### **1. Interview with Benjamín Canizales with Latino Community Development Agency**

**January 24, 2024**

Benjamin talked about the 2024 LCDA Vaccine Calendar. He shared information about the upcoming vaccination dates for the month of February. Additionally, he talked about the available vaccines such as flu, COVID-19, and those required by the school districts for individuals 18 and younger.

### **2. Interview with Carla Ponce with the Stephenson Cancer Center**

**February 20, 2024**

Carla talked about the colon cancer educational series scheduled for February 22<sup>nd</sup> from 4pm-8pm to inform the Hispanic community about the potential colon cancer symptoms and the importance of early detection. In addition, she mentioned other services open to the public at no cost such as screening for cholesterol, glucose, and blood pressure. ### **3. Interview with Benjamin Canizales with the Latino Community Development Agency**

The health screenings include glucose, cholesterol, blood pressure, among others.

During the event, information about Sooner Care was provided along with free health screenings for all who attended.
