**** At the Smithfield Library:** While the library is closed, they are now offering curbside hold pick-up services for their patrons - Monday through Friday from 12:00 pm to 2:00 pm. Holds must be picked up within 48 hours after you are informed they are ready!! For details and/or any questions check their facebook page, twitter, or call 435-563-3555

****Students in the Logan City School District** are able to **pick up lunch** at each elementary school. Students are welcome to pick up a lunch at the school that is geographically closest to their home. Mount Logan Middle and Logan High students are also welcome to pick up a lunch at the closest geographic school. Students must be present to obtain a lunch. This is a drive-through grab-and-go service. Parents and students should not plan to remain at the school to eat. Pick up times are 10:00 am - 11:00 am each day. ****The Logan Landfill** will remain open to the public during the COVID-19 outbreak but they will maintain recommended social distancing to protect the health and safety of everyone. Until further notice, all transactions at the Logan Landfill and Transfer Station Scalehouse will be conducted over the telephone and we will not be accepting cash payments. When dropping material at the Landfill or Transfer Station, residents will need to call 435-716-9777 and press “0” as they pull up to the scales to speak with an attendant and make a payment.

****Before visiting one of Intermountain Health Cares' testing locations,** please call the COVID-19 Hotline at 844-442-5224. Calling ahead allows a medical professional to assess your symptoms over the phone and determine if you should be tested for COVID-19. To test whether or not you have COVID-19, a sample will be taken by swabbing deep inside your nose or throat, which can be uncomfortable or even painful. These samples are tested at an offsite location, and results may take several days to process before you can learn of your results. Because there is currently no treatment for COVID-19 (other than helping alleviate symptoms), a positive test – especially for normally healthy individuals – will likely result in a requirement to stay home and self-isolate for a period of two weeks. **Local testing sites include:** North Cache Valley InstaCare, 4088 N HWY 91, Hyde Park / hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.....also the Bear River Clinic, 935 N 1000 W, Tremonton - Mon-Fri: 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sat: 9 a.m to noon.

****Curbside green waste collection** (green can) has started. Please do not overfill your cans or place materials on the ground outside of your can. To sign up to have a green can at your home for an extra \$5 a month, please call the office at 435-716-9755. They would like to remind residents that green waste cans are designed for green waste materials only, including: grass, leaves, small branches, and general yard waste less than 4' in length. No garbage, rocks, dirt or pet waste is allowed. Green waste can be taken to the Logan City Green Waste Facility (1450 N 1000 W) year round for no charge. ****What to do with shredded paper?** A few months ago Logan City Environmental sent a newsletter about all of the waste services they offer for all residents of Cache County and an updated graphic about what can and can't be recycled in your blue recycling container. They had several calls asking about what should be done with shredded paper. In short: although paper is recyclable, **shredded paper is best bagged and disposed of in the garbage can.** Unfortunately, shredded paper is a challenge at the recycling facility as it tends to fall off the sorting line as materials are sorted and creates a mess in the recycling plant, and often ends up mixed in with all of the other materials.
