WMOD FM (96.7 FM, *Real Country*) is a satellite radio station broadcasting a country music format. Licensed in Bolivar, Tennessee, USA, the station is currently owned by WMOD, Inc. and features programming from Westwood One. WMOD broadcasts a variety of local programs and broadcasts on matters of concern to our community and in some cases, with in-community projects.

WMOD broadcasts Hardeman County news, sports, weather local programming, more than 150 sporting events involving Hardeman County teams each year, doing Bolivar Central High School and Middleton High School athletics, as well as Hardeman County Middle Schools sports, Dixie Youth and Dizzy Dean baseball, and University of Tennessee Volunteer Football and NASCAR Monster Series races.

Our most significant programming, which has dealt with current community issues during the preceding three-month period, is set forth as follows.

Tennessee Radio Network News

WMOD aired Tennessee Radio Network News at 1200 and 1600 each broadcast weekday.

Late Show

WMOD produces and broadcasts every weekday, excluding federal holidays, the Late Show, hosted by Johnny Weems with local news, weather, sports, and events. In partnership with NASCAR and the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency aired the TWRA Daily WildCast Extra (airs approximately 0820 each morning) from 0800 – 0835.

WMOD News at Noon

WMOD aired local news at 1200 for 15-20 minutes, Monday – Friday, excluding federal holidays and some religious holidays. Features local crime report, fire and rescue report, weather, sports and community calendar.

County Journal Live with Swap Shop

WMOD produces and broadcasts every weekday excluding federal holidays, County Journal Live, hosted by Darrell Teubner where listeners call/send/email items to buy, sell or trade on Swap Shop, with community guests featured to promote treatment of community issues from 1215 – 1300.

Hardeman County Church Services on the Air

WMOD aired each Sunday from 0800 - 1330.

Local Sports Broadcasts and other local seasonal broadcasts

WMOD has local high school, middle school, UT Volunteer Football, NASCAR Monsters Series races and other sports broadcasts at various times during the quarter along with other seasonal local programming.

Public Service Announcements

WMOD provides production of national and local Public Service Announcements that address current issues impacting our viewers in varying lengths of :60, :30, and :15 second spots throughout our daily broadcast schedule at random times.
