WUBL provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month: June is Alzheimer (tm)s and Brain Awareness Month. There are roughly 140,000 Georgian's living with Alzheimer's and another 527,000 unpaid caregivers. By 2025, the number is expected to increase by almost 40%. The Alzheimer (tm)s Association Georgia Chapter serves all 159 counties with offices throughout the state with local support groups, education classes and other local resources. Linda Davidson, Executive Director for the GA Chapter Alzheimer (tm)s Assn and Glenn Patton, a board member, discuss the disease and efforts to fight it.
- Curing Kids Cancer: Just one year after the devastating loss of their nine-year-old son Killian to leukemia, Grainne Owen founded Curing Kids Cancer in 2005 in order to celebrate Killian (tm)s life and to fund research to find a cure for childhood cancer. Since then Curing Kids Cancer has raised millions for pediatric cancer research and treatment.
- Football: In 6 decades Bill Curry has experienced virtually every scenario football provide "Bill Curry talks about his book Ten Men You Meet in the Huddle, and shares the wit, wisdom, and tough love of teammates and coaches who turned him from a next-to-last NFL draft pick into a two-time Pro Bowler. Learning from such giants as Vince Lombardi, Don Shula, and Bobby Dodd he led a football life of nonstop exploration packed with adventure and surprise.
- Fostering: Recently, the GA Division of Family and Children (tm)s Services recognized foster parents, family members, volunteers, child welfare professionals, and other members of the community who help children and youth in foster care find permanent homes at their Foster Caregivers of the Year Awards Luncheon. Two of the honorees, Gracie Laminak and Cassie Kennard, discuss their experiences as foster parents.
- Georgia 811: Georgia 811 is dedicated to preventing damage to Georgia's underground utilities and promoting public safety by functioning as a communication system, connecting utility companies with professional excavators and homeowners who are planning mechanized digging activity such as excavation, tunneling, grading, or demolition. GA 811 spokesperson Cliff Meidl discusses the importance of contacting GA 811 before digging.

- Georgia Centers for Innovation: The State of Georgia, through the Georgia Department of Economic Development, provides free assistance for small businesses all over the state who have developed innovative ideas and processes and need help launching them. This program is the only one of its kind in the country and Steve Justice, Executive Director of the Georgia Centers of Innovation, discusses the program.
- Georgia Dept of Public Health: In 2018, there were approximately 120,000 babies born in Georgia. The GA Dept of Public Health (tm)s goal is to reach every pregnant woman in Georgia with their One Test, Two Lives campaign to test and screen for STDs to prevent congenital syphilis and HIV transmission from mother-to-child. Dr. Gregory Felzien, Medical Advisor, Division of Health Protection and Michelle Allen, Infectious Disease Section Director, discuss the importance of getting tested.
- Gov. Brian Kemp: Gov Brian Kemp talks about his first few months in office, the 2019 Legislative Session and other issues of importance to Georgians.
- Highway Emergency Response Operators: Highway Emergency Response Operators (HEROs) are dispatched to traffic-related incidents in metro Atlanta with the primary duty to clear roads so that normal traffic flow is restored. HEROs also assist stranded motorists with flat tires, dead batteries, fuel and other services. Tori Brown, Communications Officer for GA Dept of Transportation and HEROs Frank Salazar and Terrell Brown take listeners on a ride on Atlanta (tm)s highways.
- Highway Safety for the Summer: Allan Poole, Director of the Governor (tm)s Office of Highway Safety and Sgt. Stephani Stallings, Public Information Officer for Georgia State Patrol, discuss summer highway safety initiatives and provide advice to drivers.
- Officials Shortage in Georgia: The shortage of high school athletic officials is becoming a problem in Georgia. Allan Smith, Executive Director of the Georgia Athletic Officials Association addresses this issue and what is being done to reverse the trend.
- Parkinson's Disease: Bill Bucklew has Parkinson's disease, a progressive disease of the nervous system that affects movement...but that doesn't stop him from running marathons, climbing mountains and walking over 2500 miles across the US to raise funds and awareness for Parkinson's research. His 67-day walk raised over \$100k.
- Red Cross Sound the Alarm: Every day, seven people die in U.S. home fires. Ashley Henyan and Jim Tudor from the Red Cross discuss the Sound the Alarm campaign to make Georgia communities safe by installing free smoke detectors around the state and educating about fire safety in the home.
