Douglas Broadcasting's radio stations are involved in their communities. Management and staff regularly attempt to ascertain the most pressing issues and needs of the community, and then to present programming which addresses those issues and needs. The following list shows some of the significant issues responded to by station programming, along with examples of programming aired in response to those issues during the quarter noted. The listing is by no means exhaustive, and the order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority or significance.

RADIO STATION: KKTS-FM 1st QUARTER 2023

ISSUE: BUSINESS – Oil & Gas Production

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM OR SEGMENT: 2022 was a “return to normal” for Wyoming’s oil and gas industry. KKTS News reported on the latest summary report by the Wyoming State Geological Survey showing crude oil and natural gas production returned to their pre-pandemic trends. More than 100 oil or gas wells were completed in Wyoming in the first half of 2022. The report shows that Converse County lead oil production in the state again last year, turning out a full 33 percent of the state's oil production.
