The suit also alleges that Hopkins and the Rockefeller Foundation, which is also named as a defendant, "did not limit their involvement to design, planning, funding and authorization of the Experiments; instead, they exercised control over, supervised, supported, encouraged, participated in and directed the course of the Experiments."

The emails, although dating back years before the shooting, were among evidence presented by the Justice Department in a report in March that concluded that racism pervaded the Ferguson Police Department. The emails were released to the Washington Post late on Thursday in response to a public-records request. They were sent and received by Mary Ann Twitty, who was Ferguson's court clerk, as well as former Ferguson police Captain Rick Henke and former police Sergeant William Mudd. All three were removed from their jobs after the Department of Justice discovered the emails, which prompted an investigation by city officials. The three

have made no comment since leaving their jobs. The emails were sent between 2008 and 2011 and are mainly emails forwards containing insensitive and offensive jokes. Ferguson Mayor James Knowles condemned the emails when the Justice Department report was released.

In January, the agency began complying with a new law that allows those who prove they reside in California to qualify for a license, regardless of immigration status. At the time, the DMV said it estimated that 1.4 million undocumented immigrants would apply for a license in the next three years. SB-249, which could allow for drivers licenses that may serve as documentation to cross the border from / to Mexico, was also approved unanimously by the Transport Committee in California.

Several hundred times over the last decade, intruders have hopped fences, slipped past guardhouses, crashed their cars through gates or otherwise breached perimeter security at the nation's busiest airports - sometimes even managing to climb aboard jets. One man tossed his bike over a fence and pedaled across a runway at Chicago O'Hare, stopping to knock on a terminal door. Another rammed a sports-utility vehicle through a security gate at Philadelphia International and sped down a runway as a plane was about to land. At Los Angeles International, a mentally ill man hopped the fence eight times in less than a year - twice reaching stairs that led to jets. An Associated Press investigation found 268 perimeter breaches since 2004 at airports that together handle three-quarters of U.S. commercial passenger traffic. And that's an undercount, because two airports among the 31 that AP surveyed didn't have data for all years. Boston's Logan refused to release any information, citing security concerns.

Drivers in California who are unable to pay traffic fines for minor infractions are frequently having their licenses suspended by traffic courts - a policy that has had a disproportionate impact on poor and working-class people, according to a study released Wednesday. The report found that in California, four million people - 17 percent of adults with licenses in the state - had their licenses suspended as recently as 2013 because they had failed to pay fines or to appear in court. The issue of aggressive enforcement of traffic violations by police officers and the imposition by courts of substantial financial penalties for late payment has attracted widespread attention recently as state, county and municipal governments across the nation have increased fines, in some cases significantly, to offset budget shortfalls caused by the financial crisis.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration on Friday approved Shire Plc's stimulant Vyvyan's to treat binge-eating disorder, the first product to be approved for the condition. Vyvyan's, which is currently approved to treat attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, generated sales of more than \$1 billion in the first nine months of last year. Binge-eating disorder, characterized by repeated episodes of uncontrolled eating, accompanied by guilt and shame, affects roughly 2.8 million people in the United States, according to Shire. Vyvyan's is an amphetamine which, like other amphetamines, carries the potential for abuse and addiction. They also have been associated with increase blood pressure and heart rate, sudden death, stroke, heart attack, insomnia and psychiatric side effects such as hallucinations and mania. The drug is not approved for weight loss.

Topic: TORNADOES FURY IN CENTRAL ILLINOIS LEAVES DEATH AND DESTRUCTION

A violent storm system threw off tornadoes and left a trail of destruction Thursday night as it swept across a 50-mile swath of North Central Illinois. A 67-year-old woman was killed and at least seven others were hospitalized with injuries in the tiny hamlet of Fairdale. Garifuna churches of New York City have been assisting numerous Garifuna immigrants who have arrived since June. To date, they have assisted about 140 families, helping them with food, clothing, legal assistance and travel fare to legal and medical appointments. The Garifuna, descendants of African and indigenous Arawak people from the Caribbean, are mostly concentrated along the northern coast of Honduras, with others in Belize, New York City and other U.S. urban centers. Last spring, large numbers of Garifuna emigrated to the U.S. from Honduras to escape discrimination, urban gang violence and poverty and to find work and a more stable life. Many of the immigrants, which included some unaccompanied children and youth, came to New York City to stay with Garifuna family and friends already living there. When many of the mothers first went to immigration court, they were given tracking devices to wear on their ankles. Until the devices were removed, the women were unable to legally work and had to charge the devices every three hours.

If Immigration and Customs Enforcement officials do not meet the demands of mothers in the Karnes family detention center, they have pledged to restart the hunger strike and work stoppage they initiated during Holy Week to protest their and their children's mistreatment and unjust detention. That week, 80 mothers refused to work or eat to bring attention to their imprisonment and demand their immediate release. In response, authorities at the privately run facility, placed mothers like Kenia Galeano who will join the call in isolation. The Administration's policy of detaining asylum seeking mothers and children as part of a deterrence strategy has also come under fire in the courts recently with a class action lawsuit filed by the ACLU and the immigration clinic at the University of Texas law school. In solidarity with the women inside Karnes, supporters will deliver 4,000 signatures on a petition to ICE Director Sarah Saldaña at the ICE Headquarters in DC requesting their immediate release.

The director of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement clashed with Rep. Louie Gohmert (R-Texas) over the Obama administration's immigration policies during a Tuesday House Judiciary Committee hearing. Things eventually got so tense that ICE Director Sarah Saldana actually had to ask Gohmert to stop yelling. Gohmert noted that Judge Andrew Hanen has temporarily halted President Barack Obama's executive actions to shield millions of illegal immigrants from deportations - and then accused the administration of misleading the judge in its past approval of benefits for eligible immigrants. The Obama administration apparently argued in court and in legal documents that the president's immigration plan would not be implemented until late February, according to Hanen. However, the Department of Justice later told Hanen that more than 100,000 illegal immigrants had been issued three-year deferrals between November 20 and February 16, when the injunction was ordered, a move that irked the federal judge.

Mosby, filed the charges almost as soon as she received a medical examiner's report that ruled Mr. Gray's death a homicide, and a day after the police concluded their initial investigation and handed over their findings. Officials had cautioned that it could take considerable time for her office to complete its own investigation and decide whether to prosecute. In a city rocked by unrest this week, and now under curfew and patrolled by National Guard troops, Ms. Mosby's announcement on the steps of the War Memorial downtown drew cheers from the assembled crowd while a nearby cordon of officers in riot gear looked on stonily. As word spread, people in parts of the city took to the streets in spontaneous celebration.

Lee Hoogveldt's attorney, Robert Sykes, filed a civil rights lawsuit in Federal Court on Thursday, and he provided the media with copies of body camera video showing Hoogveldt being attacked by a police dog. The video shows Hoogveldt seated on a sofa after police enter his home. After numerous commands from officers, he raises his hands in the air seconds before a dog named "Pyro" lunges at his face, bites, and holds on for about 15 seconds. Hoogveldt is then pulled into a nearby room by another officer. The video shows large amounts of blood covering his face. Seconds later, Hoogveldt is face down, and as officers work to get him handcuffed, the dog bites him in the buttocks.

A Maricopa County Superior Court judge ruled Tuesday that undocumented students who have work visas under the federal Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program are allowed to pay the lower tuition rate. The deferred-action program, launched by President Barack Obama in 2012, is intended to protect undocumented immigrants brought to the United States as minors from deportation if they meet certain criteria. Those approved can remain in the country for two years and receive federal work permits. The ruling caps a 2-year-old lawsuit filed by then-state Attorney General Tom Horne. He sued the community-college district, arguing the students were not lawfully in the country and that the tuition policy violated a law enacted by voters in 2006 that banned public benefits to undocumented immigrants. A judge ruled the Maricopa Community Colleges can charge in-state tuition to undocumented students who have a federal waiver. Young immigrants who have a work visa under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program can lawfully pay \$84 per credit instead of \$325 per credit. Tom Horne, the attorney general in 2013, had sued the college district, saying the tuition policy violated state law.

The U.S. Congress curtailed the National Security Agency's authority to track suspected terrorists as lawmakers struggled to restore approval for mass collection of phone records and other surveillance methods. No solution was likely before Tuesday at the earliest. The high-stakes drama played out as Congress debated significant changes prompted by the disclosures of Edward Snowden, the former NSA contractor who revealed the phone records collection and other main surveillance programs. Press Secretary Josh Earnest said the Senate's failure to pass legislation in an unusual Sunday session introduced an unnecessary risk to the country. The House-passed legislation was stalled in the Senate, where Majority Leader Mitch McConnell and other leading Republicans sought changes. The legal lapse affected not only the NSA's ability to collect domestic phone records in bulk. It also meant at least a temporary end to the FBI's authority to gather business records in terrorism and espionage investigations, and to more easily eavesdrop on a suspect who is discarding cell phones to avoid surveillance. While intelligence officials publicly warned of danger, they said they were not deeply concerned with a lapse of a few days or weeks, given that the authorities remain available in pending investigations. What they most fear is a legislative impasse that could doom the programs permanently. U.S. President Barack Obama supports the USA Freedom Act, which ends NSA bulk collection of U.S. phone records but allows the agency to search records held by the phone companies.

Graham told supporters: "I want to be president to defeat the enemies that are trying to kill us." Graham is a prominent Senate voice in seeking a more muscular foreign policy. He wants 10,000 more U.S. troops in Iraq to stabilize a world that he's characterized as "falling apart."

The Supreme Court on Monday threw out the conviction of a Pennsylvania man prosecuted for making threats on Facebook, but dodged the free-speech issues that had made the case intriguing to First Amendment advocates. Chief Justice John Roberts, writing for the court, said it was not enough for prosecutors to show that the comments of Anthony Elonis would make a reasonable person feel threatened. But the high court sent the case back to the lower court without clarifying exactly what the standard of proof should be. The ruling was a narrow victory for civil liberties groups that had urged the court to make it tougher to prosecute people who make crude comments on social media that might be viewed as threatening. Yet the high court declined to lay out broad constitutional protections for such comments. "It is not necessary to consider any First Amendment issues," Roberts wrote. Elonis, of Freemansburg, Pennsylvania, was prosecuted under a law that makes it a crime to threaten another person after he posted Facebook rants in the form of rap lyrics about killing his estranged wife, harming law enforcement officials and shooting up a school. Seven justices on the high court said it was not necessary to reach First Amendment issues in reversing Elonis' conviction. Roberts said the reasonable-person standard is "inconsistent with the conventional requirement for criminal conduct -- awareness of

some wrongdoing." Justice Samuel Alito agreed with the outcome, but said he would have made clear that a person can violate the law if he disregards the risk that comments will be interpreted as a threat. Elonis said he didn't intend to threaten anyone. He claimed his posts under the pseudonym "Tone Dougie" were a form of therapy that allowed him to cope with the breakup of his marriage and being fired from his job at an amusement park.

President Barack Obama still has confidence in the U.S. Transportation Security Administration after a scathing report that faulted the agency for not detecting obvious threats to airline security, the White House said on Tuesday (June 2). On Monday, Melvin Carraway, the acting administrator of the TSA, which is responsible for screening airline passengers in the United States, was reassigned after media cited a government report that checkpoint screeners failed to detect mock explosives and weapons in 95 percent of tests carried out by undercover agents. Homeland Security Secretary Jeh Johnson, whose department oversees the TSA, was briefed last week on the trials, which were completed recently, ABC News said. In one test, the network said an undercover agent was stopped when he set off an alarm at a checkpoint but that TSA screeners then failed to find a fake explosive device taped to his back. Johnson issued a statement on Monday saying the results of the security checks were classified but that he had directed the TSA to revise screening procedures "to address specific vulnerabilities identified" in the undercover operation.

The law, which would raise the minimum wage to \$15 an hour by 2020, affects hundreds of thousands of workers and makes Los Angeles the largest city in the country to mandate higher pay for workers at the bottom of the income ladder. Backers predicted the action here could reverberate across the nation, ultimately aiding millions of Americans. But council members opted to defer, at least temporarily, some of the most divisive issues surrounding the wage ordinance. Several amendments could be made before the law takes effect. One lingering, highly contentious question is whether unionized companies should be allowed to negotiate for a sub-minimum wage with their employees. The Los Angeles County Federation of Labor sought to add that provision to the ordinance in the final days of the debate, saying that it would help avert legal challenges and allow union workers to trade pay increases for other benefits as they saw fit. Business groups angrily attacked it as a ploy to prod companies to unionize. Deluged with criticism, council members agreed to study the provision further. Lawmakers say that they also will decide on a provision sought by organized labor that would increase the number of paid sick days over what the state has required.

The lawmaker responsible for the move was Republican Sen. Richard Shelby of Alabama, chief author of a spending bill funding the Justice Department's budget. The spending measure won initial approval on Wednesday but has a long way to go before becoming law. The flow of children fleeing gangs and other dangers in Guatemala, Honduras and El Salvador and finding their way to the U.S. is down significantly from last year, when an influx created a humanitarian crisis, in states along the U.S.-Mexico border, Significant backlogs remain, Without lawyers, children are much more likely to be sent back to their home countries. Under federal law, immigrant children have two options to seek legal status, including requesting asylum for fear of returning home to face gang violence. Without legal help, the maze of documentation and legal requirements is far more difficult for a child to maneuver. Republicans opposed to people who are in the United States illegally have greater priorities in the \$51 billion measure, which also funds the Commerce Department and science-related agencies such as NASA. NASA and the FBI get a slight funding increase, but the measure shortchanges the Census Bureau and Obama's request for new polar weather satellites. The measure is one of 12 annual appropriations bills covering the day-to-day operations of government agencies.

Haley was flanked by Republican U.S. Sen. Lindsey Graham, now running for president, as well as South Carolina's junior Republican senator, Tim Scott, and Democratic Rep. Jim Clyburn, both of whom are black. Within moments, her call was echoed by the Republican Party chairman and the top GOP lawmaker, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell. The governor's declarations sparked action in other arenas as well on Monday: Mississippi House Speaker Philip Gunn called for the Confederate emblem to be removed from the state flag, becoming the first top-tier Republican to do so. In Tennessee, both Democrats and Republicans called for the removal of a bust of Confederate general and early Ku Klux Klan leader Nathan Bedford Forrest from an alcove outside the Senate's chambers. And Wal-Mart announced Monday that it is removing any items from its store shelves and website that feature the Confederate flag.

In a six-to-three ruling today, the justices upheld the nationwide tax subsidies that help make insurance affordable for millions of Americans. Nationally, 10.2 million people have signed up for health insurance under the Obama health overhaul. That includes the 8.7 million people who are receiving an average subsidy of \$272 a month to help pay their insurance premiums.

He was caught because he fired a bullet at one point that struck a camper in a possible attempt to make it stop so he could hijack it. The driver alerted cops who rushed to the scene. State Police caught a whiff of gunpowder in a nearby cabin, prompting a Customs and Border Patrol tactical team to fly into the area. "There was indication that someone had recently been there and had fled out the back door," State Police Superintendent -Joseph D'Amico said. The federal agents finally closed in on Matt, 49, in a heavily wooded area near Lake Titus in the tiny town of Malone. The officers heard coughing "so they knew they were dealing with humans, as opposed to wildlife," D'Amico added.

The Supreme Court upheld the use of a controversial drug in lethal injection executions Monday, as two dissenting justices said for the first time that they think it's "highly likely" that the death penalty itself is unconstitutional. The justices voted 5-4 in a case from Oklahoma that the sedative midazolam can be used in executions without violating the Eighth Amendment prohibition on cruel and unusual punishment. The drug was used in executions in Arizona, Ohio and Oklahoma in 2014 that took longer than usual and raised concerns that it did not perform its intended task of putting inmates into a coma-like sleep. Justice Samuel Alito said for a conservative majority that arguments the drug could not be used effectively as a sedative in executions is speculative.
