ONCE ON SCENE, DEPUTIES FOUND TWO OTHER PEOPLE ALSO DEAD INSIDE AND CHILD ALIVE INSIDE. "WE WANT TO TALK TO THIS PERSON FIRST. WE DON'T WANT TO RELEASE TOO MUCH INFORMATION SO WE DON'T JEOPARDIZE THE CASE. THE SHERIFF ADDS POWELL HAS A CRIMINAL PAST AND ALL THREE PEOPLE FOUND DEAD INCLUDING THE PERSON WHO CALLED 911 ARE RELATED. WITH THE DETAILS OF HOW THREE PEOPLE ENDED UP DEAD STILL UNKNOWN, THOSE LIVING IN THIS RURAL AREA OF MORGANTON REMAIN ON EDGE. INVESTIGATORS SAY THEY KNOW HOW THE 3 PEOPLE DIED, BUT WON'T DISCLOSE THE INFO JUST YET. THE SHERIFF EXPECTS TO PROVIDE ANOTHER UPDATE LATER TODAY. IF YOU HAVE SEEN POWELL, YOU'RE URGED TO CONTACT THE BURKE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE.

DRUGGED IN UPTOWN? CMPD IS SETTING THE RECORD STRAIGHT TONIGHT AFTER RECENT REPORTS OF DRINK TAMPERING AT LOCAL BARS. FOX 46'S DAVID SENTENDREY IS LIVE FROM THE EPICENTRE TONIGHT. IT'S ONE OF THE BUSIEST AREAS OF UPTOWN. AT THE CORNER OF TRADE AND COLLEGE STREET SITS THE EPICENTRE. A GROUP OF BARS AND RESTAURANTS WHERE, RECENTLY, SEVERAL PEOPLE HAVE REPORTEDLY BEEN DRUGGED WITH SOMETHING POSSIBLY PUT INTO THEIR DRINKS. A 23-YEAR OLD GIRL, WHO WAS AT THE EPICENTRE, SAYS SHE WAS DRINKING WITH FRIENDS AT THE CLUB SUITE WHEN SHE BLACKED OUT AND BECAME ILL. FRIENDS TOOK HER TO THE HOSPITAL. CMPD SAYS, OFTEN TIMES, NOT SEEKING IMMEDIATE MEDICAL ATTENTION WILL JEOPARDIZE AN INVESTIGATION. "THEY'RE RELUCTANT TO GO TO THE HOSPITAL, GET BLOOD DRAWN, IMMEDIATELY GET SAMPLES OF THEIR BLOOD AND URINE." WHEN VICTIMS EVENTUALLY SHARE THEIR STORY, TIME HAS LAPSED WHERE POSSIBLE DRUGS ARE OUT OF THEIR SYSTEM. THAT'S WHY BEING DRUGGED IS A VERY DIFFICULT CASE TO CONFIRM. "I CAN SAY THAT IN THE TIME I'VE SPENT IN CENTRAL DIVISION UPTOWN. WE HAD ZERO OF THOSE CONFIRMED. IN THE MEANTIME, THEY'RE ASKING, IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, TO SAY SOMETHING. AND IF YOU ARE GOING TO DRINK TO BE ON GUARD.

TONIGHT POLICE SAY A NAIL SALON IN DAVIDSON IS CONNECTED TO A HUMAN TRAFFICKING OPERATION, LEADING TO TWO EMPLOYEES BEING ARRESTED. THIS BUSINESS IS LOCATED NEAR A SCHOOL, GROCERY STORE AND SEVERAL OTHER BUSINESSES. LEAVING THIS DAVIDSON NEIGHBORHOOD WONDERING, WHAT IN THE WORLD, WAS GOING ON BEHIND CLOSED DOORS. DAVIDSON POLICE ARRESTED TWO PEOPLE CONNECTED TO THIS NAIL SHOP FOR CRIMES RELATED TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING. CUSTOMERS TELL US THESE SUSPECTS WORK HERE, THIS WOMAN DIDN'T WANT TO SHARE HER IDENTITY BUT SAID THEY DID HER NAILS THIS WEEK. ACCORDING TO INVESTIGATORS THIS ALL STARTED ON TUESDAY WHEN AN EMPLOYEE OF THE LUXURY NAIL SALON WAS ASSAULTED, POLICE ARRESTED THE TWO SUSPECTS FOR THE 49-YEAR-OLD WOMAN'S INJURIES. THEN CONTACTED HOMELAND SECURITY FOR THEIR ASSISTANCE, WITH CONCERNS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING. POLICE SAID THEY CANNOT COMMENT ON HOW MANY VICTIMS THERE ARE. NEIGHBORING BUSINESSES ARE SHOCKED. OFFICIALS SAY THE INVESTIGATION IS HIGHLY SENSITIVE. AND AT THIS POINT IN TIME, AND THEY ARE NOT RELEASING ANY

INFORMATION BEYOND WHAT WE'VE SHARED WITH YOU TONIGHT. THE SALON WAS STILL OPEN FOR BUSINESS TODAY.

A POSSIBLE SECURITY BREACH AT ADIDAS MAY HAVE LEAKED DATA OF SOME OF ITS CUSTOMERS. ADIDAS ANNOUCNED ON THURSDAY THAT AN "UNAUTHORIZED PARTY" IS TO BLAME FOR THE BREACH. THOSE AFFECTED INCLUDE CUSTOMERS WHO PURCHASED ITEMS ON THE U-S VERSION OF THE COMPANIES SITE. THE COMPANY BELIEVE EMAIL AND PHYSICAL ADDRESSES WERE COMPROMISED. ADIDAS IS WORKING WITH VARIOUS SECURITY FIRMS AS WELL AS LAW ENFORCEMENT TO PINPOINT THE CAUSE OF THE BREACH.

NOW WE MEET ONE HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR, EDITH GOODMAN AND SEE HOW SOME IN MINNOSETA ARE VOWING TO NEVER FOREGET. "I WAS A CHILD, BUT I REMEMBER — I REMEMBER EVERYTHING." ON THIS DAY EVERY YEAR, THE MEMORIES OF ALL THE PEOPLE SHE LOST DURING THE HOLOCAUST COME

FLOODING BACK TO EDITH GOODMAN. "MY MOTHER'S SISTER WHO WE WERE REALLY CLOSE WITH, HER HUSBAND AND HER 3 YEAR-OLD LITTLE GIRL, MY CLOSE FRIENDS WHO WERE ALSO RELATIVES. IT WAS A NICE LITTLE TOWN WHERE I WAS FROM NICE PEOPLE. AND NOBODY CAME BACK." GOODMAN'S JOURNEY IS ONE OF SEVERAL SURVIVORS STORIES SHARED DURING THE HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE DAY PROGRAM AT MOUNT ZION TEMPLE. THE ANNUAL EVENT COMMEMORATES THE 6 MILLION JEWS AND OTHER VICTIMS WHO WERE MURDERED DURING WORLD WAR TWO. "WE HAVE AN OBLIGATION TO HISTORY TO TEACH AND WHO ARE OUR BEST TEACHERS – SURVIVORS AND THEIR STORIES." BEFORE THE PROGRAM, SCHOOL CHILDREN DRESSED IN BLACK READ THE NAMES OF SOME OF THE VICTIMS FROM THE NAZI CONCENTRATION CAMPS. WHILE SURVIVOR'S DECENDENTS LIT CANDLES TO HONOR THEIR ANCESTORS AND PLEDGED TO NEVER FORGET. "WE TAKE THIS OATH. WE VOW WE SHALL NEVER LET THE SACRED MEMORY OF THE PERISHED 6 MILLION BE SCORED OR ERASED." WAYZATA HIGH SCHOOL TEACHER CANDICE LEDMAN RECIEVED A SPECIAL AWARD FOR GOING ABOVE AND BEYOND TO HELP HER STUDENTS UNDERSTAND THE LESSONS FROM THAT WAR TORN TIME. "I THINK WE TALK A LOT ABOUT HOW THE HOLOCAUST ENDS AND WE TALK ABOUT THE CONCENTRATION CAMPS BUT WE LIKE TO FOCUS ON HOW IT STARTED, AND IT STARTED WITH LITTLE THINGS LIKE JOKES MAKING PEOPLE DO DIFFERENT THINGS HERE AND THERE. IT STARTED WITH LITTLE THINGS AND GREW AND GREW AND GREW." GOODMAN HOPES SHARING HER STORY MEANS HISTORY WON'T REPEAT ITSELF. "THEY SHOULDN'T BE FORGOTTEN. SO IT SHOULDN'T HAPPEN AGAIN. PEOPLE ARE VERY MEAN. IT'S IMPORTANT PEOPLE SHOULD KNOW THEY SHOULD BE GOOD."

SCHOOLS ACROSS THE COUNTRY AND RIGHT HERE IN CHARLOTTE ARE REACTING TO FRIDAY'S SHOOTING. MEANWHILE NORTH CAROLINA'S CRIMINAL JUSTICE EDUCATION AND TRAINING STANDARDS COMMISSION VOTED TO REQUIRE SPECIFIC TRAINING FOR ALL SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS. THE PANEL DECIDED ALL OFFICERS ASSIGNED TO A PUBLIC SCHOOL MUST COMPLETE TRAINING ABOUT THEIR ON-CAMPUS WORK. A COMMITTEE WITH THE COMMISSION WILL NOW WORK OUT THE DETAILS. OFFICIALS AT CHARLOTTE MECKLENBURG SCHOOLS SAY THEY'RE WORKING WITH LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT TO PROTECT STUDENTS SAFETY. THEY'RE CALLING ON LEADERS AT EVERY LEVEL, AND THE COMMUNITY, TO SUPPORT THE EMOTIONAL AND MENTAL HEALTH NEEDS OF STUDENTS. CMS SAYS IT IS WORKING ON SEVERAL MEASURES, INCLUDING LOCKDOWN DRILLS, AND CONTINUOUS EVALUATIONS OF SAFETY PROCEDURES AND PLANS. IN FEBRUARY, CMS SUPERINTENDENT DOCTOR CLAYTON WILCOX SAID HE NEVER THOUGHT THINGS WOULD GO THIS FAR. CMS ALSO PROPOSED HIRING ADDITIONAL CMPD OFFICERS, ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR PSYCHOLOGISTS, GUIDANCE COUNSELORS AND SOCIAL WORKERS IN SCHOOLS. AND ENHANCED FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS.

MORE MONEY FOR CMS, PRE-K PROGRAMS, AND IT PROJECTS ARE THE FOCUS IN MECKLENBURG COUNTY PROPOSED BUDGET FOR NEXT YEAR. COUNTY MANAGER DENA DIORIO PRESENTING HER RECOMMENDED 1.8 BILLION DOLLAR BUDGET TO COUNTY COMISSIONERS ON TUESDAY – ITS 25 MILLION DOLLARS MORE THAN LAST YEARS BUDGET.

THIS PUSH IN CYBER SECURITY COMING AFTER THE COUNTY COMPUTER SYSTEMS WERE HACKED LAST DECEMEBER - PROMPTING AN ONLINE SHUTDOWN. COUNTY MANAGER SAYING IN A LETTER TO RESIDENTS "WE MUST STOP HACKERS FROM HARMING US AGAIN". THE NEW BUDGET PROPOSAL INCLUDES FUNDING FOR 11 NEW IT POSITIONS PLUS 5.7 MILLION DOLLARS FOR SECURITY UPGRADES. AS FOR CMS, THE BOE REQUESTING OVER 460 MILLION DOLLARS FROM COUNTY COMISSIONERS. THAT'S ALMOST 40 MILLION DOLLARS MORE THAN THE DISTRICT RECEIVED LAST YEAR. THE COUNTY MANAGER IS MEETING THEM HALF WAY - RECOMMENDING 24 MILLION DOLLARS THAT WOULD FUND SALARY INCREASES FOR LOCAL EMPLOYEES, BUT NOT THE RAISE TEACHERS RALLIED FOR IN RALIEGH. CMS WOULD GET 9.2 MILLION DOLLARS FOR MORE SECURITY AND 8.5 MILLION DOLLARS FOR A BUS WASHING GARAGE. THE PROPOSED BUDGET INCLUDES THE FIRST COUNTY PROPERTY TAX INCREASE SINCE 2013. FOR HOMEOWNERS IN CHARLOTTE THAT INCREASE WOULD BE 3/4 PLUS THE PENNY TAX INCREASE ALREADY PROPOSED BY CITY MANAGER MARCUS JONES. COMISSIONER BILL JAMES TWEETED DURING THE MEETING AGAINST THE TAX INCREASE SAYING "THAT SHOULD BE DO-ABLE ON A BUDGET OF 1.7 BILLION DOLLARS".

A NEW BILL FILED IN NORTH CAROLINA WOULD ALLOW SOME TEACHERS TO BECOME TRAINED RESOURCE OFFICERS. THE INCENTIVE WOULD BE EXTRA PAY – A FIVE PERCENT RAISE. STATE SENATOR DAN BISHOP, WHO COSPONSORED THE BILL, SAYS IT WOULD ADD A LEVEL OF DEFENSE AGAINST ACTIVE SHOOTERS. I THINK THOSE THINGS ARE BETTER LEFT TO PROFESSIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS INSTEAD OF TEACHERS. THEY'D RECIVED AN ISSUE WEAPON JUST LIKE ANY OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER. THIS IS NOT SOMEBODY WHO HAD A CONCEALED CARRY COURSE AND HAS SOME BASIC

UNDERSTANDING OF A WEAPON. THAT'S NOT THE CASE AT ALL. THESE CANDIDATES WOULD BE – BY THEIR SELECTION AND ONLY IF A SCHOOL SYSTEM WANTS TO AVAIL ITSELF OF THIS OPPORTUNITY – BE FULL-FLEDGED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS." WE ASKED CMS BOARD OF EDUCATION CHAIR MARY MCCRAY IF SHE'S IN FAVOR OF THE NEW BILL. SHE SAID, ""NO I DO NOT SUPPORT THIS. A TEACHER'S ROLE HAS BEEN EXPANDED TO THE POINT THAT THEIR ACTUAL JOB NOW TAKES A BACKSEAT WHEN IT COMES TO EDUCATING OUR STUDENTS."

MY HUSBAND IS NOT A TERRORIST." AFTER A POWERFUL SHOWING AT WEDNESDAY NIGHT'S CITY COUNCIL MEETING, CMPD OFFICERS' WIVES SAY THEY'RE DISAPPOINTED IN HOW THEIR CONCERNS WERE RECEIVED. "SHE WAS ON HER IPAD AT ONE POINT AND I FEEL THAT WAS HER TYPING UP THESE TWEETS." TIA SMITH IS TALKING ABOUT COUNCIL MEMBER LAWANA MAYFIELD. THE FIRESTORM STARTED WHEN SHE TWEETED IN MARCH THAT COPS ARE TERRORISTS IN BLUE UIFORMS. DURING WEDNESDAY NIGHT'S CITY COUNCIL MEETING, SHE POSTED ON FACEBOOK AND TWITTER. ONE PERSON COMMENTED ON HER POST: "WOW. ALL THESE POSTS DURING THE PUBLIC FORUM PORTION OF LAST NIGHT'S CITY COUNCIL MEETING. I'M SURE THOSE BRINGING CONCERNS BEFORE THEIR ELECTED OFFICIALS APPRECIATED YOUR UNDIVIDED ATTENTION." "UNFORTUNATELY, WE'VE HEARD CRICKETS. THERE'S BEEN NO RESPONSE, WE'VE NOT HAD A REPLY FROM THE MAYOR AND THAT'S CONCERNING TO ME."
