters at one point had to withdraw from the buildings and engage in what one official called a "defensive outside attack," pumping a deluge of water onto the structures. Mayor Bill de Blasio, during a news conference at the scene, said "preliminary evidence suggests a gas-related explosion" was caused by plumbing and gas work being done at 121 Second Avenue, near Seventh Street. The explosion and ensuing fire destroyed that building and led to the collapse of an adjacent building. More than 250 firefighters responded to what became a seven-alarm fire.
