When alcohol is ingested by a juvenile it changes the physical appearance of the brain and 50.000 cells are destroyed with one shot of whiskey. The program concluded with both guests pleading with the listeners to take charge and teach their children to say no to alcohol and the other bad things that destroy our youth.
