SECTION A: NEWSCAST OVERVIEW AND QUARTERLY ISSUES ADDRESSED

WFSC-FM airs four local newscasts during its broadcast day, Monday through Friday at 7:03am, 8:03am, 12:02pm, and 5:02pm, following three to ten minutes of world and national news from ABC Radio News. WNCC reports local and area news events and issues on an ongoing basis.

News Treatments: The nominal length of each of our lead or feature news stories described below is between 30-seconds and one minute 30 seconds.

Some of the issues covered in these newscasts and programs during the **second** quarter are as follows:

1-Public Health

News Treatments: Apr 4, 6, 14, 25: May 18, 19, 23: Jun 8, 16, 21:

Influenza and air quality were issues that were evident in our area during the second quarter. Our newscasts informed the public on the spread of influenza and breathing issues due to poor air quality from Canadian Wildfires at a local level, and provided ways that the community could combat the problems.

2-Employment

News Treatments: Apr 13, 17 : May 2, 11, 12, :Jun 9, 19, 20

The second quarter saw some changes in the unemployment rate in Macon, Jackson, and Swain Counties as well as a major plant closing in the region. With unemployment levels maintaining a lower level and employment opportunities becoming competitive... we connected listeners to job opportunities and employment resources including local job fairs during some of our newscasts.

3- Education / Schools

News Treatments: Apr 19, 20, 21 : May 5, 26 : Jun 12, 13 :

Throughout the second quarter, discussions and decisions on plans for the need of a new High School in Franklin continued to dominate the local school systems in addition to additional facility improvements and the concern for funding. We kept the community informed about any and all potential changes that were made to the local schools as well as curriculum policy changes and other educational information.

4- Public Safety

News Treatments: Apr 17, 20, : May 1, 2, 19: Jun 5, 22

Public Safety continued to be a concern in the second quarter. In the event of serious weather related to the spring storm season, we kept citizens up to date on hazardous conditions in a timely manner as well as conditions related to the beginning of the summer tourist season as the area experienced a spike in motorist travel. Throughout the second quarter, We kept citizens informed of road closures due to mass construction across the region in addition to severe weather related closings.

5-Critical Information to Citizens

News Treatments: Apr 5, 27 :May 1, 2, 5 : Jun 14, 16

Policies and regulations once again changed that affected the listening area in the second quarter on many issues. This included county budget increases and cuts, town and county new or changing regulations, and issues effecting the regional library system. Issues mentioned during our news casts have an impact to Macon County and its residents, so it is paramount to connect our listeners with what they need to know.

6-Food Insecurity

News Treatments: Apr 13, 14, 24: May 8, 26, : Jun 16

With the region struggling with a slow economy, high inflation costs, and children not able to receive lunch, food insecurity and homelessness continued to be an issue in the second quarter. We reminded residents about the need in the community to help spur donations to area food banks. We also provided information about changes in costs to the area school system's meal plans.

7-Crime / Police

News Treatments: Apr 11, 12, 21, : May 4, 5, 19 : Jun 14, 19

Crimes continued to plague the region through the second quarter, along with sentencing for earlier crimes. We kept the community informed of the crimes and sentencing throughout the entire second quarter.
