The Colorado Department of Agriculture informed today it will renew during 2009 the program of hiring up to one thousand foreigners with temporary visas to work in the farms of the state.

arack Obama took oath today as the new president of the United States. The taking of office speech of the 44the President was centered on the serious challenges that the country faces: the economic crisis, two wars and the fall of American prestige.

President Barack Obama, today signed a decree that orders the closing of the Guantanamo detention center. The signed decree sets a term of one year to close the facilities.

Less than one week from the end of the first month of the year, the companies Caterpillar, Philips, Ing., Home Depot, Nextel and Corus announced cuts in their labor force that together amount to 51 thousand lay-offs.

President Barack Obama praised the Senate approval of a law that extends medical coverage to eleven million under-privileged children, and reiterated his commitment to extend that benefit to all the citizens.

Topic: **BUDGET AND MEDICARE**

Synopsis: Medicare costs vary wildly across the country, according to a study that found the government paying twice as much for treating a patient in Miami as in San Francisco. The dramatic cost differences don't appear connected to climate or to who lives where, and people in the more expensive areas don't get better care. More expensive medical technology is only part of the picture, according to the report released Wednesday by the Dartmouth Atlas Project, which studies medical resources.

Topic: FIRST TIME HOME BUYERS

Synopsis: The most optimistic outlook is for a spring revival as home prices plummet. Government officials, hoping to spur demand, on Wednesday rolled out the details of a new \$8,000 tax credit for first-time buyers. About 40 percent of all home sales last year were from first-time buyers. Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner said the tax credit should help provide an "immediate response to the current crisis." The government response may help, but many consumers are still in wait-and-see mode.

Topic: IMMIGRANT CASE BEFORE SUPREME COURT

Synopsis: Ignacio Carlos Flores-Figueroa, an undocumented worker from Mexico, made a curious and undeniably bad decision. After working under an assumed name for six years, he decided to use his real name and exchanged one set of phony identification numbers for another. The change made his employer suspicious and the authorities were called in. The old numbers were made up, but the new ones he bought happened to belong to real people. Federal prosecutors said that was enough to label Flores-Figueroa an identity thief. The Supreme Court will hear arguments on prosecutors' aggressive use of a new law that was intended to strengthen efforts to combat identity theft. In at least hundreds of cases last year, workers accused of immigration violations found themselves facing the more serious identity theft charge as well, without any indication they knew their counterfeit Social Security and other identification numbers belonged to actual people and were not made up.

Topic: BORDER TECHNOLOGY

Synopsis: Crossing the border is going high-tech. Starting June first, most travel documents needed to cross the U-S border will have a computer chip in them designed to speed up processing at the nation's border crossings. It's called a radio frequency identification document reader or R-F-I-D. The device gives workers access to a traveler's information before the traveler gets to the inspection booth...up to 30 feet away. Border officials expect the device to cut up to eight seconds from a traveler's wait.

Topic: IMMIGRATION REFORM CAMPAIGN

Synopsis: A national tour calling for reform of the federal immigration system kicked off in Providence. U.S. Rep. Luis Gutierrez, D-Ill., is spearheading the National Family Unity Campaign for the Congressional Hispanic Caucus to hear stories from immigrants at stops at more than a dozen churches across the country. Gutierrez said the current laws and harsh enforcement is devastating to families. He and other lawmakers and advocates want President Barack Obama to prioritize immigration reform.

Topic: **OBAMA ECONOMY**

Synopsis: The White House budget director says the president will sign a big spending bill despite GOP calls for a veto. Peter Orszag says Obama will work with Congress to reduce targeted spending, known as earmarks. But he says the \$410 billion measure that passed the House last week represents last year's business and the new administration needs to move on. The bill would keep the government operating through Sept. 30, the end of the current budget year.

Topic: CITIGROUP - GOVERNMENT DEAL

Synopsis: Private investors will have to go along, but Citigroup has reached a deal with the government on a new rescue plan. The Treasury would provide up to \$25 billion in emergency funds for an ownership stake of as much as 36 percent. The deal is contingent on private investors also agreeing to a similar swap.

Topic: **HEALTH CARE COST**

Synopsis: A new government report on medical costs paints a stark picture for President Barack Obama, who's expected to call for a health care overhaul in his speech Tuesday night to Congress. The Department of Health and Human Services says health care costs will top \$8,000 per person this year, consuming an ever-bigger slice of a shrinking economic pie. The report says as the recession cuts into tax receipts, Medicare's hospital trust fund could become insolvent as early as 2016.

Topic: CA JOB FAIR

Synopsis: Thousands of eager job-seekers are lining up at Dodger Stadium this weekend, hoping to score a job. Applicants are competing for about 500 positions for the summer baseball season. The state's

unemployment rate is now just above ten percent; and many of today's applicants say they've recently lost their job.

Topic: IRS RETURN

Synopsis: The IRS has made changes to make it easier for distressed homeowners to avoid having a federal tax lien block either a mortgage refinancing or sale of a home. While it can take 30 days to process an application to get rid of a tax lien or to have it take a back seat to a lender's claim, the IRS says it's working to speed the requests because of the recession.

Topic: FEDERAL CONSUMER CREDIT

Synopsis: The Federal Reserve rolled out a much-awaited program aimed at boosting the availability of credit to consumers and small businesses. The Fed will lend up to \$200 billion to spur consumer lending for autos, education, credit cards and other consumer debt. The money will be used to provide financing to investors to buy up the debt.

Topic: FLU STRAIN RESISTANCE TO TAMIFLU

Synopsis: Virtually all cases of the most common strain of flu circulating in the United States now resist the main drug used to treat it, as per the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. CDC researchers said 98 percent of all flu samples from the H1N1 strain were resistant to Roche AG's Tamiflu, a pill that can both treat flu and prevent infection.

Topic: **DEPRESSION AND HEART ILLNESS**

Synopsis Depression almost doubles the risk of developing heart disease over 12 years, according to a long-term study of twins. Mounting evidence has found that depression makes people more vulnerable to heart trouble. Recent studies, though, find that some genes that increase the risk of heart disease also may make people more prone to depression, which has raised the question of whether the depression-heart disease link is genetic

Topic: IMMIGRATION LOCAL ENFORCEMENT

Synopsis: According to government investigators, The Homeland Security Department has failed to ensure that local and state law enforcement partners pursue serious criminals and don't misuse their authority while enforcing immigration law. Dozens of state and local agencies have partnered with Immigration and Customs Enforcement to carry out immigration laws, the domain of the federal government. But ICE, a Homeland Security agency, has not clearly explained whether serious criminal offenders are the target, according to the Government Accountability Office.

Topic: HEALTH CARE OVERHAUL

Synopsis: President Barack Obama has invited to the White House more than 120 people who hold a wide range of views on how to fix the world's costliest health care system, one that still leaves millions uninsured. A broad group of doctors, patients, business owners and insurers were to gather for a forum in hopes of building support for big changes in health care.

Topic: OBAMA LAUNCHES HOUSING PLAN

Synopsis: The Obama administration kicked off a new program that's designed to help up to 9 million borrowers stay in their homes through refinanced mortgages or loans that are modified to lower monthly payments. In the "Making Home Affordable" initiative, borrowers will have to provide their most recent tax return and two pay stubs, as well as an "affidavit of financial hardship" to qualify for the \$75 billion loan modification program, which runs through 2012

Topic: HISPANIC ENROLLMENT RISE

Synopsis: Census figures being released Thursday point to a major ethnic shift in America's school kids. About one-fourth of all kindergartners are now Hispanic. And by the year 2023, minority youngsters will constitute the majority. That has broad implications for how the country handles issues ranging from immigration to jobs and education. The change has been most noticeable in the West. Arizona, California

and Nevada are among states whose Hispanic populations are booming because of immigration and higher birth rates

Topic: LATEST UNEMPLOYMENT FIGURES

Synopsis: The U.S. unemployment rate hit a 25-year high of 8.1 percent in February as employers buckling under the strain of a recession that shows no sign of ending axed 651,000 jobs, according to government data.

Topic: OBAMA STIMULUS PLAN LATEST

Synopsis: President Barack Obama is heading for Columbus, Ohio, where he plans to highlight at least 25 jobs saved by his \$787 billion economic stimulus program. He'll speak at a graduation ceremony for police recruits. Columbus' mayor laid them off in January, but now says he's got the money to pay them through the end of the year. Obama's chief spokesman, Robert Gibbs, says the President believes trips like the one to Ohio are important because they help show the public what the government is doing to try to turn the economy around.

Topic: TPS WILL EXPIRE

Synopsis: On October 1, 2008, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) formally announced an eighteen-month extension of the TPS designation for eligible Honduran and Nicaraguan nationals from January 6, 2009 to July 5, 2010. On Nov. 24, 2008, DHS announced that it had extended the deadline for the re-registration period for Honduran and Nicaraguan TPS beneficiaries through Dec. 30, 2008. USCIS has also automatically extended the validity of employment authorization documents (EADs) held by Honduran and Nicaraguan nationals in current TPS status from Jan. 5, 2009 through July 5, 2009.

Topic: OBAMA ON ECONOMY LATEST

Synopsis: President Barack Obama is challenging the nation to do more than just endure the dreadful economy. Obama is using his weekly radio and Internet address to tell citizens to try to discover opportunity in hard times. He says he believes Americans will do just that. Obama offered a recap of another hectic week in his young presidency. He sought to reassure the country that he and his team are taking specific steps to create jobs in the short term and begin to address huge issues, like health care, that affect virtually everyone.

Topic: IMMIGRANTS LEAVE US

Synopsis: The U.S. is no longer the only land of opportunity. If we don't want the immigrants who have fueled our innovation and economic growth, they now have options elsewhere. Immigrants are returning home in greater numbers. And new research shows they are returning to enjoy a better quality of life, better career prospects, and the comfort of being close to family and friends. Earlier research suggested that a crisis was brewing because of a burgeoning immigration backlog.

Topic: GUTIERREZ "FAMILY UNITY" TOUR

Synopsis: A tour documenting the effects of the nation's immigration policy will make a stop in San Francisco where members of Congress will listen to stories about the harm caused to local citizens by deportation and other policies. Rep. Luis Gutierrez, D-Ill., has led the national "Family Unity" tour, which allows people to tell their stories about being separated from family members due to the country's immigration policies.

Topic: OBAMA & STEM CELL RESEARCH

Synopsis: President Barack Obama will lift his predecessor's restriction on federal funding of human embryonic stem cell research and will give the National Institutes of Health four months to come up with new rules on the issue, according to officials. Obama will not lay out any guidelines himself but let the NIH decide when and how it is ethical and legal to pay for embryonic stem cell research.

Topic: HOMELESS KIDS STUDY

Synopsis: One of every 50 American children experiences homelessness, according to a new report that says most states have inadequate plans to address the worsening and often-overlooked problem. The report being released Tuesday by the National Center on Family Homelessness gives Connecticut the best ranking. Texas is at the bottom.

Topic: SMALL BUSINESSES FINANCIAL HELP

Synopsis: The Obama administration is looking to steer new assistance to the nation's small-business community, Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner told members of Congress Monday night. In a closed-door meeting with House Democrats on Capitol Hill, Mr. Geithner said Obama officials are working on plans to boost liquidity for small businesses as part of the administration's broadening efforts to spur lending and arrest the pace of job losses.

Topic: UNIFIED BOARD LAYOFFS NOTICES TO ABOUT 9,000 EMPLOYEES

Synopsis: The letters will go out to 5,500 teachers, and the rest will go to workers such as counselors and administrators. Any job cuts would have to be approved in June. The Los Angeles Board of Education approved issuing preliminary layoff notices to about 9,000 employees Tuesday despite a large demonstration by the teachers union and some board members' concerns over potential harm to educational quality.

Topic: FORECLOSURES UP 30% IN FEBRUARY

Synopsis: Despite halts on new foreclosures by several major lenders, the number of homeowners threatened with losing their homes rose 30 percent from last year's levels, RealtyTrac reported Thursday. Nationwide, nearly 291,000 homes received at least one foreclosure-related notice last month, up 6 percent from January, according to the Irvine, Calif-based company.

Topic: CA TEACHERS AND STUDENTS PROTEST

Synopsis: Hundreds of teachers gathered at Civic Center Plaza in San Francisco Thursday night to protest the state's \$11.6 billion in cuts to public education. One of the expected results of the cuts is layoffs. The state teacher's union has nicknamed Friday "Pink-Slip Friday" because that's the legal deadline for districts to issue layoff notices for the fall.

Topic: OBAMA AND THE ECONOMY

Synopsis: President Barack Obama says investors should have "absolute confidence" in the soundness of the United States. Obama made the comment in the Oval Office today in response to a question about the Chinese premier's concerns about the safety of China's investments in the U.S. China is Washington's biggest foreign creditor, with an estimated \$1 trillion in U.S. government debt.

Topic: FOOD SAFETY

Synopsis: President Obama today called for a top-to-bottom overhaul of the nation's food-safety system. The move comes not long after a deadly Salmonella outbreak in peanut products. The President says that will change under former New York City Health Commissioner Margaret Hamburg, who he named as head of the Food and Drug Administration.

Topic: BERNANKE RECESSION

Synopsis: Federal Reserve Chairman Ben Bernanke testified on Capitol Hill in Washington, that America's recession "probably" will end this year if the government succeeds in bolstering the banking system, Bernanke seemed to express a bit more optimism that this could be done. Still, Bernanke stressed - as he did to Congress last month - that the prospects for the recession ending this year and a recovery taking root next year hinge on a difficult task: getting banks to lend more freely again and getting the financial markets to work more normally.

Topic: HEALTH SERVICES ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS

Synopsis: By next month, thousands of illegal immigrants will be on their own, with many more people across the nation facing the same fate. Bowing to recession-related budget pressures, Sacramento

County recently took the drastic step of cutting non-emergency health services to illegal immigrants. Local health systems in other states also are facing such decisions as health officials find themselves trapped between their dwindling federal, state and local funding streams and the growing number of newly uninsured who need services.

Topic: FOOD LABELING NEW RULE

Synopsis: Shoppers will have more information about where their food comes from under a new policy starting Monday. Labels on most fresh meats, along with some fruits, vegetables and other foods, will now list where the food originated. In the case of meats, some labels will list where the animal was born

raised and slaughtered. Food safety groups have long lobbied for the policy, which was enacted by Congress as part of a wide-ranging farm bill last year.

Topic: LATIN AMERICAN REMITTANCES

Synopsis: A new report by the Inter-American Development Bank shows migrant workers from Latin America are sending less money home. The drop comes as the global economic crisis is leading to less work for migrants. The bank predicts that remittances to the region will decline this year for the first time on record.

Topic: IMMIGRANT HEALTH CARE

Synopsis: Two advocacy groups say U.S. authorities routinely delay, deny or botch medical care for immigrants in detention. Human Rights Watch and the Florida Immigrant Advocacy Center released separate reports Tuesday on health care in immigration custody. Advocates say the problems stem from unskilled or indifferent staff, overcrowding, bureaucratic red tape, language barriers and limited services.

Topic: US CONSUMER PRICES

Synopsis: U.S. consumer prices rose in February on higher gasoline and apparel prices, government data showed on Wednesday, calming fears of deflation for now. The Labor Department said its closely watched Consumer Price Index rose 0.4 percent, the biggest monthly gain since last July, after increasing 0.3 percent in January.

Topic: IMMIGRANTS SCHOOL

Synopsis: School parents and immigrant community leaders will release a groundbreaking report by Advocates for Children, "Our Children, Our Schools: A Blueprint for Creating Partnerships Between Immigrant Families and New York City Public Schools," that shows that immigrant parents would like to be more involved in their children's schools, but face significant barriers to participation.

Topic: OBAMA IN CALIFORNIA ON ECONOMY

Synopsis: Obama spoke for 21 minutes, then took eight questions. As Obama began his two-day Southern California visit Wednesday in Costa Mesa, the White House released a list of projects to be funded with stimulus money. They include adding an eastbound lane to the Riverside Freeway/SR91 in Orange County. Obama's mention of the project drew cheers from a crowd of 1,300 that greeted him in Costa Mesa.

Topic: BABY BOOM: US BIRTHS IN 2007 BREAK 1950'S RECORD

Synopsis: More babies were born in the United States in 2007 than any year in the nation's history, topping the peak during the baby boom 50 years earlier, federal researchers reported. The birth rate rose slightly for women of all ages, and births to unwed mothers reached an all-time high of about 40 percent, continuing a trend begun years ago. More than three-quarters of these women were 20 or older.

Topic: RECESSION PROOF JOBS

Synopsis: In every economic downturn, people want to know what the most "recession-proof" jobs are. Given the strength of this recession, the smart job-seeker might want to look at the recession proof

field that's among the fastest-growing. And for that, look no further. Some of the jobs on this list are: technician at No. 2. It's a field expected to grow 41 percent in the next decade.

Topic: SAVING MORE / SPENDING LESS

Synopsis: The financial pain Americans are experiencing cuts a lot deeper today than it did just a year ago, when the economy was only starting to veer south. Consumer confidence dropped to an all-time low in February. This is what happens when a nation loses more jobs in three consecutive months than it had lost in any similar period since 1945.

Topic: FAMILY UNITY TOUR

Synopsis: An immigration reform movement looks to evangelicals, children left behind by deported parents, Congressman Luis Gutierrez's (D-IL) new "Family Unity Tour," which launched last weekend and has already reached thousands across the country. One of the main reasons for the listening and learning tour is to bring family and faith to the forefront of an immigration debate that has long been dominated by divisive rhetoric.

Topic: BANK RESCUE

Synopsis: Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner is set to unveil details of the Obama administration's strategy to help banks weighed down by billions in so-called toxic assets. The plan involves buying as much as \$1 trillion in troubled assets. It also sets up a new government entity, the Public Investment Corp. The goal is to loosen up credit and get loans flowing to consumers and businesses.

Topic: US BORDER SECURITY

Synopsis: The Obama administration plans to send more agents and equipment to the southwestern border to fight Mexican drug cartels and keep violence from spilling over into the United States. Speaking at the White House Tuesday, Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano said officials were still considering whether to deploy the National Guard to the border.

Topic: OBAMA PRESS CONFERENCE

Synopsis: President Barack Obama says his \$3.6 trillion budget will help the economy now and ensure the nation doesn't face another crisis in 10 or 20 years. The comment is from excerpts of remarks Obama will make tonight in a prime-time news conference. He also says the nation "will recover" from the recession.

Topic: PLAN FOR BANKING CRISIS

Synopsis: The Obama administration launched a new effort Monday to end a paralysis in lending, saying it will team with investors with the goal of buying up to a trillion dollars of bad assets from banks that have been reluctant to make loans to consumers and companies.

Topic: **RED MEAT STUDY**

Synopsis: The largest study of its kind finds that older Americans who eat large amounts of red meat and processed meats face a greater risk of death from heart disease and cancer. The federal study of more than half a million men and women bolsters prior evidence of the health risks of diets laden with red meat like hamburger and processed meats like hot dogs, bacon and cold cuts

Topic: ALZHEIMER'S CARE COST TRIPLE FOR EDERLY

Synopsis: Caring for a patient with the disease costs at least \$33,007 a year, a report finds. The health care costs of Alzheimer's disease patients are more than triple those of other older people, and that doesn't even include the billions of hours of unpaid care from family members, a new report suggests. Compared with people aged 65 and older without Alzheimer's, those with the mind-destroying disease are much more often hospitalized and treated in skilled-nursing centers.

Topic: EDUCATION "DREAM ACT"

Synopsis: Congressmen Howard Berman and Lincoln Diaz-Balart announced the reintroduction today of the "Dream Act" in the U.S. House of Representatives. This legislation will restore the States' rights to determine residency requirements for higher education benefits - giving states the option to provide in-state tuition. The American DREAM Act seeks to facilitate access to postsecondary educational opportunities for immigrant students in the United States who currently face barriers in pursuing a college education

Topic: FINANCIAL / USA REGULATION

Synopsis: The Obama administration has unveiled a sweeping overhaul of the financial system designed to impose greater regulation on major players like Hedge Funds. Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner told lawmakers that the changes are needed to fix the flaws exposed by the current financial crisis, the worst to hit the country in seven decades.

Topic: COLONOSCOPY HIV

Synopsis: Officials said about 3,260 patients at a Veterans Affairs hospital in Miami should be tested for HIV, hepatitis and other diseases after receiving colonoscopies with equipment that wasn't properly sterilized. The VA insisted the risk of infection was minimal and only involved tubing on endoscopic equipment, not any device that actually made contact with a patient. It's the second such announcement of errors during colonoscopies at VA facilities

Topic: PENALIZE IMMIGRATION SYSTEM

Synopsis: Senators Dianne Feinstein (D-Calif.) and Edward Kennedy (D-Mass.) today introduced legislation that would create a new federal crime to penalize those who misrepresent themselves as attorneys in an effort to defraud individuals - citizens and non-citizens alike - who seek immigration assistance. Law enforcement officials say a growing number of fraudulent "immigration specialists" are operating throughout the country as attorneys qualified to practice immigration law.

Topic: CALIFORNIA BUDGET STIMULUS

Synopsis: Budget experts are estimating that California will receive more than \$50 billion from the federal stimulus package. The California Budget Project says there will be money for Medi-Cal, schools, tax credits, highway construction, and more. Some of the money could help California avoid further budget cuts and higher tax increases. But under state law, for that to happen, at least \$10 billion of those federal stimulus dollars must be used to offset state spending.

Topic: IMMIGRATION REFORM

Synopsis: Rep. Luis Gutierrez (D-IL) has been on a five week tour visiting 16 American cities -- including Chicago and Joliet, IL and Milwaukee, WI this weekend -- promoting amnesty for millions of illegal aliens and the dismantling of immigration law enforcement programs.
