WJOD is associated with Weathertime, a private weather service that has a much better track record than the National Weather Service, is faster with their reports, and is especially valuable to the Dubuque area's extensive agricultural community.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS: Townsquare of Dubuque stations average well over 20 locally oriented public service announcements per day for various non-profit groups in the tri states.
